### From My Window in the Square Edith Marie-Louise Grout

Fairest of months! Ripe Summer's Queen
The hey-day of the year
With robes that gleam with sunny sheen
Sweet August does appear

As I sit by my window writing my story, it suddenly dawns on me that today is the 21st June, the Summer Solstice and the longest day of the year. The light is so clear, the sky so blue, the birds so joyful and everything around me explodes with happiness. Our Square is as lovely as ever and on Saturday we had the great surprise and pleasure of having a small group of Morris dancers called Newton Bushells with a group of bellringers from Newton Abbot. It reminded me of the happy days when the wonderful Glory of the West Morris Dancers from Exeter

were able to use the whole Square. Alas this tradition has gone with the arrival of so many cars parked in the Square, so much traffic about and strangely enough this was before we had a good sized car park - which is always under used. I went to talk to this charming group and showed them my book 'From my Window in the Square' and the lovely photos I took more than twenty years ago of the Glory of the West Morris dancers and it brought smiles to all the faces.

Alas there is another side of the Square that I find rather sad. Last Friday after the refuse collectors lorry left, there was such a mess that two of us, who care, cleaned it all up. Sunday, I came back from my walk with an armful of empty bottles, one, strangely enough, was marked Jaegermeister AG Germany, I don't know what sort of brew it was but what I know for sure is that in Germany they would not throw litter about in their towns and villages.

August is the fairest month of the year because it is the time of our wonderful flower show, a tradition which is not allowed to die despite the fact that so many of the new houses built in the village have such little gardens. The Whimple Village Produce Association work relentlessly to make sure it is thriving and gives so much pleasure to so many. Months of preparations to make schedules appealing, finding judges, getting the hall ready on the day, there is a hive of activity by very dedicated and enthusiastic people.

It is certainly an event I look forward to and never miss; first as a visitor, then an exhibitor and now as a judge. That is what is so lovely about village life.

It seems to me quite amazing that in this the 21st Century so many of the months in our calendar are named after characters from Greek and Roman history. Janus who opens the year was a god who had a head looking into the future and at the back a head looking into the past - January. July named after Julius Caesar the conquering Roman emperor, and August after Octavius Gaius member of a triumvirate and later made emperor Augustus of the mighty Roman Empire and in Latin means the venerable. I find it rather comforting that in our modern society when everyone cries out for change with a capital C, so many things are stable, like the four seasons which have been depicted by so many poets and composers like Vivaldi which strangely enough has only become part of the musical repertoire in the sixties but now is more played than ever.

The first of August is the Feast of Lammas when the first bread of the first corn of the year was put on the High Altar in our own St Mary's Church in Whimple in the days when we moved to the Old Manse under the guidance of our unforgettable Rector The Revd. Harold Tucker. There was also a sheaf of corn by the altar and I vividly remember that on one occasion the Rector broke that bread to give it to us at the communion and Jack and I were moved by that simple but profound act of worship, it was almost like a living picture from the Holy Bible. That is something I will never forget.

First of August is also the National Swiss Day. The Swiss Confederation was founded in 1291. On that day in 1991 when we celebrated 700 years of the Confederation Helevetica, the doorbell rang and a couple with two young girls stood there when I opened the door and said "we were told to come and visit the Lady of the Manse". So naturally I asked them in and offered them hospitality and when I asked them where they came from and they said Switzerland I spontaneously said "Lets celebrate" to which they replied "Celebrate what?". I replied "the 700th anniversary of Switzerland". Of course they did not know that I was Swiss. It was incredible but more was to come. When I asked them where in Switzerland they came from they said Aargau, a town I had probably never heard of as I came from the French part of Lake Geneva. What is even more amazing is that in Switzerland we do not originate from our place of birth but the place of our family ancestors and our family goes back as far as 1558 in the town of Aargau, capital of the canton of Argovie. As the grand finale I discovered that he was the vicar of the main town church where one of my ancestors was vicar and who had a beautiful glass window named after him. Since then we kept in contact and as I always say "There are no strangers in the world, only friends you have not met".

Friendship is the only cement that will ever hold the world together.

### WHIMPLE PARISH COUNCIL EMERGENCY PLAN TEAM

When we hear warnings of severe weather we naturally think about flooding, storms and snow but severe heat can be just as great a concern. Heat related deaths and illnesses are preventable yet annually many people succumb to extreme heat due to a variety of factors.

Persistent hot weather during the day and night makes it difficult for everyone to cool down. However, those at particular risk are the mentally ill, the elderly and the very young, those with mobility problems or chronic illness especially heart or breathing problems, people who already have a temperature from an infection and those who use alcohol or illicit drugs.

The main risks posed from a heat wave are dehydration which can lead to overheating and heat exhaustion. Overheating can make symptoms worse in people with heart or breathing problems. The symptoms of heat exhaustion include, headache, dizziness, feeling sick or vomiting, intense thirst, hot red dry skin, sleepiness, aggression and confusion. Heat exhaustion can occur without warning and can easily lead to heatstoke which may be fatal if not treated guickly.

### What should you do?

- Firstly, look out for your relatives, friends and neighbours.
- Drink plenty (keep bottles of tap water in the fridge)
- Stay out of the sun during the hottest part, keep to the shade, wear a hat and loose thin cotton clothes.
- Avoid strenuous exercise and activities
- Open your windows and close the curtains to regulate the temperature in your house.
- Eat more cold foods especially those containing water such as salads.



### **CLIFF BENTON**

Cliff was born in 1923. He joined the ATC at school, hoping that would lead to entry into the RAF, but his short sight prevented that. Instead through the war he worked for SHAEF (Supreme Headquarters Allied Expeditionary Force).

After the war he qualified as a teacher, and taught in several schools, then in Pentonville Prison, where he remembers being asked his name by one inmate, and on saying "I'm Benton" was told, "Oh, in here we are all bent 'uns." His next appointment took him to Dundee where he recognised a young lady, Sonia, from the same course he had been on in London, and they married. He became a much appreciated step-father to her two sons. They applied for a post with the ODA and went to Kenya. They were a bit apprehensive about settling into a strange environment. Cliff could have only stayed six weeks on a tourist's visa, so he applied for and gained a post as lecturer, and in addition he taught children the children of the contractors in Kenya, people of a wide variety of backgrounds. The fact is Cliff loved people, and loved sharing with people knowledge and skills which made him the very best kind of teacher. That contract lasted 2½ years, but then Cliffs heart trouble necessitated their return home to Willand. As often as his heart troubled him, Cliff bounced back; he had a great zest for life. The couple continued to be world travellers, though in 1983 he had to undergo a triple-bypass op.

In 1987 they moved to Whimple, first to Strete Ralegh, and pursued a very active life there. Cliff joined the Gold Club in Tiverton, and did not improve his handicap at all, a sign that to him, sport was for socialising rather than being competitive. That seems to express his personality exactly. He just genuinely liked people. He undertook meals on wheels, books on wheels, private tutoring, he sold books in the NT Killerton book stall and he developed his skill in wood carving, notably carving decoy ducks. Cliff joined the Wood Carvers and Wildlife Association, which had 200 members, and he was elected Chairman. In Whimple he became a member of the school governing body, and in fact became Chairman of that body. When the village had its presentation "The Parish Chest", Cliff filled the role of the Bishop. He explained that the reason was his was the only head big enough to fill the mitre. In Church, they both became members of the PCC, lesson readers, and designers of the duty rota. More recently Cliff was one of the founder members of the coffee club for retired gentlemen in the village.

He became increasingly frail physically, though not at all mentally, and had to move into the Court at Rockbeare, where he was very well looked after. Cliff had willed his body for medical research, so there was no funeral, but on 21st May a celebration of his life was held in Whimple Church, attended by 76 people, including his son Jonathan from London, with Cliff's grand-daughter Alexandra. Tributes were read out from his step-sons Clive and Rob in America, and Sonia expressed her thankfulness for a perfect partnership.

### Wasters of Whimple

### Solar panels

A member of our group has been researching the new 'Feed in Tariffs' introduced this year. They are currently obtaining three different quotes and liaising with utility contacts in the village.

We hope to hold a village meeting to discuss all possibilities (probably in October), so please watch the Post Office for dates of this meeting if you are interested. Solar panels installed before 1st April 2012 would offer a better deal for investors and therefore a better deal for us consumers. At the moment we would highlight the following information:



- Since April this year it could be possible to get free electricity from solar panels installed on your roof
- You may not need to pay the upfront costs for the solar panels
- You could be paid for any electricity that you don't use that goes onto the national grid

In April 2010 the government introduced 'feed-in-tariffs' for various small-scale renewable energy generation equipment. These tariffs provide a guaranteed fixed price for each unit of electricity that is generated, whether it is used on site (e.g. at a home, school, or office etc.) or not (i.e. the unused power is exported onto the national power grid). Any power that is exported receives a further payment.

There are now investors with cash available to invest in paying the upfront costs for the equipment to be installed (e.g. solar panels onto a roof). These investors then receive the generation tariff in return for their investment. Meanwhile the home/school/office owner benefits from savings on their electricity bills through making use of the free solar electricity, and they can also earn further benefit by selling any unused power. The panels are designed to last 25 years, and may last up to 40. Generally there is no need for planning permission, unless you are in a conservation area or live in a listed building.

So now you don't need to spend about £10,000 for the solar panels, you save on your bills and you also save around 1,200kg of CO2 per year! Whimple is more suited to solar than other forms of renewable energy – it is not windy enough down in our valley, and we don't have forests or lakes! And being so far south in the UK we do get higher sunshine strengths.

Let's make Whimple the first solar village in Devon and aim to install solar panels on 100 homes!

## Speak Now

EDDC's Speak Now is a panel of people who want to be actively involved in local issues. There are currently over 200 members on the panel, but we need more. The Council wants to find out what people think about the services it provides.

It's not enough to think we know what people want, we believe it's important to ask them exactly what they do want. By joining the panel, residents can take part in focus groups, attend meetings of special interest or maybe fill in a questionnaire. It's up to them to choose their own level of involvement. And by having their say, they can influence what the Council does.

Members of the panel were recently invited to attend internet workshops, which were aimed at improving our website. They were asked to go onto EDDC's site and to see how easy it was to complete a number of tasks, such as reporting a missed bin collection and contacting their local Councillor.

The feedback from the participants has been very useful – a more accessible site is currently under construction and the same panel members will be asked back to test it again before it goes live. Central government asked local communities what they would like to change to help them become more sustainable and, in July last year, 54 Panel members came along to an event in Honiton where they were asked to vote on which national laws and guidance they would like to change. Providing affordable housing for local people came top of their list. The Local Government Association was told of their decision and, subsequently, changes to the way affordable housing is provided was a proposal submitted to the Secretary of State.

Whilst we would welcome members of all age groups onto the Panel, we are especially keen to see more young adults taking part. Workshops and discussions are often arranged to take place out of work hours to give them the opportunity to come along whilst, for those who do not like to go out in the evening, events are also held during the day.

Many in the village who are involved in children's and young people's groups will be aware of the consultation that has been going on over the last few months in connection with the proposed employment by *Churches 4 All* of a children's and families worker.
