In the last Whimple News, we announced that we would be changing the layout of the shop over the Easter weekend and I am pleased to say that this went very well and we have created extra space for customers to move around the shop with ease and not have the issue of the Post Office queue blocking access to the freezers and fridges.

On Easter Sunday, we closed access to the shop while equipment was being moved around and served customers at the door. Thanks to all of the Whimple residents for their patience during the change-over. The photo shows Sabrina and Sharon ready to serve customers at the door while Sabrina's partner James is in the background working out you push fully loaded fridges across the floor. Successfully, thank goodness.



We also installed new shelving which provides a better display of the products we have available and together with the changes to the lighting, brings a fresh, roomy and airy feel to the shop. Since Easter, we have had lots of compliments on the new layout.

The new layout also gives us a dedicated "Coffee Shop" at the front of the Stores overlooking the Square and the Church. We also have a new coffee machine. Do stop by for a coffee, tea or chocolate and cake.

We are listed as a stopping point on one of the Exeter Cycling Club's cycling routes and the photo (with their permission) shows one group that stopped by for a break on the early May holiday.



On a less positive note, the well publicised increases in grain, oil, fuel, import duties and taxation have affected our wholesale providers' costs which are then passed onto us. We have tried to remain competitive with our pricing but obviously cannot beat the major supermarket chains who have better buying power. The cost of living crisis seems to have also affected the amount of customers coming through our doors. As we are a vital community facility that needs to remain in place as long as possible, we would like to encourage Whimple residents to think of the Stores wherever possible for convenience items, fresh bread, veg, bacon, sausages etc, or to stop by for a coffee or cake. We also plan to have only one person serving at both the Post Office and Retail counters for most of the day. If a queue forms, please be patient with the Team member serving and they will deal with the queue as quickly as possible.

Finally, it goes without saying, that although we stock a comprehensive range of products, if we are not stocking the items that you regularly need, please do let us know.



There has been a lot of recent activity to report.

We have now been advised by the owner of the pub that he has appointed a specialist agent to deal with the sale of The New Fountain and he has also approved a meeting between said agent and some of our group in order to discuss options for a community purchase. This is an encouraging step.

He does want to sell the building as a pub. (A meeting has now been arranged.) At the time of writing the NF is not listed for sale on the open market, but we are mindful that this could change at any time.

Our priority the internal inspection with the agent at the end of May. This will help us to appraise the approximate cost of repair, refurbishment and preparation the building and it's infrastructure will need to be fully operational once more. These costs will then need to be factored into the overall funding required to acquire and restock the pub. Obviously, viability considerations must be calculated, too, and how best to overcome any issues.

We will then be in a position to decide on the best financing options, involving all sources so far investigated - community share subscription, mortgage, grants etc.

If the community purchase is to be successful the support of the whole village will be crucial. An example of how everyone can get involved and help, is the recent community purchase of the King's Arms in Stockland: https://scpl.org.uk/. This pub had also closed, was revived by the community, and is running successfully with a very proactive tenant in charge, but there are many different options available to us.

We would very much welcome any input you may have to help us make the next steps in this process, and onwards, to successfully return the pub to Whimple.

(Also, should anyone reading this be interested in purchasing the pub, or taking a large share, the purchase price given is £350,000.)

## WHIMPLE CHURCH

#### Use it or lose it.

Hello my friends,

Across villages in the last decades small family owned shops have closed and pubs have gone out of business, small village schools have shut and clubs and societies dwindled, one by one the things which made a place where people live feel like a community rather than just a dormitory disappear; as it slowly happens folks often remark how sad it seems but so often do not realise how truly bad this is, until it is too late. No vicar wants to be the priest in charge of a parish when it's church shuts, but sadly the decline in attendance and support of many of our rural parish churches, which has been accelerated by COVID, is pushing many to the brink of a crisis. Many of you now know that at Broadclyst, the largest church in our mission community of 10 churches, we will probably have insufficient money to keep going by the end of this year and will have to face closing it, as we write a desperate effort is underway to try and save this amazing church for future generations.

Since I became the rector of the enlarged mission community of eight parishes, I have warned several times that there is a real possibility this is going to happen at some of our churches, I have explained about the shortfall in finances, the scarcity of people willing to help look after the churches, I have tried to dispel the myth that local churches will always be there because some large central church organisation funds them by explaining everything about your local churches is paid for by those who use them and that they also pay into the diocese, large sums, which cover clergy wages, the cost of the maintenance of clergy housing plus the cost of the all the backroom staff who keep the Diocese running and that most of these costs simply cannot be cut any further than they have. Whimple church needs to raise in the region of fifty thousand pounds every year to stay open. Sadly, I feel my warnings have largely fell on deaf ears, folks simply cannot or will not believe a large church, or maybe any parish church could just shut.

It now seems a real possibility that Broadclyst might be the test case of what happens when none of those issues can be resolved, but many other parishes across Devon and elsewhere may well be headed in the same direction.

At Broadclyst the church council has made serious efforts to trim its budget to the bone, including cutting back on routine maintenance and even stopping paying all of its annual fees to the Diocese (which cannot be continued in the longer term as without churches paying these the Diocese cannot continue to employ priests), but it can only cut so much and for the last four years it has effectively been running on its reserves which, as of this year, will be gone; plans are in place for several fundraising events later this year which might help forestall a crisis until next year but

longer term they are simply a sticking plaster.

We are currently taking advice from the Diocese but if the church simply runs out of money it shuts, it will not be able to pay its electricity, gas or annual insurance and therefore closes for routine church services. Longer term we are unsure what this will mean for the future of the building. As you are probably aware some churches, such as the chapel at Westwood, when closed are sold, others are leased out to individuals for other uses. If Broadclyst church closes the Diocese will obviously need decide how to proceed with its future use as it takes over the care of the building.

Now you may be thinking: who cares? And if that is your opinion you are obviously entitled to it, but it will be sad day that when in a few years' time a beautiful old building which was part of the character the village, home to life events for thousands and a quiet place of sanctuary for anyone who needs it, is gone, and will never return; when your loved ones wedding or funeral cannot happen there and when Christmas or Easter services stop and part of the traditional magic of those seasons are missing and the bells stop ringing on a Sunday morning.

Like many you may say: well the Church of England has billions in reserves why don't they help out? Good question, but the Church of England is not like a business with a central administrative body, it is an association of Diocese, each of which is financially independent and within those diocese each parish church is also independent, plus the Church as a whole also has massive financial commitments, it is the second largest provider of education in the country for instance and has its own financial worries at the moment, so as lovely as that idea might be it is not going to happen.

Or, hopefully, you might say: what can I do to help? Well, there is the obvious simple answer for Broadclyst is, we need folks to consider providing financial support, every monthly contribution, no matter how small helps. If 150 people signed up to give just £10 per month each, this beautiful old church could be saved! This is even better if it is given through the parish giving scheme which allows us to claim what is called Gift Aid, effectively claiming the tax back from the government, this boosts every donation by a taxpayer by 25%; but actually, there are many ways to support a parish church from helping lock and unlock so it is available as a quiet space for folks, to helping with fundraising events.

And finally, I am telling you all this not to frighten folks, although for those of us who love their parish church it is an alarming prospect, not to guilt trip people into contributing, but because the parish church is just that: the church which belongs to the parish. Every parish church belongs to the community and their children. Vicars come and go and even the church council are really only stewards of this place, it 'belongs' to everyone. Church councils have traditionally done an amazing job of keeping rural churches going, many have served for years, some for decades, they have faithfully worked countless hours to cherish places they feel have value to their community, without them many churches would have shut years ago, but they can no longer do it on their own. It is time for the parishes to take ownership of their churches or risk losing it forever.

#### Continued

More broadly, Bishop Robert recently explained our churches are entering a new phase in their history: Use it or lose it! Well, it is certainly help support it or lose it. No longer can your church, whichever of our parishes you live in, continue to be provided by the efforts of a small group of people, it will take a parish to keep them thriving, please do consider how you might help.

### A Window on Whimple's Weather - March/April 2022

Welcome to the next summary tracking the ups and downs of Whimple's wonderful weather!

Data is aggregated from Slewton Crescent and Cobden Lane, and live streamed onto the internet:

March – After an exceptionally windy February, March turned out wet, with more rain than January and February put together, but it was also about 30% sunnier than average. The first half of the month was changeable with near average temperatures and rain at times, while fine weather arrived from the 17th. The wettest period was between 11th and 13th March as two active cold fronts crossed the country from the southwest. There was over 18mm on the 11th alone while strongest winds were the following day. Pressure then grew strongly over the next week as an anticyclone developed over the UK, with almost unbroken sunshine between the 17th and 27th. There were 10 days with no rain at all, and springtime temperatures climbed to 19.9°C by the 26th. 3 dull and wet days followed by a cold day to end the month at only 8.6°C as a cold north-easterly developed.

**April** – After 3 frosty nights at the start of the month, temperatures slowly and erratically climbed to reach a high point of 19.6°C on the 21st. Meanwhile there was a brief unsettled spell between the 6th and 8th, with some brisk westerly winds and heavy rain in the early hours of the 7th, but then the weather improved in time for the Easter weekend a week later. Saturday was the best day reaching 18.4°C in sunny skies. Then apart from a little rain on the 19th and 24th, the rest of the month was dry – resulting in a month with unusually low rainfall, around only 22mm. With a predominance of high pressure especially in the final week, sunshine was well above average for the month.



It is understood that four families in our village have offered to take families from Ukraine. The war is morphing into a long conflict of barbarous intensity by order of Vladimir Putin, plus there is evidence of war crimes against the people of Ukraine.

A small touch of joy was Ukraine winning the European Song Contest, which clearly illustrated the culture and artistry of this sovereign state. GB did well in coming second – a historic and enjoyable achievement. Keep the Yellow and Blue alive in Whimple to show our continued solidarity.

### Cranbrook Development Plan

In early May, East Devon District Council (EDDC) announced funding of up to £5.5million 'for the acquisition' of town centre land in Cranbrook, as well as approving three planning applications for a supermarket, high street shops with apartments above, a town square and a children's day nursery.

In theory, work on the supermarket and nursery is due to be completed by summer 2023, followed 'soon after' by the high street shops, apartments and town square. However, the vague term 'soon after' could be much later, as the superstore will take up most of the retailing activities in the Town Centre. It is certainly not the best example of Town Centre Planning and it has taken over 10 years to get this far.

The latest information available on the Cranbrook Master Plan, as per EDDC Website is that the Plan is still in the examination process and that the Inspectors report is expected in the summer. Any recommendations made by the Inspector may include modifications to the Plan, if such a request is made by the Council.

### Whimple - Planning Application for Solar Farm

An application has been submitted (validated on the 9th May 2022), for Land east of Rutton Farm, Rull Lane, Whimple EX5 2NX. The proposal is for the Construction and operation of a ground mounted solar farm, with permission being required for 40 years, comprising solar arrays, equipment housing, sub-station, fencing, ancillary equipment, landscaping and associated development. POW+R Group is likely to oppose this is an inappropriate use of good quality agricultural land (subject to our June meeting). However, in the right location we would support this type of renewable energy. There are also questions regarding the fitness of the potential ownership of the electrical generating Solar Farm. What is needed is an evaluation by the East Devon District to determine suitable sites that don't eradicate good productive agricultural land in the preparation of the latest 'LOCAL PLAN'. N.B. Planning Application Ref: 22/0783/MFUL

### Neighbourhood Plan

The Parish Council and POW+R Group would like to publically thank all the villagers who submitted their feedback on the neighbourhood plan; via hard copies and on-line. The latest total is 140 and 43 respectively— which is a great response.

The next phase is now complete, which is the mailing to Whimple businesses, national and regional organisations, local groups and our neighbouring parishes, plus Government bodies. There will be two collection boxes, one at the Thirsty Farmer and the other at the Whimple Stores for late responses and in respect of the local businesses and social / sporting groups, in this phase.

The NP Team has started to collate, analyse and evaluate the information, to ensure it reflects the general views of the village and participants' comments, as well as integrating with the policies of the National Planning Framework and the District's local strategy. We are on track for the first draft of the Neighbourhood Plan by the autumn this year. Please feel free to add any additional ideas and thoughts that you may have. It's your plan and our village's future.

If you want to be part of the process to 'Protect our Whimple and Rockbeare' we'd love to hear from you! The Neighbourhood Plan will be achieved by: Ambition, determination, cooperation and you.







### Devon countryside campaigners lambast Government's new energy strategy

The Devon branch of the countryside charity (Devon CPRE) has criticised the Government's new energy strategy, saying Boris Johnson's emphasis on 'renewables' will not deliver an affordable, clean and secure supply of electricity as people are being led to believe.

Instead, Devon CPRE believes enhanced carbon capture from regenerative agriculture, the only proven method for carbon capture and storage, is a critical factor in the equation and the charity is disappointed that it's not been mentioned in the strategy unveiled yesterday. Experts estimate this could sequester our excess carbon emissions within 15-20 years.

The charity's energy spokesman, Dr Phillip Bratby says: "Producing food and capturing carbon is what Devon's farmland can do and should be doing to help meet our carbon targets – not slowly degrading under hundreds of decaying wind turbines and hundreds of thousands of toxic solar panels, not to mention the huge explosive batteries they need to be even remotely effective."

The Government claims its energy plans will reduce electricity bills, make the UK more self-sufficient and less reliant on imports. Devon CPRE says the Ukraine crisis has highlighted the UK's foolishness in relying so heavily on imports from Russia, and the new strategy will perpetuate our dependence on global supply chains and superpowers. China manufactures most of the world's supply of solar panels, wind turbines and batteries and controls most of the exotic materials needed to make them.

Dr Bratby continues "The public is being hoodwinked into thinking that onshore wind farms are one of the fastest and greenest ways to get so-called 'free' power. Neither wind farms, nor solar farms provide this - they provide very expensive power - and the more we build, the more the price of our electricity will go up. Devon CPRE fought the construction of wind turbines for over ten years and we know rural communities don't want them. We also don't want more of these huge solar developments that are gobbling up our farmland.

"The government's proposed energy security strategy appears to have been dreamt up by Whitehall civil servants who have little knowledge of engineering or of life in the real world outside their Westminster bubble. We are not against solar panels in the right locations, such as on roofs, provided they are not Chinese-made - using slave labour. We welcome the proposals not to change current planning regulations for onshore wind. However, apart from this, the strategy is a complete failure. It will not deliver its stated aims, namely, an affordable, clean and secure supply of energy. Very importantly, for a strategy which involves massive expenditure of taxpayers' money, there has been no risk assessment of what is proposed."

Devon CPRE Director Penny Mills adds, "It's not just the Government who are failing to grasp what's needed. It's difficult to get the message across to politicians of all persuasions. Opposition parties are scrambling around trying to think of something to say and are spouting forth about increasing onshore wind turbines and insulation.

Across the country, tens of thousands of new homes are being built to maximise profit for the developers. If the housebuilders reduced their profit by constructing to a higher specification, including decent energy efficiency, it would have benefits all round."

Devon CPRE says it's time the Government introduced a sensible, pragmatic and strategic energy policy, one that prioritises the use of farmland for growing food.

We are sorry to hear of the difficulty many of our patients have been experiencing in gaining access to Coleridge Medical Centre. Whether it be GP appointments or telephone calls to our reception team, this is certainly not the service we aim to offer, but we, like many other practices in the UK, are struggling to meet the current level of demand for our services. Each day, we continue to do our best to deliver as many appointments as it is safe to but ultimately, we do not have unlimited resources and we are currently working to maximum capacity.

'At Your Service' published by the Policy Exchange and forwarded by Health Secretary Sajid Javid, states that 28 patient contacts per day is the expected requirement. Patient contact can be direct or indirect and can be classified as a face-to-face appointment, a telephone appointment, or an online query (such as eConsult). Our GPs regularly have more than double the recommended patient contacts per day but, unfortunately, it is still not enough to meet demand. This is a National level problem that cannot be resolved at individual Practice level.

As with many other GP surgeries throughout the country, the practice has also experienced significant amounts of staff absence for a number of reasons. As a Practice we have 15 GPs and two Nurse Practitioners, of whom we have had one GP recently off for two months due to a major illness, another GP off with a long-term illness, one on maternity leave, another on sabbatical, and approximately 6-8 weeks of clinical time lost during March and April due to COVID-19 within our team. Even though we currently have a long-term locum GP assisting the Practice, we are unable to gain anymore locum cover.

Unfortunately, we cannot provide unlimited appointments as this would be unsafe and it would compromise the service and care you receive. Once our appointments are fully booked, we are unable to create more.

Some of the challenges we face as a GP surgery:

- A large number of appointments being requested for minor ailments that usually run their course, such as sore throats, coughs, colds. These conditions would previously have been managed at home without GP input, and better dealt with at a community pharmacy.
- We can now be contacted in more ways, but the number of GPs, and GP appointments on offer, has not increased.
- The scope for more complex disease management has increased, and a large portion of the care of these conditions has moved from Secondary Care to Primary Care.
- Pressures for appointments in hospitals and other services mean GPs continue to care for these patients while they wait for their appointment elsewhere in the system.

Some of the improvements we are making:

- We have been increasing the size of our team by recruiting more GPs, nurses, admin staff and working more collaboratively with our Primary Care Network.
- We have more phone lines to cope with the number of incoming calls we receive.
- We have introduced a new automated telephone system so that patients can book, cancel or check the details of an appointment 24/7.
- For any urgent on-the-day needs, our medical administrator team are more than happy to assist.
- We are changing our appointments so that there will be more routine appointments availabile for non-urgent needs. This process can take some time as we work through appointments already booked as the demand for on-the-day consultations continue to be very high.

There are other options you can access to get the support you need when you need it. These include:

- NHS 111 service for when you urgently need medical help / advice, but it is not a life-threatening situation
- The NHS App
- Community pharmacies

As always, for immediate or life-threatening emergencies, please call 999.

We wish we were able to tell you that we are able to take the necessary action to rectify the situation but we can only guarantee that the staff and doctors at the Practice will continue to work as hard as they can to the deliver the best service they can within the limitation of the resources they have at their disposal. Whilst we fully understand the frustrations a few have with our service, we are also humbled and grateful for the many messages and letters of support and gratitude we continue to receive.
