Roast the Turkey, decorate the tree, Jesus born in Bethlehem, joy for you and me Trudge the Winter's snow, merry carol sing Jesus born in Bethlehem, God's little Saviour King Bitterness and strife, this world must cast away, Jesus born in Bethlehem, This Happy Christmas day!

In his play 'Twelfth Night, Shakespeare said "If music be the food of love, play on, give me excess of it, Oh! It came over my ear like the sweet sound that breathes upon a bank of violets". I would even go one better "If music be the food of LIFE and LOVE". Can you imagine what a sad world it would be if we would never hear the sound of music? In nature there are so many sweet sounds, the enchanting twittering and songs of our birds, the sound of the murmuring brook, the sound of the breeze rustling the leaves, the sound of church bells - music is all around us every day. What is more enthralling than the sound of human voices expressing joy and hope! We are very fortunate in England that the great tradition of church music is still upheld in our cathedrals. Our cathedral choirs are second to none, the sound of choristers is heavenly and it is obvious when you see them singing how happy they are to perform. We are lucky to have such talented choir masters and organists and the quality of their music will blossom at Christmas, when Carols old and new will resound. What Joy!

Of the many, lovely Christmas stories and legends I have come across, the one I have discovered lately enchanted me by its simplicity, the story of a very humble spider. When Mary and Joseph were fleeing to Egypt to protect their newborn son Jesus from the cruelty of a Roman emperor, they were pursued by a company of Roman soldiers and, in despair, sought refuge in a cavern on the hillside. A spider noticed them and took pity on them and, to make their refuge a bit safer and warmer, spun a thick and most intricate web across the opening so that the soldiers could not find them. Indeed they hurried past and so the Holy family was saved.

When they journeyed further, they rested under a maple tree which to this day is known as a tree full of grace. As they stopped and were thirsty a well sprung up and the water refreshed them. If you remember when the angels announced the good news to Mary they called her 'Mary Full of Grace', and the angels burst into sound with trumpets and voices.

Have you ever wondered why Christmas Turkevs are called Turkevs? When, in fact, they originated in North America. When travelling Europeans first discovered wild turkeys in the United States they thought they were the same birds as the ones called the African helmeted guinea fowl. These were known in England as the Turkey cock because it was imported from Africa through Turkey and the name stuck. In France turkeys are called dindon for the male bird and dinde for the female. The wild turkeys are still found in most of the states of North America. They are very different from the domesticated which were bred from the wild ones which were good flyers and are called gobblers as they gobble their food. Apparently Benjamin Franklin would have preferred the wild turkey to have been chosen as the national emblem of the United States of America rather than the bald eagle. He wrote this to his daughter in a letter stating that the bald eagle was a bird of bad moral character because it was too lazy to fish for itself and stole from fish hawks. He went on to write "The turkey is a much more respectable bird and a bird of courage who would not hesitate to attack Grenadiers of the British Guard".

And to finish my Christmas message this is the story of the Innkeeper in his own words:

"How could I tell?" the Innkeeper asked
"How could I have known t'was he?
There were just a carpenter and his wife
Come up from Galilee.
I would have bade them enter
And found them food and wine;
If only they'd explained to me
If only there'd been a sign...."

In our own County of Devon in the year 2001 when the foot and mouth crisis was at its peak, the despair of our farming community was great and a big service was organised for all the county for a day of prayers at Exeter Cathedral.

People from the Tor Valley who saw pyres of cattle burning on the surrounding hills were in despair and yet when they saw the flames soaring towards heavens and projecting such a beautiful scenery, they were inspired to bring hope out of despair by organising a music festival, and going from place to place. They made an appeal to raise money to buy a piano and collected enough money to go to an auction in London to acquire an instrument worthy of their cause. The piano travelled to the West Country and everyone was so excited and then disaster struck. It fell off the lorry and was broken to pieces. Imagine the despair. But hope came their way when a reputed piano builder in Vienna saw the news and invited the group to Austria and offered them a brand new piano free of charge. It arrived safe and sound and concerts were organised. Out of despair came this great hope due to kindness of perfect strangers.



Campaign for the Protection of Rural England Best Kept Village Competition 2007

At the October meeting of East Devon District Council, the hard work, dedication and community effort of the participating villages was praised by the Chairman. He presented awards to villages which had scored highest in the above competition within East Devon. East Budleigh with Bicton scored the highest number of points in East Devon in the Large Village Category with Sidbury, Upottery and Dunkeswell as runners up. Offwell scored the highest number of points in East Devon in the Small Village Category with Branscombe as runner up. Special congratulations were extended to Kilmington as the winner of the Devon-wide competition in the Large Village Category.

South West Britain in Bloom

East Devon had magnificent success in the South West Britain in Bloom competition this year. South West awards were won by Sidmouth, Exmouth, Seaton, Budleigh Salterton, Beer, East Budleigh and Littleham. Sidmouth also won a Silver Gilt in the Achievement Award category in the National competition.

Employment Land Provision in East Devon

The Council has now set up a Task and Finish Forum to look in detail at land availability within the District. The Work Forum will identify potential shortfalls in provision prior to the development of the strategic employment sites to the west of the district.

Concessionary Fares Scheme 2008

The Council is currently considering Government funding options for the extension of the Concessionary Fares Scheme in April 2008. It will give free off-peak bus travel anywhere in England for people aged 60 and over and eligible disabled people who are resident in England.

How to Build a Shed

As promised I was going to share my plan/ instructions for a rough garden shed/ log store in the Christmas Issue of the "NEWS" so after a phone call from my wife to tell me I must submit my plans to Ed & his team within 48 hours!, here it is -

Materials required -

13 Standard House doors + 1 narrower one (ie off an airing cubpoard). The flat standard interior type are easiest to work with. Try to find varnished or well painted doors as these will last better outdoors. Exterior (front/ Back) doors are OK but vary in size / design and make construction more difficult. Ideally all 6' long, 30" wide. Louvre doors are OK in a sheltered location as these allow air to circulate if seasoning logs etc. I try to avoid doors with glass, as we have young children, but that is down to individual choice as it then gives natrual light. At this stage remove all handles/ hinges & lock barrels for ease of construction.

<u>4 Good Quality heavy pallets</u> of 4' x 3' each. Usually these are painted blue or have EURO stamped on them.

<u>Dexion/ angle iron - 10 short off cuts</u> with holes already drilled for ease.

6 pieces of Stripwood: 2 - 4 " wide & 6' long

Various lengths of 2"x1" to use as strengthing batten.

Good selection of phillips/ posidrive 1", 2" & 3" screws (all '8' thickness) and a tin of felt nails

Some old bits of hardboard/plywood - suitable to cover the floor area

Old Kitchen Lino/ Vinyl foor covering - Ideally 9' x 7' to allow for tucking in but otherwise strips of 9' long will suffice as they can be overlapped.

A good time to collect these materials together is in the spring/ summer when people are having work done and there are plenty of skips about (always ask first before taking!) and the recycle yards are full of bits & pieces.

Screws are the only item which are necessary to buy new unless you find them at the tip etc. but tend to be cheap now anyway.

To Construct:

Making sure the area is level, lay the 4 pallets down to give an area roughly 8' x 6'.

With the help of your wife/ partner/ mistress or mother - in -law (not necessarily in that order of preference), line two doors up to left hand edge at right angles on top of the pallet and secure to each other. At this point secure to pallets with a couple short bits of dexion and some $1\frac{1}{2}$ screws along the base edge.

Carry this on around the base working clockwise, remembering to leave out a door in the centre front so you can get in! (and out!)

Using lengths of 2" x1" batten the top of the doors together to give extra strength. it is important that these pieces overlap door joins to hold everything together.

You should now have a shed minus roof and doors with a inside sq. area of about $7.5' \times 5.5'$. This will give a nice overhang on the roof.

Using steps and someone you trust to hold them now slide the doors remaining onto the roof . 9 should have gone into the sides and 4 are required for the roof (3 + 1 narrow). Fix these down leaving a suitable over hang each side. I always put the narrow one in the middle somewhere.

You should now have a complete shed with holes in the floor and a roof that needs waterproofing. Cover the floor in with plywood/ hardboard scraps and nail or screw down . Then cover the roof with the lino and tack down around the side edge with felt nails. Trim up as necessary. If overlapping odd strips make sure you allow plenty of overlap and use some sealing mastic between each join to keep the rain out.

Your shed is now minus a door(!). If storing logs/ firewood this isn't nessasary but

if you wish to add one for security - hang it so it opens outwards with two of the hinges removed and secure with an aspen staple.

To finish off run your 6' stripwood pieces vertically over each join & secure with small screws.

On a dry day paint to your own choice of colour.

You will see I have mentioned 'sealing mastic" This is not normally found second hand in tubes as it tends to go off but you often see old tins of aqua seal or gutter seal being chucked out. If using this with a brush to apply wear protective gloves as its a job to get off yer hands after!

** Under 5's would be allowed to use Kitchen Unit Doors as an alternative and the annoying plastic road mat that curls up in the corners/you slip up on in the kitchen as a roof covering.**



WHAT TO DRINK, WHAT TO DRINK (as if you need telling!!!!!!!!!)

It may surprise some of you that Christmas will again be falling on the 25th December this year; if you plan to be eating at this time, you may be wondering what to do about liquid refreshment to complement the food on the table. As I unselfishly drink my way round Mr Christopher Piper's wine emporium in Ottery, I have picked up some useful ideas (I think!) in that food/wine connection and I offer them to you. The following thoughts are not exhaustive, and will not be followed by lots of 'wine babble'. They are wines that the current Mrs H and I have tried, and we are very aware that choices of wine are like choices of holidays....all down to personal taste, which, thank goodness, are different for all of us.

You may want to start the run up to the Christmas meal with Bucks Fizz, and you don't have to spend a fortune on good champagne to mix with orange juice. Cava is an excellent substitute and about £5-£6 a bottle. If you do want champagne, there is a supermarket that begins with 'T' that does its own label which has been blind tasted against the great and the good, and stood up to them very well. I am not a fan of the branded champagnes in that you often pay over the odds whilst a lesser known producer will be less expensive, but still have quality. You can now buy champagne stoppers to keep the fizz in, on those rare occasions when you do not finish the whole bottle...and we know who you are...I was never too sure about dangling a silver spoon in the neck of the bottle to keep the fizz!

If you do Bucks Fizz, you can control the amount of champagne to orange juice mix, so that the chef is not discovered on the floor asleep, having been overtaken by the bacchanalian pleasures. Alternatively you may like to add cassis to champagne/cava and make a Kir Royale.

If you want to do something a little different, try chilling a white port and treating it as an aperitif. If you have sherry left over from last year, because Aunty Ethel didn't finish the bottle, then put it in a trifle. Sherry is not for keeping and needs to be drunk within 2-3 months. I think my parents may have owned a bottle that was so old it had birthday parties.

When looking to put wine with food, you are looking to support the flavours, not overwhelm them. A simple rule is that for mild flavours, go for light wines; for richer flavours, go for heavier wines.

So with turkey (if there are any this year!), a pinot noir is a light red that will support the flavours of the meat. New Zealand, South Africa and Australia all do various prices for this wine. Rioja is an alternative, plus if you really want to be whacko, a sparkling Shiraz. Yes, there is such a thing as a red sparkling, and it is great fun.

You may be going for salmon (not the smoked style), which will love a Chardonnay but make sure it is light on the oak, or it will clash.

We still find some Chardonnay's that appear to be the recipients of an entire wooden chalet house. These wines are to be sliced, not poured.

If you are having beef, then a red wine will help here - a cabernet sauvignon from Australia or South Africa will be bonza, as we say in Devon. Don't forget Chile or Argentina here, either, or even a Cabernet and Shiraz blend.

If you actually make it to Christmas pudding – I have to admit that we often have that another day as it was getting too expensive to hire a crane to lift us out of our chairs in the dining room to move us into the lounge to watch The Great Escape – then accept another challenge and try some amazing dark sherry, from the Pedro Ximenez grape. (pronounce the X as an H, or just call it PX!). It goes well with both Christmas pudding, and poured over ice-cream. Very decadent!

A final suggestion to go with the turkey/beef curry you may create after Christmas – try a Gewürztraminer white wine. You may see it a light white, but it goes surprisingly well with Indian food.

And an Christmas present for people interested in matching food and wine – I always buy Matthew Jukes' book each year – he nominates his top 250 wines of the year and offers a full food and wine matching section which is written in plain English. Hurrah! He is not producing a 2008 version, but the 2007 version is still full of good information.

Enjoy!!

Wasters of Whimple

A new group has been formed to tackle the practical issues of recycling and doing our bit to help the environment. There's a lot we can all do but for now here are a few seasonal ideas.

Packaging - Cardboard and plastic bottles can be recycled at the recycling centres in our area but doorstep recycling may not happen in Whimple for 18 months.

A group collection of cardboard and plastic bottles will take place in the car park, behind the Vets in the Square on Saturday 29th December from 11am - 2pm. We will organise trailers, etc to take to the recycling centre. Save these items and bring them suitably crushed and separated to the car park.

Green Boxes - The kerbside box collection takes **Old clothes and textiles** which are unsuitable for Charity Shops and **Household Batteries** - 6V, D, C, AA, AAA and button batteries can be recycled in your green boxes. You can get battery bags by phoning 01395 517528 or we hold a small supply.

Christmas cards - You can send an ecard on your computers (www.recycle.devon.org or many others). Regular cards can be recycled at the Post Office - courtesy of Jim and Alison together with **Postage stamps.**

Food - Most shops, including our Village Shop are only closed for a few days over the festive period, so take a risk and buy less food. Try to buy local and unpackaged goods or try group ordering from veg box schemes. This saves a vehicle just supplying you. Talk to your friends and neighbours. Remember most kitchen waste can be composted.

Save and crush your cardboard/plastic bottles and bring to group collection on 29th December 2007

Use your green box to its full potential
Food - Buy local and buy less
Buy unpackaged produce and reuse your carrier bags
Group order veg box schemes
Take Christmas cards and stamps to the Post Office

Don't forget to use Charity Shops/collections for unwanted goods

Unwanted CD's/DVD's can go to the Blue Peter Appeal at any Lloyds TSB branch

Why would anyone want to leave Whimple?







MOBILE PHONE providers are moving quickly to prevent stolen phones being sold on, according to a report by The Mobile Industry Crime Action Forum (MICAF).

Through tests conducted during September, it found all mobile phones reported as stolen were blocked on their home network within 24 hours and 98 per cent of handsets reported stolen were barred by all other UK networks within 48 hours.

The MICAF said the number of phones blocked so soon after they had been stolen had more than doubled from two years ago. It said this showed the 'ongoing commitment by the industry to ensure that when a mobile phone handset is reported stolen it is barred'

The Home Office also welcomed the findings, claiming: "These results send a powerful message to anyone thinking of stealing, or buying, a stolen mobile - that it will not work."

This is because once a phone is reported stolen it is put onto a national blacklist database, which is checked by all service providers and manufacturers who will not be able to legally unlock a phone listed on there

To check the legitimacy of a second-hand mobile phone, users should ask the seller for the IMEI number, a 15-digit code used to identify an individual mobile telephone. This number is often printed on the phone underneath the battery.

Typing it into the Home Office recommended global stolen property database Check Mend, will show whether it has been stolen and blocked.

Christmas Trivia

Santa Claus has many different names around the world including Father Christmas in the UK, Pere Noel in France, Kriss Kringle in Germany, La Befana in Italy, Julinesse in Denmark, Dedushka Moroz (meaning Grandfather Frost) in Russia and the Three Kings in Spain and Mexico.

The typical image we have of Santa Claus dressed in red clothes with white fur trim, is an amalgamation of cultural input over many years. Some people claim the image of Santa we know today is from Coca-cola advertising, but this simply isn't true. The standard Santa garb was well established by the 1920s and it wasn't until the 1930s that Coca-cola first used the Santa Claus design in their advertising.

The word Christmas comes from *Cristes maesse*, or "Christ's Mass." There is no set date for his birth in scripture and it wasn't celebrated on any particular day. However Christmas was first celebrated on the 25th of December in Rome in 336AD with an aim to replacing the popular pagan winter solstice celebrations

The first Christmas card was designed in 1843 by J.C. Horsley

The twelve days of Christmas are the days between Christmas Day and Epiphany (6th of January) and represent the length of time it took for the wise men from the East to visit the manger of Jesus after his birth.

Popular belief holds that three wise men visited Bethlehem from the east bearing gifts. However there is no mention in the bible about the number of wise men who visited. Three gifts were brought - gold, frankincense and myrrh, but names commonly attributed to the wise men - Gaspar, Melchior, and Balthasar were added some 500 years later.

The 26th of December is traditionally known as St Stephen's Day, but is more commonly known as Boxing Day. The reason it was called this is either alms boxes in church were opened and the money distributed to the poor, or alternatively it was named from the practice of servants receiving boxes of gifts from their employers on this day. Boxing day is NOT named after the practice of throwing out large numbers of boxes after Christmas!

English Puritan leader Oliver Cromwell banned Christmas between 1647 and 1660 because he believed such celebrations were immoral for the holiest day of the year.

The first postage stamp to commemorate Christmas was issued in Austria in 1937


