Thank you to everyone who gave us such lovely cards and gifts over the Christmas period. It has been very much appreciated and enjoyed.

Just a reminder of our opening hours – weekdays 8am-6pm – weekends 9ammidday. We hope to be able to carry on with our regular hours during this latest lockdown.

We have split ourselves into two teams so that if any one of us catches covid we will be able to keep the shop open although we would need, at that point, to reduce the hours to mornings only. Hopefully that won't happen and we would ask you to help us stay safe by wearing a mask, sanitising your hands once your mask is attached, avoid touching your face again whilst in the shop and if possible please pay using a contactless card.

Stock during this lockdown is much more consistent and easier to source. Our local milk and egg suppliers are still providing as much stock as the fresh veg and freshly baked bread suppliers. If you need something in particular that we don't stock in the shop, please ask and if we can get it for you we will try.

Most of you will have noticed that it is much quieter in the shop this time. There are less queues and it feels much quieter. Bearing this in mind we may have to adjust our staffing levels so there may be only one person serving in the shop and Post Office.

#### Post Office

The Post Office is open the same hours as the shop.

Just a reminder that the Post Office offers a good range of banking services for all high street banks and a few others so, if you need to deposit a cheque or cash, this can be done with us. Cheques need to put into a banking envelope (we hold a good stock of these for most banks), ideally with a paying in slip but if you don't have a slip just write the account number and sort code of your bank on the reverse of the cheque. Cash deposits for most high street banks can be done via your debit card. Cash withdrawals are free at the Post Office.

The price of postage increased on 1<sup>st</sup> January so if you need advice before posting please feel free to ask for advice. If you are sending overseas you will now need to complete a customs label to all countries, including European destinations. If you would like a customs label to fill in before you post, please ask and we will be happy to supply one.

The Post Office has some offers currently running on their savings accounts. If you would like information please pick up a form in store - if applying online our branch number is 5885191.

Dr Thompson's and Dr Stuart's patients are being distributed amongst the partners going forwards and I do hope you have received your notification.


The surgery continues to strive to offer its usual range of services both at Coleridge and Whimple sites. The demand has been high and sometimes we have struggled to find appointments in an acceptable time frame but with increased staff capacity we hope that will improve. The bigger 'flu vaccination campaign involving younger patients this year has largely been achieved with a great deal of commitment from our staff during the week and at weekends.

The Covid 19 vaccination programme is picking up pace and we are offering our older mobile patients slots at Exmouth Tennis Centre. All the staff have been involved during the week and on Saturdays. It is an enormous undertaking and particularly as the Pfizer vaccine comes with its cold chain complications. We had the unfortunate government turnaround involving second vaccine appointments which resulted in a lot of disappointment and administrative burden. A wider cohort however will now get the first vaccine which confers good protection if not 100%.

Please note that our staff will be contacting patients who have been identified as priority to be offered the vaccine first. Please do not call us to book.

Dr de Sousa returned to work in December and is building up his hours. We have been delighted to welcome him back as have his patients.

Thank you all for your continued support and patience during these uncertain times and we hope we are seeing a light at the end of this rather long and gloomy tunnel.

Hello my friends,

I am sitting writing this on the 20th January in a room piled high with boxes, our house in in total chaos and a trip from one room to another feels like an obstacle course. Why? Well because in less than two days we are moving and so we are in full 'packing mode'. Maybe I should back up a bit and explain.

Angie, the boys and I have now been part of the Churches4all Mission Community for five years, we first came here before I was ordained and, in my training, at that point we were living just down the road at Crannaford, then just over two years ago the Diocese found a house for us in Whimple and we moved to The Old Goods Yard, in Station Road. Since then, our family has grown to include our two dogs: Thor and Lola; and a few weeks ago, Angie's Mum, 'Nanny'.

In February last year my boss, Rev Chris Martin moved on to a new role in another Diocese and I finished my training that summer. It is usually at this point during a priest's 'curacy' they start looking for a new post in another set of parishes. That is what I had always imagined I would be doing as in this diocese it is generally not encouraged for curates to stay to lead parishes they have trained in.

However, God it seems had other plans!

As many of you will no doubt know our parish is part of four in the Churches4all Mission Community. We are currently consulting on this group increasing to nine; the others being Cranbrook, Broadclyst, Rockbeare, Clyst Honiton and Sowton. If the consultation goes favourably this new 'mission community' will probably become a legal entity in March or April of this year. The process of amalgamating the groups is complex and will probably take a while; each parish is unique and will have its own particular style of church, challenges and opportunities. Part of the time required to make this work is simply getting to know each of the churches, congregations and parochial church councils. For a new priest in charge to be selected to oversee this process would require them beginning this process of familiarisation from scratch.

However, I have already been working with our existing four parishes for five years and before that spent several years based across the other parishes which are about to join us. I also know both of the other ministers in those parishes; in light of this the senior leadership team at the diocese felt I was well placed to oversee the formation of the new group and I was asked if I wished to apply for the vacant role of priest in charge.

So, in mid-January I had the rather odd experience of being interviewed by, among others, the wardens of the churches I have served for five years for the post along with Bishop Jackie and Archdeacon Andrew. I am delighted to say they agreed I was the right person for the job and last week I was officially 'licensed'.

In effect this means you are all stuck with me for another few years!


On the 22nd of January, Angie, Nanny, the boys, the dogs, and I will be moving about one hundred and fifty yards from our current home to the Rectory in Grove Road.

I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of all of our family to say a huge 'thankyou' to all of you. Our time here so far has certainly been a roller coaster ride and finishing my training as the sole full-time priest in the community whilst we entered this pandemic has been 'challenging' to say the least. It is you, the people of this parish and my other parishes, who have made it a positive and uplifting experience. It is all of you, who during the darkest times have helped inspire and encourage us to keep moving forward with the acts of random kindness, the outpouring of compassion and the simple but amazing selflessness. You have been inspirational! It is because of the people in these parishes that our family decided we wanted to stay here to make this new project work.

You may come to church or you may not, you may have a faith, or you may not, but whoever you are I am here to serve you as best I can. I have no idea what the next few years will bring but I look forward to the honour and privilege of continuing to serve you all as your parish priest whoever you are and whatever you believe.

Before I do, I want to wish you all a better 2021 than 2020, please be careful and stay well. The vaccine for this awful virus is being rolled out and let us all hope and pray that it does its job and we can once again enjoy the company of family and friends.

In the meantime, our villagers continue to help those who need a little support at this time and the church continues to collect food, please try to help if you can by donating something.



The council website has plenty of advice on Covid 19 issues

and continues to offer financial support where it is needed, please go to the EDDC site for information. The other place to get information is the Parish council website, Kevin the Parish clerk does a sterling job of keeping the site updated. If you don't have access to a computer and need any advice or help you can always ring me for East Devon issues or Kevin for Parish issues.

#### CRANBROOK TOWN CENTRE

After a lot of negotiations and rejection of 2 proposals from the consortium that are developing a town centre for Cranbrook, the strategic development committee have signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) which in simple terms means that the town centre will begin to be developed this year and should be completed by 2024. I am well aware that the growth of Cranbrook causes a great deal of angst for many but to have good facilities near us may be regarded by some as a bonus. There will be a Morrisons (obviously our own wonderful village shop will continue to be a jewel in our village crown) library, extra care facility, cafes, a range of small shops and a town square for farmers' markets. The Ingrams sports area will get a purpose built sports pavilion which will be moved forward by the Cranbrook Town Council and as we live so close we will be able to make full use of these facilities.

#### OTTER VALLEY PROJECT

For those of you who are interested in environmental issues, on Wednesday the 6th of January after seven years of public consultation, the planning committee approved a pioneering project to allow the lower Otter estuary to return to a more natural condition. 50 hectares of the area will become intertidal mudflats, salt marsh and other estuarine habitats. This will be achieved by breaching the embankment which will mean that at high tide the original flood plain will flood and then drain on the outgoing tide.

The £15 million project, mainly funded by the EU, is a pilot project, one of two in Europe. The other is in Normandy, France which aims to demonstrate that the early adaptation to climate change will bring better outcomes than delayed response or inaction. #### • East Devon District Council Launch A New Local Plan for East Devon Issues and Options Report Consultation

EDDC are producing a new local plan for East Devon. To commence the process, they have produced an Issues and Options consultation report. This report highlights some of the major planning issues and challenges that they see for East Devon over the years ahead and some of the potential responses. EDDC would welcome your views on the matters we raise or any additional considerations. The Issues and Options report can be viewed at www.eastdevon.gov.uk/newlocalplan and EDDC has also produced an online questionnaire that I would encourage you to fill out. EDDC need to receive any comments by 12:00 noon on Monday 15th March 2021. Their preference is for responses to be made electronically but paper copies of the questionnaire can be made available, on request, for those without access to the internet. Responses received to the consultation, along with ongoing work, will be used to help EDDC produce a draft version of the local plan that they hope will go out for consultation in early 2022.

It is envisaged that a new local plan will guide future development and contain the full range of planning policies needed for the Council to undertake its development management functions and determine planning applications. To support local plan production, EDDC are undertaking a call for sites as part of a new Housing and Employment Land Availability Assessment (HELAA). If landowners wish to promote any sites or areas of land in East Devon for development, they can find more information on our HELAA web page www.eastdevon.gov.uk/callforsites. Submissions need to be received by 12:00noon on Monday 15th March 2021. Submission of land to the HELAA does not mean that it will be allocated for development.



As a group, we need to look outside our village to the wider world around us. The decisions made in Westminster, County Hall and at Heathpark, Honiton affect our village, just as much as the ever-expanding Cranbrook or the potential loss of our local pub.

POW+R group, as always, have been busy since Christmas, with one of our first tasks being to respond to the Regional Clyst Valley Park proposals. Each committee member wrote, providing feedback for the new park.

The Regional Park has merit and the principles of open countryside access are beneficial to the natural environment, social well-being and general recreation. However, we must not lose the protection of some of the finest landscapes in East Devon and must ensure the total avoidance of coalescence between communities in the valley. e.g. development east of Cobden Lane. There are also pressures on SANGS (Suitable Alternative Natural Green Spaces) as they are seen by developers as more land to develop down the line. Furthermore, a re-evaluation of population growth is also required in both Cranbrook and Exeter. In our points we wanted to ensure that under the National Planning Policy Framework, the Regional Park met the challenges of climate change and flooding, including 'The Green' in Whimple.

POW+R have submitted more letters of objection on 'Land West of Gribble Lane', Rockbeare, as amended plans. This was for the construction of up to 200 dwellings and associated infrastructure, with all matters reserved apart from access. The residents of Rockbeare, Whimple and Broadclyst have a 'legitimate expectation' that, as previous plans were made public, these extra developments should not take place. It is absolutely clear that this incursion is opposed by a large group of residents, especially developing into SANGS areas. This site is also a historic park, but that does not seem to worry developers. According to the PM, it's build, build, build!

Following the final Public Hearing session on the proposed expansion of Cranbrook back in November, we are still awaiting the outcome from the Inspector's findings. We are aware that she has been unwell and so her feedback to East Devon District Council has been delayed, but we are told that a letter is due from her outlining the next steps towards the end of January. There were considerable issues left unresolved at the end of the hearings regarding the financial viability of the expansion in general, so it will be interesting to see what the Inspector suggests as a way forward. We continue to 'watch this space!'

Many households in Whimple will by now have received the leaflet from Persimmon regarding their pitiful excuse for a public hearing on their plans for the Cobden development. This development proposal is the main focus of POW+R's attention as it includes the triangle of land at the top of Cobden Lane that is currently designated for Gypsy & Traveller provision. This land is also still within Whimple Parish. The alterations to the access of Cobden Lane are also a key feature that POW+R are keeping a keen eye on. Persimmon is under no obligation to carry out a public consultation of their plans and they will have only decided to do so if they can see a benefit to them from undertaking one. They will extract any positive comments from residents' responses, no matter how tenuous, and will use these to bolster their full planning application to EDDC when they submit this. No doubt many residents will have made their voices heard loud and clear via Persimmon's website, and well done for submitting your thoughts on this proposal. Please just be aware that you will also need to shout very loudly once again when the official planning application is made to EDDC. This is the official channel for representations to be made. This smoke-screen of 'community engagement' from Persimmon is one that they will most certainly seek to use to their own advantage. We must all be ready to respond with our objections when Persimmon submits the main application to EDDC.

It seems to be very clear that the **New Fountain Inn Planning Application** and the risk of losing our 'local pub' has really got villagers angry. The people of Whimple have moved into action mode and are proclaiming deep opposition to this scheme. POW+R has sent individual letters of objection and a major detailed report, with considerable evidence why this should be refused in its entirety – no compromises, not in a Conservation Area, not building on the Car Park, not jeopardising the Heritage Centre, not pretending to keep a bit of the pub open. No, No, No. The simple solution is to get new owners that actually care about running a pub and the villagers it serves, not those that appear to be deliberately running the pub down. The current owners of the New Fountain Inn have already been made a decent offer. Virtually all research shows that food sales are the life blood of running a pub.

In addition, identifying key features and amenities within a village are fundamental to the construction of the Neighbourhood Plan for our Village, which adds a layer of protection to these facilities – the Plan is urgent...

If you want a challenge, we need a new Chair and would welcome any input and assistance from members of the wider Whimple/Rockbeare communities. If you would be willing and able to give up some of your free time in order to help protect our village and Rockbeare from the ever-expanding Cranbrook urban mass, and any other large-scale developments that are proposed, we'd love to hear from you!

#### A Window on Whimple's Weather

Some of you may recall Ken Burrows, and later Simon Foulds, used to write a brief summary in each issue about Whimple's recent weather, Ken using his 'old school' Stevenson Screen observations from Lilypond Lane. Sadly they have moved now on, but there are now at least two weather observers in Whimple making use of new technology to stream live weather readings onto the internet: one from Slewton Crescent and another from Cobden Lane. Please feedback any comments or questions!

Our readings generally agree very well on temperature despite being a mile away from each other, and reasonably well on rainfall. However, wind is about 50% less in Slewton due to obstruction from surrounding houses! Cobden Lane site is much more exposed.

**November** – was a relatively settled month, with sunshine slightly above average and rainfall below. The month began very mild at 16.3°C on the first 2 days, while the sunniest days were between the 2nd and 6th as high pressure dominated. However wet and windy weather moved in mid-month; windiest on the 11th and 14th, with heavy rain on much of the 14th. It quietened down again after that, with sunnier and drier days in the final week. This led to some clear nights and a couple of frosts.

**December** – was much more unsettled across the country, with a lot of wind and rain, and flooding in places. However, in between the bands of rain there were some sunnier days, such as the 6th to the 8th, with clear skies and frosts by night. The month as a whole was 3°C cooler than November. Mild weather returned on the 13th and temperatures climbed to 14.4°C by the shortest day. The 23rd was a very wet day, Christmas Eve and Day were sunny and cool, but Storm Bella followed overnight 26th/27th with gusts to 73 km/h. The next day it became a lot colder for the final few days of 2020, with a minimum of -4.2°C early on New Year's Eve.

#### Cooking with Kids

Over the years I have spent many happy hours in the kitchen with my grandchildren. Can there be a better time to do some home-schooling with your little ones in the kitchen than during lockdown? Here are some tried and tested recipes that are fun to do with the kids.

#### Cheese and bacon scone pizza

All kids like pizza but who wants to be waiting around for the pizza dough to prove? Kids want it now! You can alter the topping to your own or the children's choice.

Serves 4, takes 15 minutes to prepare and 15 minutes to cook.

#### Ingredients

250g plain flour, 1 tbsp olive oil, 1 teasp salt,
1 pepper de-seeded and thinly sliced
2 teasp baking powder, 4 rashers streaky bacon (chopped)
50g butter (chopped), 5 spring onions (thinly sliced), 2 eggs
2 tbsp tomato ketchup mixed with 2 tbsp tomato puree
3 tbsp milk, 6 - 8 cherry tomatoes (halved), 85g grated cheddar

#### Method

Heat the oven to 200/200°C fan/gas 7. Mix the flour, salt, baking powder and butter together in a bowl and mix to form breadcrumbs. Mix the eggs and the milk together, then stir into the dry ingredients to make a soft dough. Shape into a round on a lightly floured surface, lift onto a non-stick baking tray, press out into a circle about 24cm across to make the pizza base.

Heat the oil in a frying pan, stir-fry the peppers and the bacon until the pepper is soft. Take off the heat, stir in the spring onions.

Spread the ketchup over the pizza base, then evenly tip over the pepper and bacon mixture. Scatter over the tomatoes, followed by the cheese. Bake for 15 minutes till golden.

#### Baked dippy eggs

Who doesn't like a dippy egg?

Makes 4, preparation time 15 minutes. Cooking time 20 minutes.

#### Ingredients

1 large slice of ham, 8 spinach leaves, 8 cherry tomatoes, 4 eggs 1 matchbox-sized piece of cheddar (grated)

#### Method

Set the oven to 180/160°C fan/gas 4. Have 4 ramekins ready. Cut the ham and spinach into strips with scissors and place some in each ramekin.

Squash the cherry tomatoes into a bowl using your fingers. Spoon 2 tomatoes and some juice into each ramekin.

Break one egg into each of the ramekins, top with the grated cheese. Place the ramekins on a baking tray and bake for 15-18 minutes until the egg white has set. Serve with toasty soldiers.

### Banana and chocolate chip muffins.

Makes 12 - these disappear very quickly.

Ingredients:

100g softened butter, 1 teasp baking powder, 2 eggs, 3 tblsp milk 175g caster sugar, 2 very ripe bananas (mashed), 225g self raising flour, 50g chocolate chips, 50g dark chocolate

#### Method

Preheat the oven to 180/160°C fan/gas 4.

Line a 12 hole muffin tin with paper cases.

Put the butter, eggs, caster sugar, flour, baking powder, milk and bananas into a bowl and beat together until smooth. Mix in the chocolate chips.

Spoon the mixture into the paper cases and bake for 25 mins until golden brown and shrinking away from the cases. Set aside to cool.

Melt the chocolate for the icing and using a small piping bag or a teaspoon decorate the cakes in a zigzag pattern.

#### Rocky road cookies what's not to like??

Makes 14, preparation time 10 mins, cooking time 11 mins

#### Ingredients

125g butter (softened), 125g plain flour, 125g soft brown sugar,

1 tbsp cocoa powder, 1 egg (beaten), 1/2 tsp baking powder, 2 tbsp milk, 50g white chocolate chips, 50g milk chocolate chips, 25g mini marshmallows.

#### Method

Preheat the oven to 180/160°C fan/gas 4.

Line two baking sheets with baking paper.

Cream the butter and the sugar together in a bowl until fluffy. Beat in the egg and the milk. Using a metal spoon stir in the flour, cocoa powder, baking powder and half of the white and milk chocolate chips.

Place dessert spoons full of the mixture onto the baking sheets, spacing them well apart, flatten slightly and bake for 5 minutes.

Remove from the oven and quickly sprinkle over the remaining chocolate chips and the marshmallows (being careful of little fingers) press them down into the cookies.

Return to the oven for a further 5 - 6 minutes until slightly soft to the touch. Cool for 5 minutes then transfer to a wire rack to cool.
