I would fill the world with sunshine

The lilt of lovely melodies
With voices clear and strong
And in the morn and afternoon
I would keep all hearts in tune

The highlight of village life is the Summer Flower Show and it was a world filled with beauty. We seem to go from strength to strength and our show secretary had the brilliant idea of having the school involved. I must say I was very impressed by the posters the children created, they were imaginative and inviting and as for the scarecrows, they were just magnificent. I wish we could have displayed them a little longer.

As I stroll through my garden on an October afternoon, I found a maple leaf lying on the lawn. It was a beautiful thing of delicate filigree, for nothing remained except a fine network of veins. As I held it carefully in my hand I thought of the changing seasons. When it fell off the tree it was of a glowing shimmering red and gold with green veins. It made me reflect on us humans, how the colour of our cheeks and hair may fade, our sight may becomes impaired but the real beauty in each of us is in our hearts and is everlasting. What is left in our soul, love, kindness, patience; memories may be slightly eroded but are still there. Moments of quiet reflection can bring untold peace and happiness. Sitting in my garden which is a haven of green and gold is delightful. Birds flutter around, sometimes a squirrel makes a brief appearance and come Spring nature will come to life in every twig and flower.

The great painter Van Gogh often suffered from feelings of despair, there were many times he said he felt like a bird trapped in a cage. He remarked "and do you know what takes away the cage? Brotherhood, friendship, love, they open the cage like a magic key, he who creates sympathy creates life". I am sure there are few music lovers in England or the world who have been more gifted than Kathleen Ferrier. She was not only pretty but an accomplished pianist and of, course, had a wonderful voice of contralto, she also had an infectious sense of humour and fun. Even when she suffered from cancer her voice never faltered.

A friend said there was too much jollity in her life to think of her premature death, to remember her with sadness. She was true to herself to the end. What a wonderful legacy.

For centuries in England and in Europe, the Autumn season for farmers and gardeners has been to gather the harvest and bring it in safely to barns and cellars. Alas, this year has been most unpredictable with our weather system. It must be so frustrating to wait and not to know when it will be ready for harvesting. It is always such a wonderful occasion to celebrate Harvest Festivals with flowers and fruit to decorate our churches and sing those wonderful harvest hymns, although some of them have been modified and modernised. In the Square the colouring of our great Linden tree changes daily, golden leaves float down the babbling brook and the branches get bare little by little. The sycamore and small maple trees are decked in bright coloured leaves and on the grass there is a wonderful pattern of colours like a Persian rug with intricate designs which sparkle in the misty Autumn sunshine. I will soon don my quilted body warmer when the north winds start to blow, the first frosts always take us by surprise, from glowing dahlias we get overnight a change to blackened plants which graced our gardens all summer. Autumn is the time for bonfires in the garden, there is so much to burn. I find it a most comforting occupation to stand round the fire feeding it, it makes my cheeks glow with warmth and when you come into the house there is that lovely smoky smell. Some time ago I found a very lovely poem by Lawrence Binyon called "The Burning of the Leaves".

Now is the time for the burning of the leaves
They go to the fire; the nostrils prick with smoke
Wandering slowly into the weeping mist
Brittle and blotched, ragged and rotten sheaves!
A flame seizes the smouldering ruin, and bites
On stubborn stalks that crackle as they resist

The last hollyhock's fallen tower is dust:
All the spices of June are a bitter reek
All the extravagant riches spent and mean.
All burns! The reddest rose is a ghost.
Spark whirl up, to expire in the mist: the wild
Fingers of fire are making corruption clean

They will come again the leaf and the flower; to arise From squalor of rottenness into the old splendour And magical scents to a wondering memory bring The same glory, to shine upon different eyes Earth cares for her own ruins, naught for ours Nothing is certain, only the certain Spring



Another year and yet another Flower Show – and what a show it was! Although we did not have a record number of exhibits, we certainly had a record number of exhibitors. This year we had 135 exhibitors which is over thirty more than the previous best. For the record there were 443 exhibits in the adult classes and 168 exhibits in the children's classes giving a total of 611 exhibits. So congratulations to all of you who entered this year. A full list of all the cup winners is included with this report, so well done to all who did win and hopefully next year it will be the turn for some of you who didn't!

Without doubt the star features of this year's Show were the incredible exhibits from the children at the Primary School. In addition to the competition to design a poster to advertise the Show, they were put into groups to design their own scarecrow, and what amazing designs they came up with. Despite the appalling weather on the day we were able to display them outside and fortunately they remained in good condition all day. They certainly gave the Show a new image! It was good to see all the other children's classes were up to their usual high standards and the winners in these classes were Jessica Courtney who won the Cygnets Cup; Annabel Courtney who won the Basildon Award; Emily Ackland who won The Fletcher Cup and Conor Keighery who won The Children's Challenge Cup. The photography section was again keenly contested with some outstanding pictures. It was a challenging task for the judges as there was another excellent number of photographs to be judged. There was a new winner in this section with Jon Drover winning the Paul Henry G.C. Memorial Cup. In the Arts and Crafts Classes there was another outstanding display of skills. There was a triple tie for the Len Rose Memorial Cup with Sylvia Broom, Rachel Owen and Nan Sturdy sharing the Cup. Jane Taylor won the Whimple Craft Cup.

The regular high standard once again maintained in the flower arranging with another display of floral artistry. Although the number of entries was disappointing, the standard was still very high. The trophies in this section were won by Barbara Lambert who won the Sandfords Cup, and Margaret Bucknall who won the Marie Louise Grout Cup for the best exhibit in the Show, which was voted for by everyone who came along to see the show, as well as the Roy Horsburgh Trophy. As usual the Homecraft section was full of mouth-watering exhibits and the snooker table was positively overloaded with excellent exhibits. Congratulations to Vicky Clough who took the honours in this section winning the Sir Henry Imbert-Terry Cup.

The Pot Plant Section had an excellent number of exhibits with all the classes well supported. Here again there was a new winner of the Briar Trophy and this year it went to Sue Parkinson. And finally, but by no means least, there was an exceptionally good entry in the flower and vegetable classes. The appalling weather in the preceding months left us wondering if there would be much for the show. However, we were delighted to see just about every class having quality exhibits.

This year we divided the cups between the Vegetable Classes and the Flower Classes Section but then combined them to get an overall winner. In the Vegetable Classes, the joint winners of the The Slewton Cup were Colin Northcott and Andy Bratt and the runner up in this section winning the Cranny Brook Cup was Sue Parkinson. In the Flower Classes, the winner of the Win and Bob Shepherd Cup was Gail Ward and the joint runners up sharing the President's Cup were Rachel Owen and Steve Higginson. However, when all the classes were combined the overall winner of this section, winning the Whimple Folk Cup was Colin Northcott.

We were very pleased to invite Marian Daniel to present the trophies and, on behalf of the Show Committee, Niamph Lark - Wardman presented a bouquet to her and she was also presented with a posy.

All the judges remarked on the high quality of the exhibits in all the classes and they asked that these comments were passed on to all the exhibitors. So well done to all of you who entered and give yourselves a big pat on the back for your efforts!!! In turn, we are extremely grateful to all our judges who give up their time to do this difficult task with such quality exhibits.

The Committee would like to express their thanks to everyone who helped us set up the hall for the Show and clear up afterwards, it is very much appreciated. The new arrangements worked very well for the second year and we are very grateful to Angela Banfield for operating the laptop to make sure all the entries went in the right classes and all the results were correctly recorded. For those of you who were entering for the first time we hope you enjoyed the experience and we look forward to seeing you at next year's show. And talking of next year, the Flower Show will be on Saturday 8th August 2009, so start your planning now!!

Our next event will be a talk on 'Plant Associations'. This will be given by Chris Yates and will be in the Victory Hall on Tuesday 28th October 2008 at 7.30 pm. There will also be some plants for sale on the evening. So hopefully we will see you all then.

Wasters of Whimple

Cardboard/plastic bottle volunteer collection

We are pleased that we are still receiving significant quantities of cardboard and plastic. We have been operating a collection every other month and generally have a trailer full of cardboard and two plus cars full of plastic. For this reason we intend to increase the collection to once a month. From October we will endeavour to provide a collection on the last Saturday of every month. Any volunteers will be very welcome.

Next volunteer collection Saturday 25th October 2008 10 - 11 am

Clean and crushed cardboard/plastic bottles (lids removed - milk bottle lids can be recycled by the Church). Provisional dates for next collections will be 29th November 2008 and 3rd January 2009.

Our policy on money

It is important to stress that we do not have a committee and do not want to make money. We intend to work in partnership with other Village organisations when organising events, with the other organisation taking any profits made.

However, the cardboard is now being included in a recycling credits scheme which should see the group receiving some money once a tonne of cardboard has been deposited. This will probably take 8-10 loads and any money raised may be offered to volunteers for petrol costs with any excess going to a Village organisation. It was felt that if money could be made for recycling cardboard then this opportunity should be taken. Consideration as to what should be done with any money raised has not been discussed yet as this is some months away. Any businesses with large quantities of cardboard which they send to landfill should be aware that money could be made by recycling.

Food packaging and waste

It was noticed that the amount of plastic packaging increased significantly in the summer. This seems to be down to the packaging of soft fruits and picnic foods. This is always going to be a problem when shopping at supermarkets and we would be interested to hear of any products you feel are over packaged.

Growing your own fruit and veg is a great option but not always practical, although amazing results can be achieved in pots and tubs and there is

nothing nicer than picking and eating your own produce.

There is also the option to avoid the supermarkets and shop locally. As well as the shop, post office and home delivery services in the village, Ottery St Mary offers a great range of produce. Meat, fruit and veg comes with much less packaging and is very often locally sourced. They also have a regular farmers' market on the first Friday morning of every month.

Produce is often more expensive than the supermarkets but you are less tempted to buy things you don't need and if you buy seasonal foods it can work out comparable or even cheaper.

Another way to save money and reduce waste would be to watch what you throw away. Composting food waste is something a lot of us do already but the reality is that throwing food away is a waste of money and as well as composting the food there is the dreaded packaging. Buying less and not over catering is good for the environment and your pocket.

Autumn social evening - Advice on plastic disposal and composting - November talk

As you know we advise that the recycling centres will only take plastic bottles but some of us have been told at the recycling centres that they will take any plastic packaging. This is not still the official view from the council so is very confusing. East Devon District Council and SITA (refuse collection contractor) have offered to come and give a talk on plastic recycling which will be your opportunity to find out more about what can and cannot be recycled, and how it is recycled.

Hugh Roberts has also offered to give a talk on composting. If you would like any advice on getting the best from your compost, or how to get started, Hugh has a wealth of experience.

We hope this event will be in early November and will be at the Victory Hall.

This event will be free to enter and we will offer a raffle and refreshments to cover the costs of the hall hire.

Many people will have seen our article in the last Whimple News regarding oil supplies to the village and we have been pleased so far with the response.

By the third week in August we had 17 households registered in the buying group and we placed an order for 9,700 litres of fuel oil for 13 households who needed to have a delivery at that time.

We placed an order with Watsons for delivery on 22nd August and secured a 10% improvement on price by buying in volume (approx equal to £25 for a 500 litre load). Watsons were the cheapest on this occasion when compared to 8 different oil companies who are able to deliver to the village.

We now have 25 households who have registered their details with us and it is our intention to go to the market once again and place a further order around the end of October. Thereafter we would envisage ordering again at the end of December.

Best Kept Village Result

Whimple is the Runner Up in the 'New Entries' section of the Best Kept Village Competition 2008, with 90 points. Many thanks to all those who worked so hard to make it look so good, especially the VPA who put in tremendous effort.

The competition is organised by CPRE (Campaign to Protect Rural England) and Mole Valley Farmers. They will be presenting the village with a framed certificate celebrating our success. This will take place at the beginning of the VPA's next meeting, which is open to all, on Tuesday 28th October at 7.30pm.

The judges' comments are as follows:-

Whimple is a large village - near enough to Exeter for many of its residents to commute on the train. London is approx. 3 hours away. We were impressed with standards here since Whimple is a first time entry. Apparently, litter has been, and is, a problem, but the community is very aware of it and is making great improvements. No litter was seen except in waste and re-cycling bins - correctly used with no refuse spilling over.

Notice boards were well displayed, attractive and showed a busy community. Parish Council Minutes were shown in full.

Public areas such as playing fields and school yards were in excellent condition. Some wooden seats were in need of attention, including those at the Knowle Cross Cricket Ground. This is a superb open space and grass was in peak condition. The Pavilion is shabby in places, but there is evidence of 'work in progress' here.

The appearance of property both old and new is consistently high, as are the gardens and a new playground with swings etc., included in a new housing area. A stout rubbish bin is well used. There was no sign of loose litter here.

St. Mary's Church was very clean and tidy as was the Churchyard. The new Churchyard on the edge of the village was in excellent condition. However, we noted a small pile of rusting corrugated iron sheets unnecessarily on view which could easily be hidden.

The allotments which are nearer the village are obviously well used and well kept except for redundant and broken items, albeit tidily stacked, along one fence.

The School and Community Centre (Victory Hall) are next door to each other -both are well-used and well-maintained buildings. The associated car park is a good size, and clean.

There is a single tennis court near the centre of the village which supports a Tennis Club, in good order. The main car park in the village is quite large and clean, and well screened.

The small railway station is in good condition, and brightly painted. It is approached by a wide road which can take all-day parking without difficulty, but this might not always be the case.

Outside the Church is an old-fashioned red telephone box - in a far better state than some of the others we have seen in the villages! It just needs a coat of red paint to cheer it up.

Evidence of community spirit is everywhere: Local societies and groups abound. Witness to this are all the notices and posters on notice boards. It is obvious that the residents of Whimple are proud of their village. They can be satisfied that a very high standard has been reached by this 'First Time Entry'

"Help us to find the right sites for a massive expansion of housing"

This was the title of a recent East Devon District Council press release heralding a forthcoming consultation on an 'Issues and Options Report' which will shape development in the district over the next 20 years. The report will address such issues as whether development in rural areas should be directed towards villages with the most facilities (and Whimple has more than most) and how the expansion of Cranbrook required by the proposed changes to the Regional Spatial Strategy can be accommodated.

Clearly both of these issues have serious implications for Whimple.

The consultation is expected to be undertaken in November/December and at that time the report will be available at www.eastdevon.gov.uk and at exhibitions across the district.

On the last occasion the council consulted on the local plan only three individuals from Whimple responded. If you have views on the issues raised and want to ensure that the District Council is made aware of the extent of the feelings of Whimple residents, please look out in the press and on the Council's website for the launch of the consultation and make your views known direct to the Council.



THE COST OF FREE BANKING There is no such thing as a free meal.

Paul Lewis writing in his 'Money Works' article gives us the evidence.

Current accounts are not free to customers and a lack of competition between banks keeps costs high. Those are the key findings of a detailed report into personal current accounts by the Office of Fair Trading (OFT).

The report reveals that current accounts earn the banks a staggering £8.3 billion a year. So far from being "free", each account costs the average customer £152 a year in charges and lost interest.

The OFT reveals that current accounts generate more money each year for the banks than any other service - and almost as much as mortgages and credit cards together.

The banks make £4.1 billion a year by lending out the money in our current accounts but most banks pay us almost no interest on it. Also they make £3.1 billion from the charges and interest on overdrafts. The remaining billion pounds or so comes from fees for current accounts and miscellaneous charges.

Banks are not open and transparent about these costs. The OFT's chief executive, John Fingleton, gave this analogy to the BBC: "It's like going into a petrol station without seeing how many litres of petrol you are buying and not having much pricing on display. [If that happened] you wouldn't have much competition among petrol stations."

It was with great sadness and a heavy heart that I read the article in the last Whimple News. When we had the Car Park resurfaced we failed to do our market research thoroughly enough and enquire of all the Villagers whether or not it was desirable. Further works are planned in the Billiard Room upgrade the toilet facilities in there. I hope that all users will bear us whilst work takes place and we apologise inconvenience (excuse the unintended pun) whilst these improvements are undertaken. We hope that the work will start shortly.
