

With colder nights approaching don't forget that we stock local logs and kindling as well as firelighters and lots of nibbles for a snuggly night in.

We are blessed in Whimple with orchards and good local cider producers. We stock two ciders produced in the village by Courtneys (Silly Cow and Prize Bull) and Dave Rowe (Crafty Cider). We also have a good range of cider from Honiton (Norcotts Cider) and Crediton (Sandford Orchards). Hopefully Norcotts will be offering a tasting session of their products in store on Saturday November 12th. Watch out for posters confirming this.

We are very keen to support local business and to sell local produce so if you are aware of something we could stock, please let us know.

Post Office

With the temporary closure of Broadclyst and with more business coming in from Cranbrook, the Post Office has seen some surges in demand. We apologise if you have experienced delays and long waits.

We only have one Post Office terminal and it doesn't run particularly fast so it is difficult to speed things up, although we do try. If you are in the queue and just need stamps, please ask any other members of staff and they should be able to assist you. It is likely to start to get busier with the build up to Christmas so if you are in a hurry,

try to avoid busy times such as the 4.00 - 5.00pm postal surge.







Another year and another Flower and Craft Show, it seems to come round quicker every year! It was good to see an increase in the number of exhibitors this year. For the record, we had 52 exhibitors in the Adult Classes and 14 exhibitors in the Children's Classes which was a slight increase on 2015. This resulted in a total number of 508 exhibits which was an increase of 42 on 2015, so that was really good to see. Once again, the main hall was a mass of colour with all the exhibits in the vegetable, flower and plant classes that were on display and these were complemented by the skilful exhibits on display in the billiard room. The Judges once again were very impressed with the high standard of exhibits in all the classes.

It was good to see an increase in the number of entries in the Children's Classes which were of their usual high and very imaginative standard which gave the judges a hard task selecting the winning exhibits. In the youngest class, Beatrix Giffard won The Owen Cup for the under fives and Holly Walsh won the Basildon Award for the five to eight years age group. In the nine to eleven age group it was Jonny Baker who won The Fletcher Cup. In the final Class for the twelve to fifteen years, The Children's Challenge Cup was won by Robbie Palmer. There was the usual excellent entry for the photography section with numerous outstanding photographs. As in previous years, the Judges had a difficult task in determining the winners in the ten classes. The standard seems to get higher every year in this section and once again there were some amazing entries. The overall winner in this section winning the Paul Henry G.C. Memorial Cup was Brenda Flood. The Arts and Crafts Classes had another wonderful display of skills. In this section, we once again had joint winners of the Len Rose Memorial Cup who were Jenny Sanders and Elisabeth Roberts. Elisabeth Roberts was also the winner of the Whimple Craft Cup for the best exhibit in this section.

The flower arranging had another array of excellent and colourful of exhibits and the judge was very meticulous over her deliberations. In this section the Frances Pratt Memorial Cup was once again won by Emma Palmer and the Roy Horsburgh Trophy was won by Rosemary Davies. The Marie Louise Grout Cup for the best exhibit in the Flower arrangement, which is voted for by everyone who came to see the Show, was awarded to Peter Cosslett for his exhibit of "Men at Work". The Sandfords Cup which is awarded to the gentleman who gains the most points in the combined Men Only Classes of a floral arrangement and a cake was also won by Peter Cosslett.

And so to the Homecraft Section which had an amazing display of culinary delights which gave the judge a difficult task in selecting the best exhibits. Once again there were cakes and jams galore with the judge wondering just how she was going to get through all the exhibits! This year, the winner of the Sir Henry Imbert-Terry Cup with the most points in this section was Jane Tancock. So what next for our culinary expert – the Great British Bake Off in 2017?!!

So we come to all the exhibits in the main hall. The Pot Plant Section had a very large number of exhibits which made it very difficult to stage all them on the tables. Fortunately, we somehow managed to get them all on the show tables!

In this class, the winner of the Briar Shield this year was Sue Parkinson. And finally, but by no means the least, there was a superb number of exhibits in the flower and vegetable classes. It was so good to see so many exhibits in all these classes which gave the judge plenty of work to do!. There were many class winners in this section but The Slewton Cup for the most points in the vegetable section was won by Colin Northcott. The runner up in this section winning the Cranny Brook Cup was Mike Hawkins. In the Flower Classes, the winner of the Win and Bob Shepherd Cup for the most points in this section was Mike Hawkins and the runner up winning the President's Cup was Michael Mallett. However, when the results of both sections were combined and the points in both sections were added together, we had a new winner of The Whimple Folk Cup. The winner this year was Mike Hawkins who only entered the Show for the first time in 2015, so many congratulations to him on winning this magnificent trophy.

And finally, there was the Whimple Challenge Cup which was the seventh year of this venture. We retained the theme of a scarecrow hoping for a good number of exhibits but there were only three this year. The judge decided that best exhibit in this class, winning the Whimple Challenge Cup was Zena Calverley with Angeline Rowe taking the runners up cup.

This year we were delighted to have Sherril Olive to give out all the prizes and a full list of all the trophy winners appears in this edition of the News.

We would like to thank and congratulate all of you who made the effort to enter the Show for without you there would be no Show! We are also extremely grateful to all our judges who give up their time to do this difficult task with such quality exhibits.

The Committee would like to express their thanks to everyone who helped us set up the Hall for the Show and clear up afterwards, it is very much appreciated. It is quite amazing that at 5.30 we were still in the throws of prize giving but by 6.30pm the hall had been completely cleared and you would not have known the Show had taken place! For those of you who were entering for the first time we hope you enjoyed the experience and we look forward to seeing you at next year's show. We hope to publish the details for the photography classes in the next issue of the News. If there are any ideas that any of you have for the various classes we will be more than willing to consider them for the 2017 Show. For those who like to look forward, the 2017 Show will be on Saturday 12th August.

By the time this edition of the News gets out we will have had our next event which was a talk on Friday 30th September. It was being given by the Devon Gardens Trust and was an illustrated talk on the work they do on conservation, research and education about Devon's rich heritage of designed landscapes. A full report on this talk will be in the next issue. Following the success of his talk last year on the making of War Horse, we have invited Paul Rendall back to give us another talk on Friday 11th November. In a complete contrast to the Devon Gardens Trust, Paul's talk this time will be entitled "Hairy Hands, Devils and Black Dogs", which seems the perfect subject for dark November evening! Judging from the turn out from his talk last year, it is advised to get there early to make sure you get a seat!

Hopefully we will see a good number of you at one or even both of these talks.



SO WHO CAN BECOME A BELLRINGER?

Did you see or hear on the BBC breakfast programmes in early September, the coverage of a survey commissioned by BBC Local Radio about recruitment of bell ringers and the scarcity of people learning the art?

In London they instanced a magazine art editor and a professor of astrophysics - not exactly your average Joe! By contrast here they spoke to the lady at Chagford who wisely said the direct invitation was a better way to recruit than all the fliers and posters put together.

Well maybe she's right. But everybody emphasised that church membership was not a prerequisite. So who *can* become a bell ringer? Well, anybody really. Looking around our team, several routes into the art are worth mentioning, and to some extent our ages each reflect that...

- One proudly tells how as a lad living the other side of the country, when his voice broke he was shunted from the choir to the belfry and thus learned to ring.
- Another had always wanted to ring but thought that you had to be a church member to do so until a conversation with a neighbour enlightened her.
- A sometime Girl Guide took up bell ringing to achieve a badge that was out of the ordinary and never looked back.
- Others learned when at school, were active bell ringers into late twenties, then work and family filled their time until retirement and taking it up again.
- Several learned so that the village could 'ring in' the millennium in 2000.

Whilst it is true that about half our current ringers are regularly in the congregation across a month and more attend occasionally, it is neither a requirement nor an expectation to do so. Indeed we see our bell ringing as a contribution to village life as much as calling the faithful to worship, in addition to being an enjoyable social activity. The one requirement is availability.

We ring for service on Sundays chiefly, but other occasions through the year, and for this we keep an updated list showing availability. The two most recent novices made the approach themselves in conversation with established ringers here and are now in the midst of the learning programme.

Suggestions to help pets during firework season

The Autumn and winter months bring a time of explosive celebrations that can cause terror for dogs, cats and rabbits and now is the time that pet owners could be thinking about taking steps to prepare and protect their pet from the fear of fireworks.

There are several things that can be done to make it as stress free as possible.

- Most dogs and cats have a favourite place to go and hide, if not you need to create a hideaway where they can feel safe. A room that is quiet and has minimal windows is the most suitable.
- Installing an Adaptil[™] or Feliway [™] diffuser close to the refuge area may encourage them to settle, feel relaxed and confident. This should be done 2 4 weeks prior to the expected stress.
- Provide blankets for him to hide under and burrow. A woolly jumper that has your scent on can be comforting.
- Close the curtains to block out flashes of light and as much of the sound as possible.
- Take your dog out for a walk an hour before the expected stress to go to the toilet and feed him an early evening meal to help him feel relaxed. A meal high in carbohydrates such as pasta or rice is ideal.
- Play some background music that your dog normally hears (and doesn't object to!), or leave the television on.
- Offer chews and treats to your dog in his hiding place. He will then see this hiding place as a good place to go, and he can chew on these to relieve his tension.
- Ignore the sounds of the fireworks yourself and do not soothe or comfort your dog. It may be difficult to do this but it is the worst thing to do. It gives your dog the impression that there is something to be frightened of and rewards him for being scared.
- Cats need to be confined to the house and provided with a litter tray.
- If your pet gets particularly distressed we recommend you talk to your vet about short acting medication. Old-fashioned sedatives have been replaced with modern anti anxiety drugs which help treat the problem, rather than just mask it.
- Small mammals like rabbits and guinea pigs that live outside should not be forgotten. If possible move them into a shed or outhouse. Covering the front of the hutch with a blanket can help cut out some of the noise and flashes of light.

If you require any more information about helping your pet, then just call and speak to either a Vet or Veterinary Nurse who will be happy to help.

So far this year we have had several new members join, but there is always room for more. Please contact our Secretary Ann Bowden on 823450 if you are interested in joining Whimple WI.


