WHIMPLE STORES



This is our second Whimple News article since taking over Whimple Stores and I am glad to say that we have now settled in and found the "rhythm" needed to successfully operate and maintain a village store and Post Office.

Since the last article, we have modified the opening hours of the Post Office and have started to reduce the breadth of PO transactions that we will cover. It is essential that our staff are able to run the Post Office counter with confidence and that means focusing on the broad repeating range of transactions. and removing transactions that require a disproportionate amount of time or are complex, infrequent or require a high level of expertise.

Most of the Post Office customers have adapted well to the revised hours with just a few disappointments, mainly due to not being able to process parcels early morning or late evening. To help this, if you have a prepaid parcel, you can leave this anytime with the shop staff along with your name and we will process it later and hold onto the receipt until the next time you are in. If you have a QR Code for printing a label for a parcel return, just forward the QR code (if possible) to:

whimplestores@rmcommerce.biz

along with your name and drop the parcel (also with your name) to the shop staff. We will then process the parcel when the Post Office is open and hold the receipt for you next time you are in.

We also support 'Drop and Go if you a regular parcel sender. This allows you to bring in your parcels along with your account card anytime the shop is open and leave them with us for processing. Ask in the shop for more information if you are interested in this.

While our staff are learning the intricacies of the Post Office, please be patient with them. If they ask you to come back when the right level of expertise is available, this will be because we do not want to make mistakes that could cause a financial loss.

Our regular shoppers will have noticed that we are introducing new foods and additional ranges of cheeses, dips and other delicatessen items. New favourites are the Sharpham Rustic Cheese and Baba Ganoush. We are also making sure that we have stock to cater for key calendar events such as Valentines Day, Pancake Day, Mothers Day and of course, Easter. Wherever possible, we source food locally. If you feel we are not stocking things that you like, please let us know.

Our milk provider, Sutton Lucy had some equipment failure which stopped their production and we had to find temporary new providers. We wish Sutton Lucy a speedy recovery on their equipment.

We are planning to make a few changes to the layout of the shop over the Easter weekend.

These changes will create more space at the rear of the shop by moving the fridges and freezers which in turn will allow us to open up a space at the front of the shop for tables and chairs where our customers can enjoy a sit down with coffee and cake or tea and scones. We think that Whimple needs a communal space where friends can stop and chat and we hope that the front corner of the shop will provide that communal space.

To help with the changes, we are purchasing a new coffee machine and new metal shop racking. The pine dresser and bookshelves in the centre of the shop will be put up for sale or donated to RIO.

The new layout of the shop will also allow for easier browsing and the new racking will help us improve the range of products offered.

Our opening times for the shop over the Easter weekend will be 09:00 to 12:00 Friday, Saturday and Monday with the Post Office open only on Saturday as it is closed on Public Holiday days. Customers for Sunday newspapers will be able to collect them from the shop entrance but the rest of the shop will be closed all day for the improvements. We hope you will enjoy the new layout.

Finally, we say goodbye to Lynn Window who left us in February. Lynn has worked at Whimple Stores since 2016 and is now hopefully enjoying the additional time with her family and pets.



We have Great News!! The Planning Inspectorate has dismissed the appeal and planning permission is refused on the proposed New Fountain Inn development. The decision was published on March 3rd.

A brilliant result for everyone who has fought to retain the pub and car park. The Inspector was very thorough and diligent.

As far as we understand it, an appeal can be taken to the High Court, or an amended planning application can be submitted, but it would have to be substantially different, plus approval for the development of the car park is unlikely to be granted.

The key point before any future planning application could be submitted, is that the pub would need to be marketed for at least 12 months and then be proven to have failed.

Let's hope the owner is now open to speaking to the group in terms of a Community purchase, or that another buyer can be found.

Thanks to all of you for your amazing support. We wouldn't have got this far without the village being so passionate about preserving The Fountain.

We would also like to thank Marc and Donna and their amazing team for continuing to provide Whimple with such a fantastic pub in the Thirsty Farmer, and all their hard work getting it back up and running after an awful two years for them.

We now await the next development as this goes to press.





Hello my friends,

I do not usually do politics, from the pulpit or elsewhere but some events in history require a response and today seems like one of those. If you are easily offended by vicars spouting off about things, you might want to read no further.

One of the routine accusations levelled at those of any faith community is that religions have been responsible for all wars. For any serious student of either history or sociology this is nonsense of course and just a few minutes looking into the facts easily dispels the myth.

One reason is, of course, that religion isn't a thing, just like the church isn't a thing, it is a group of people who share an idea. Things, that is organisations, be it businesses, the police, the government or the church don't do anything, it is the people who either run the thing or work for the thing who commit acts, be they good or bad. It is people who make the rules and act them out.

This is why I do not believe in institutional racism, to me the idea that organisations are in some way racist is just a cop out to excuse the often-shabby behaviour of individuals either in behaving in shameful ways or turning a blind eye to that behaviour.

Fortunately, although we are all capable of behaving badly there are very few completely bad people. However,. the frightening thing is most of us have developed the habit of turning a blind eye to bad behaviour no matter who is the source, Whether it is the petty acts of anti-social behaviour we see around us every day, to racism, sexism or their colleagues in bigotry, to corruption in politics, to the big picture stuff of tyranny.

Sometimes we turn a blind eye because the wrongdoing on the one hand is balanced by an offer of benefit on the other: like Putin's cronies or a corrupt government which offers lower taxes.

Whatever the reason, we all know that it is wrong but we all do it,. So as philosopher and economist John Stuart Mill famously once said 'All that is required for evil to prosper is for good people to do nothing'. It is a lot easier to do nothing when we personally do not seem to be affected by those actions. It also allows us to condemn the actions and feel like one of the 'good guys' without actually having to do anything, except perhaps change our Facebook status for a few days. But every now and then those chickens come home to roost.

Enter President Putin.

In 2006 Alexander Litvinenko, an ex-Russian intelligence officer who defected, was poisoned in London. He died weeks later after drinking tea laced with polonium. In 2010, authorities blamed the poisoning on Russian intelligence agents acting on orders from President Putin

In 2008 Russia invaded Georgia on the orders of President Putin

In 2014 Russia seized the Crimea on the orders of President Putin

In 2018 agents poisoned Sergei Skripal, a former Russian military officer and double agent who had been jailed by Russia but released as part of a spy swap, and his daughter Yulia in Salisbury, England. While both targets survived, a British woman who encountered the poison after it had been disposed of, subsequently died. All of this happened on the orders of President Putin.

He has also fought proxy wars and shored up tyrants across the world, attempted to murder political opponents, arrested journalists and ruthlessly crushed protests.

None of this was done in secret, all of it was widely reported, much hand wringing taking place in the media and grand statements quickly forgotten. And all the while the west did close to nothing, of course there were sanctions and tough talking, but nothing of consequence.

And while all this went on governments around the world continued to cosy up to Putin and his cronies for the sake of financial expedience. Germany shifted most of its energy supplies into Russian hands, allowing it to raise billions of roubles (some of which will no doubt have paid for bullets and bombs which are currently being used), one of America's previous presidents even praised the man, and his malign influence was allowed to spread and businesses rushed to buy stakes in profitable Russian companies all paying their share of graft to the gangsters of Moscow.

Meanwhile Russian dirty money found its way in billions into London and into our own political system, money stolen from the Russian people, syphoned off by President Putin's cronies who bought visa's, houses, football teams, business, and respectability in our country. Whilst also buying political power and influence and the turning of a blind eye from ALL of our political parties for decades.

Despite the tyrannical behaviour of its leaders Russia was allowed to assume the cloak of international respectability, today it sits on international political bodies and hosts international sporting events particularly those where it's money buys favour.

Why does it happen?

Because it is just easier than taking a stand, because doing something meaningful costs, and these problems usually all seem so far away.

And then President Putin, following months of lies, ordered the invasion of Ukraine, the second largest country in Europe. And suddenly history seemed to be in danger of repeating itself.

Last week I was in Scotland with the family and, on the day the news of the Russian invasion of Ukraine flashed across the world, I was out playing snowballs with our boys in a glen in the Scottish Highlands.

As I sat with my boys watching the tv I was struck by a frightening thought: I wondered if this was how fathers with sons had felt when the news of the invasion of Poland had flashed around the world on the radio on the 1st September 1939, the awful realisation of where this could end up and the cost to families across not just our country but the world. How obvious the path to all this seemed now, how had we missed it?

And then a second, more awful thought.

Would I have been so upset if this war was in Africa or Asia. What if this was not a white, western European country only a few hours flight from London? It is easy to rationalise people dying a long way off, isn't it? It is even easier if they are a different colour or speak a different language.

Now across Europe and beyond there is quite rightly a growing sense of outrage at war in the heart of Europe but why is it any different to war and brutality anywhere else? It is no more tyrannical that his previous atrocities and no war brought about by greed and selfishness in the west is more egregious than the actions of any other tyrant just because it happens to be on our doorstep.

And how long will our sense of outrage last? The sanctions already imposed will eventually inflict damage to Russia, although it will be the people not Putin and his chums who will suffer the most, but they will also bite here and in Europe. I can almost imagine the cost/benefit analyses conversations in governments now: "if we stop buying their gas will it inflict serious damage on their military machine?" "Yes, but it will also really damage our economy which might threaten our chance of reelection!". I read with incredulity of the Italian government's efforts to have luxury goods excluded from the sanctions being imposed, because it was OK to stop the oligarchs buying property but an embargo on Gucci or Armani seemed a step too far if it impacted their powerful business interests! And it isn't just politicians: on social media I have already seen support flowing for one of Putin's most ardent cronies because he happened to have changed the fortunes of a premier league football club he bought, it doesn't seem to factor that the funds used to manage this were stained with funds stolen from the Russian people.

So far, the UK government seems to have started well with the severity of the sanctions but how long will our resolve hold when that translates into pounds out of our pockets, possible fuel shortages or prices rises? Like Russia it will be the poorest in our society hit hardest, will those of us who are better off be willing to subsidise them? How willing are our politicians to give up the lucrative fees paid by Russian lobbying firms and how willing are we to hold them to that? Would we rather vote for a government who promises to safeguard low taxes or who vows to wipe out corruption at the heart of Westminster? How little will Putin have to concede to get back into the good graces of the western financial systems, how much is Ukraine worth in dollars and pounds?

Will we have the stomach for the fight, to suck up the economic pain this battle is really going to take? Will we have the will to vote with our conscience rather than our self-interest to force our politicians to sever ties with dirty Russian money, to make London a hostile place for buddies of Putin, and their cronies, to use the power of the mighty London financial machine to chase that dirty money stolen

from the Russian people wherever it goes and declare Putin what he is: ' a war criminal'?.

And then, will we afford the same courage and tenacity in fighting the other tyrants of the world, no matter the location, colour or faith of those they victimise as we finally come to realise one of the things we should all share is our worth: because no country or individual is less worthy because of its geography or ethnicity of the same basic protections and freedoms we would expect for ourselves and those we love? God bless. **Rev Marc**.



' Dream Big, Work Hard, Make it Happen' Just Ten Questions with Ann Daniels - Polar Explorer

Some of you may have previously been lucky enough to hear Ann Daniels talk about her Polar expeditions, but my interview, I'm sure' will still be an inspiration to all WN readers. Having been successfully chosen from over 250 women, Ann embarked on her first relay expedition to the Arctic in 1997 at the age of 31 years.

- 1. What made you go for that initial selection weekend in Dartmoor? I was looking divorce right in the eye, I had my18 month old triplets at home and I was in this world of difficulty. I saw the advert and thought this was something I could do. I wasn't actually thinking 'North Pole', but I felt I had to do something as I was drowning in my difficult situation. However, when I was at the selection I began to think WOW this could be a wonderful thing to do. We were given nine months to prepare for the next session. So I trained hard and was chosen The only one not to have any experience, out of 250.
- 2. Did your childhood involve outdoor adventure? No, I was brought up in Bradford. A usual city upbringing. We'd go to the local river occasionally in the summer, but nothing outward bound. When I went to the selection I couldn't ski, I wasn't fit and I'd never even had a rucksack on my back.
- 3. Talking of rucksacks, what is your kit list like for an expedition? It's vital for your survival and your health, but you are pulling it all so you need to get the lightest kit that does the most work AND you have to be able to adapt it as well. For example, using skis & ski poles instead of tent poles. Everything is used for more than one purpose, and has to be repaired so a repair kit is essential. Everything freezes, so we have matchsticks taped around our Thermos flask so you can grip and open it, and you keep your toothpaste in your sleeping bag.
- 4. Where does your motivation come from, when experiencing such extreme conditions? The first time it was all consuming as I was such a novice, but it's the same every time I'm doing it for the team. That absolute desire that I have to do my best for the team. The first time was a relay and if we'd failed as the first group, none of the other teams would have got on the ice, so there was a huge reason not to give up. Also, it was the first time I'd been separated from my children, and I couldn't go back and say I'd given up. As the years have gone on, it's pretty much the same except more comes into play on a professional basis. I choose to be here and therefore I have to do my best.
- 5. You give many inspirational talks on leadership, what are the leadership skills that you recognise as crucial? Real leadership is about your team not you. It really is about supporting your team, doing the best you can and enabling your team to perform. Because when they perform that's when you get success.
- 6. How important to you is the recognition of being the first female to achieve so many accolades? Breaking into a man's world and paving the way for other women is important. Getting yourself there and working in equal terms, as a woman, is important. It's not about competing with men. We are all different and have different skills. So it's about being yourself and working hard.

- 7. I suppose that many of us imagine the Arctic and Antarctic as being white, cold, stark and bleak. Do you find any beauty there? They are two completely different environments. However, the Arctic is where my heart and soul lie. It is a moving layer of ice on a body of water. You get huge ridges which look like mountains, but they are just ice on top of ice, on top of ice. You see aquamarine blue where the ice may have sheared, there's white from the snow with the sun glinting on it. There's a sort of glitter that looks like a christmas card, black from the ocean, and a myriad of colours pastels, muted and natural. It is breathtaking, it blew my mind the first time I saw it all. I'd never felt spiritual until I'd gone there. It's magnificent.I feel at one with the ocean and nature.
- 8. What changes have you seen first hand as you have returned with regards to global warming? Anecdotally, from 1997, on my first expedition, there was so much more ice, more ridges, and thicker ice. Over the years I've seen it disappear. When I did my 2002 trip we had to swim some of the journey. Scientifically, working with NASA' I've drilled the depth of the ice and taken notation of all the ridges over five years, and it IS disappearing. Our water around the world is now changing, becoming more acidic with carbolic acid. It's affecting the very bottom of the food chain. Also, as the earth warms and the fresh ice caps on the land surrounding the Arctic Ocean melt, fresh water flows into the ocean and the salt levels are decreasing causing tremendous damage to the eco system.
- 9. Do you have an important message for us? YES. All our oceans are connected. What happens in the Arctic and Antarctic Oceans, the very ends of our earth, affects how we ALL live our climate, our weather, <u>EVERYTHING</u>. Also, how we live and what we do in our lives affects these Polar regions too. Very soon, the ARCTIC ice will disappear in the summer months, for the first time ever! On a positive note, mankind is waking up and we can make a huge difference and slow this down and we must. We have to. We just have to. I feel very passionately about this.



10. Finally, why Whimple? I was looking to be in this area, close to Dartmoor. Whimple was the one village that when I arrived I said 'This is the place I want to live, this is it, it's got the feel that I want.' When I come back to Whimple it's home! I go to these extreme places and what you miss is stability, home, familiarity, and comfort from people. I know everyone here, it's a great village with a great community. I can get involved, join in and be a real person.

In Whimple, whoever you are, you are YOU. I love it, it's fab.



About 'Talaton - A War-Time Refuge'

"Talaton – A War-Time Refuge" tells the true story of six of the twenty-three Polish Jewish children who were evacuated from Poland, on the Kindertransport, just before the out-break of World War Two and were 'homed' in Talaton. The play, written by Tom Samson, the company's director, is based upon extensive research, family archives and first-hand interviews with some of those whose stories are retold through the drama.

The story is obviously set against the backdrop of war-torn Europe but shows how, in a small Devon community, young lives could be transformed through understanding, care and, ultimately, love. In the words of one of the children homed in Talaton and recently interviewed for this production, "All of our lives were touched and changed forever by the kindness of poor, simple country folk who had little money for themselves but opened their homes to give us shelter, care, love and hope for the future."

This is the story of the Kindertransport children as it happened in Talaton. This story, in various ways, was to repeat itself throughout the country. It is a story where the 'first-hand experience' has almost been forgotten, leaving us with the dry historical details of those events. Through the words and writings of the survivors, the contributions of their families and the projection of archive photographs and documents during the performance, this ultimately uplifting story is brought back to life and once again made known. It is also a story that speaks to us today, as once again, as a country, we have to confront the issues concerned with vast numbers of refugees seeking sanctuary away from the horrors of their own homes. Copies of the play, which is historically accurate, will be available to purchase at the performance.

For this production we will be transforming the 'Christmas Barn' at Cotley Farm into an open, airy, enclosed theatrical venue. We will be bringing into the venue comfortable seating, major stage setting, lighting and sound as well as a projection system. There will be a licenced bar open from 7.30pm and during the interval.

About the theatre company

Community Theatre 4All was formed in September 2015 and draws its membership primarily from the villages of Talaton, Whimple and the surrounding area. The company gave its first performance, "Godspell", in St Mary's church Whimple in March 2016. Since this time the group has been highly active producing a wide range of work and performing in many different venues. "Godspell" was followed by an original piece called "In Remembrance of a Lost Generation". This play told the stories of the men whose lives are commemorated on the Talaton, Whimple and Escot First World War memorials. The play was performed in both Talaton and Whimple. Further work has included, amongst other productions, an open-air presentation of 'A Midsummer Night's Dream', a four-week tour of local village halls with an evening of comic Victorian Melodramas and, most recently, five performances of 'Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat', which was performed in St Mary's Church Whimple in March 2019 (just before the first 'lock down').

A Window on Whimple's Weather - January/February 2022

Welcome to the eighth weather summary compiled from Whimple's two weather stations, both surviving the February storms!

Data is aggregated from Slewton Crescent and Cobden Lane, and live streamed onto the internet:

January – The exceptionally mild weather of the last few days of 2021 continued into 2022 with New Year's Day offering a pleasant 14.7°C. Night temperatures only started dipping below freezing from the 5th with the 21th being the coldest night at 5.4°C. There was 30% less rain than average (39mm as opposed to 60mm); the 8th being the wettest day with 11.4mm of rain. However, claims by the media of the sunniest UK January on record were not reflected in Whimple. Solar collection data collated over 10 years showed a very average January sunshine! Storms Malik and Corrie brought windy weather to Whimple in the last three days of January, with South Westerly gusts of over 40kph. Little did we know what February would bring!

February – For the first time since storms were named, the UK experienced three within one week! Dudley, Eunice and Franklin raged across the UK; with Eunice, whose development was an example of *explosive cyclogenesis*, being the most destructive since the "Great Storm" of 1987. The Met office issued red weather warnings for wind, throughout the South West. Whilst Whimple avoided the worst of the wind, some local damage was inflicted, with trees down in a number of places including Holly Ball lane and Cobden lane. Sustained South Westerly winds of 58.7kph were recorded at the Cobden lane weather station on the 18th, with gusts of over 73kph! Rainfall was a little above average, with the 13th being the wettest when 30% (15mm) of the month's rain was recorded in one day. February was warmer than usual with an average daily high temperature of 11.4°C as opposed to 9°C. Sunshine was slightly below average.



When one see's the disaster that is being inflicted on the people of Ukraine, nothing else seems to matter. This has been caused by an immoral and callous Russian President that places no value on the human suffering he is causing. We hope that when the parish magazine has been printed this senseless violence will be replaced by diplomacy and peace. Let's make Whimple a yellow and blue village, to show that in one small part of England we stand in solidarity with the Ukraine President, Volodymyr Zelenskyy.

In many situations in life's rich path it's sometimes easy to give up, when one experiences a task which seems insurmountable. What can be done by one individual or one small group against powerful corporations, service providers or public bodies?

New Fountain Inn

When a planning application was submitted for the New Fountain to turn the pub into residential usage, leaving just one, unviable, room, to pretend the pub was not being closed. Then adding insult to injury, by wanting a terrace of three, singularly unattractive and out of character houses in the pub car park, all within the conservation area. This was totally unacceptable to scores of villagers and a small core group was formed to create 'Save Whimple's New Fountain Inn group'.

A united force gathered to object to the application, which was led by Karen Scott in our village. On this one application there were 220 formal letters of objection to East Devon District Council (EDDC). POW+R Group was also taking a strong stance against this nonsensical planning application. The application was refused by EDDC and the applicant went to appeal against the decision of the local authority. At the hearing on the 15th February 2022, were representatives from the Save Whimple Pub Group, POW+R Group, the Heritage Centre and a local resident.

In a long, detailed and carefully deliberated report a determination was made on the 2nd March 2022 – The final sentence being, 'For the above reasons and taking into account all of the submitted written and verbal evidence, the appeal is dismissed'. This was a very welcome outcome after so much work had been done by all those that have fed into the objection process and those that were passionate about saving our village pub. Ironically, a small core group celebrated on the Friday, in the Thirsty Farmer. It is just a shame that the celebrations couldn't take place in the New Fountain Inn itself.

Cranbrook Development Plan

The Government Planning Inspector directed EDDC to make a schedule of changes, modifying the plan. These were undertaken and the results went out to public consultation, which concluded on the 28th February 2022. In this last stage POW+R submitted a letter outlining the main issues affecting Whimple and the impact that the plan has on our parish boundary. It is likely to take a number of weeks before the final agreement on the Cranbrook Master Plan can be made.

Neighbourhood Plan

The Parish Council and POW+R Group are moving forward with the creation of the Whimple Neighbourhood Plan. It is considered to be vitally important for our village as it sets out our own parish planning policies that will form part of the wider development plan and used in determining planning applications and other local policies.

The Whimple NP Team has started the consultation programme by first having an event at the Victory Hall on the 12th and 13th February 2022. This gave villagers a chance to discuss how they see the village evolving over the next 30 years. It was lovely to see so many residents turn out to give their thoughts. Over the two days we had 231 post-it notes of ideas completed – these have been recorded as part of the evidence gathering. The online village survey went live on the 12th February and the hard copies were out from the middle of March to all the properties in the parish area. A six week time scale is allocated for this stage of the process. We ask every villager to complete the survey / consultation document, including making separate submissions for those under 18 years of age, in whatever form they would like. Collection boxes will be in the Whimple Stores, Victory Hall, Village Surgery, Sarah Jane's Hairdressers and the Thirsty Farmer.

In addition, a wider consultation to national and regional organisations, business community, government bodies, including our neighbouring parishes will have taken place in March.

It is vitally important that as many parishioners as possible complete the form or online version, as this adds to the strength, legitimacy and soundness of your views in combination with all the others. The NP Team will then spend the next few months, analysing and evaluating the information to ensure it reflects the general views of the village and participants' comments, as well as integrating with the policies of the National Planning Framework and the District's local strategy. We will then create the first draft of the Neighbourhood Plan by the autumn this year, with a view to complete the whole process by March 2023. You can access the online survey at https://bit.ly/WhimpleNP.

If you want to be part of the process to 'Protect our Whimple and Rockbeare' we'd love to hear from you! The Neighbourhood Plan will be achieved by: Ambition, determination, cooperation and you.

We wish all villagers well, good health and contentment, and let's get moving with the 'We love Whimple' NP show on the road.






