Order sheets are now in store if you want to order your Christmas fruit, veg, milk, etc. Pop in Christmas Eve and everything will be ready for you and you can join us for a mulled wine and mince pie.

We can get hold of a wide range of provisions so feel free to ask if we can get something particular in.

We have new pies and pasties from Moores in Exmouth which are proving popular and we can get cocktail pasties but will only order these in if requested.

We will still stock Chunk pies and pasties and can order in larger pies.

We will also have some gift packs from Courtneys cider and Exe gin and Black Cat rum.

Post Office

Christmas delivery time leaflets are available in store. Some deadlines for overseas parcels have already passed so please come in and ask advice.

For general mail the last day for posting 2nd class mail will be Weds 18th December and for 1st class mail Friday 20th December.

We are always happy to give advice on postage prices and services. Generally, a small parcel should measure not larger than $45\,\mathrm{cm} \times 35\,\mathrm{cm} \times 16\,\mathrm{cm}$. If it is under 2kg this parcel size can cost as little as £3.00 for second-class postage. If your parcel weighs more than 2kg then the price jumps up considerably and sometimes it is better value to split a parcel. If you are unsure bring your package in unsealed and check before you send.

Don't forget to be careful sending batteries, perfumes, or alcohol. We will be happy to give advice on this and restrictions with overseas parcels.

Banking services can be accessed for the majority of High Street Banks,

including Barclays. If you are unsure if your bank is supported at the Post Office, please come with your card and we can check for you.

Don't forget that the Post Office is not open on Weds 25th, Thurs 26th December and 1st January, so please remember to get any cash requirements prior to these closures.



Speed Watch





I have been in touch with our local police (several times) and the lead member of the community speed watch team (CSW) in West Hill for advice. The West Hill leader was very helpful and would be willing to talk to us about how they run their CSW, unfortunately I was not so lucky with the police. The local community police officer is organising a Cranbrook speed watch team at present and therefore we will have to wait.

I am presently investigating the possibility of a moveable flashing speed sign so that we could alternate it between the three roads that lead into the heart of the village. As you can imagine none of this is straight forward and perseverance is the key, I shall continue to persevere.

Just a reminder, <u>PLEASE KEEP SPEEDS DOWN</u>, and if you're out and about in the dark, please wear some reflective clothing, it could safeguard you, your children and the dog.

East Devon District Council (EDDC) have developed an app to work with the Alexa echo. The app lets you ask Alexa all sorts of questions regarding waste and recycling and I have tried it myself so I know it works.

You can find some example questions and how to set it up on the EDDC website under Waste and Recycling (I got the team to move it to the top of the page to make it easier to find).

Considering the desperate need for recycling and particularly waste reduction, some may find this useful and of course some, like me, may find it novel.

There is always some pressure on the rural environment that affects our way of life, like a bad harvest, lack of skilled workforce, floods, loss of public services and amenities to village and rural communities. There is one threat that is very apparent and it is just over the horizon. The growth of Cranbrook is not what was originally proposed:— a Garden New Town with high quality design and with strong eco credentials, but what has occurred? Now East Devon District Council wants to extend Cranbrook eastwards with their Cranbrook Master Plan.

Nearly 500 villagers submitted their comments in what was a considerable response, indicating a significant concern about the developments.

For clarification, our group supports new decent housing developments within a sustainable framework, carefully considered infrastructure that also protects our environment. It is the process; the developer led, profit seeking house builders, the district council that need to be challenged.

Our group is acutely aware of the 'Localism Act 2011' which is an Act of Parliament that changes the powers of local government in England and came into effect in April 2012. This is a major change in the democratic process that affects every single parish in the land. It is relevant to us all as it is a law that facilitates the devolution of decision-making powers from central government control to individuals and communities.

According to The Department for Communities and Local Government "local communities should have genuine opportunities to influence the future of the places where they live. Neighbourhood planning will allow communities, both residents, employees and business, to come together through a local parish council or neighbourhood forum and say where they think new houses, businesses and shops should go – and what they should look like. These plans can be very simple and concise, or go into considerable detail".

It will affect the way our corner of Devon is developed now and in the future. It is a very important document.

It is disappointing that the Whimple Parish Council 'ceded' / relinquished a large number of acres to Cranbrook Town Council. This land has augmented the land available to Cranbrook to develop eastwards up to Cobden Lane and in the case of a Travellers and Gypsy Site, over the boundary into Whimple Parish.

Rockbeare now has a 'signed and sealed' **Neighbourhood plan**, which in accordance with the legislation protects the Parish from the expansion of Cranbrook. It certainly has made a difference to how Rockbeare Parish can effectively fight against major developments.

If only Whimple had a **Neighbourhood Plan** in place it would have shaped the future expansion of Cranbrook.

Now the big problem - the latest Cranbrook Plan submitted to the Government Inspector by East Devon District Council, is materially different from the plan which went out to consultation. This includes a new estate of houses within the boundary of Whimple Parish, plus a large Travellers/Gypsy site east of Cobden Lane up to Bodley Bridge. Clearly if this was known, then there could have been vigorous objections and castigation of EDDC and its councillors. Our argument includes, concern about, what appears to be, a hidden agenda. More transparency, more openness could have alleviated much of the distrust that we feel.

A survey of residents was undertaken by the Parish in February last year, but it appears no tangible results followed. The pace of creating the **Neighbourhood Plan** by our Parish Council is of great concern to many in the village, since the legislation was 'up and running' in 2012!!

The POW&R Group's key remit is:-

- 1. To protect our villages from inappropriate expansion of Cranbrook.
- 2. To work with all concerned to establish as a **matter of urgency**, a Neighbourhood Plan that is robust, realistic, time bound and legally binding.

The **Neighbourhood Plan** is ultimately the legal responsibility of the Parish Council, but can be conducted by a **Neighbourhood Forum.** We have continually indicated our Group's support in achieving this, but it would appear the Parish Council seems reticent to our proposals. As a group we want to protect our green space surrounding the village and create the right environment that meets the needs of the village for the long term. It may not be known that once the **Neighbourhood Plan** is in place, it will inform key decision making of Planning Applications and other processes in the village. In addition, there are Government Grants of up £17,000 to help the process along.

Let's set a target of one year from the first of December 2019 to get this sorted – it can be done if there is the will. It is your village, your community, your plan. "We can achieve more by working together than we achieve alone.

We welcome villagers to be part of our team, that helps deliver this plan.



WHIMPLE QI

Those of you who have visited the archives of the History Society will know what a source they are of fascinating information about this delightful village that we call home. Here are a few for you to enjoy:-

Various businesses in Whimple at one time included:-

The Mill (Station)

The Cycle Shop in the old shed at Sandfords

George Godfrey, Tailor in The Square

John Godfrey, Shoe Repairer in The Square

Reeds Shop in The Square - Mr Reed was known as 'Lippy' as when war broke out he had heaps of Lipton's Tea and made a small fortune.

Events which took place in Whimple at one time:-

Whimple Fair - held annually in The Square with stalls manned by locals and travellers and Maypole dancing by schoolchildren.

The Winter Carnival - went from Station Yard to Hand & Pen with an organ grinder and monkey; a horse-drawn wagon, open at the back, selling saucepans, tin-ware, gipsy clothes- pegs, shoe laces and lace. There were also French Onion men and a fortune teller.

Lady Hughes of Larkbeare was known as Lady Quick-Quick as she was always in a hurry.

Thackeray wrote 'Pendennis' whilst at Larkbeare Court. He sometimes stayed at Larkbeare House and on a bedroom window is believed to have inscribed the verse of the hymn 'Teach Me My God and King:- A man who look glass / Or through it may stay his eye / Or if he wish it through it pass / And so the heaven espy'.

When the Second World War was over, Whimple started a 'Welcome Home' fund for returning servicemen. Each one was given a tin of biscuits. These would have been an expensive luxury at that time.

For those of you who weren't in church yesterday please see the following announcement that was made at all the services in our Mission Community:

Announcement

Friends, I have an announcement that I need to make. It is with some sadness that I have to report that my time as the Vicar here is to come to a close at the end of January. Tina and I shall be moving on to pastures new and across the border into the Diocese of Salisbury. I am required to read to you the announcement that is being read out today in a group of churches called The Golden Cap Benefice in that Diocese.

"We are pleased to announce that the Bishop of Sherborne, on behalf of the Bishop of Salisbury, in conjunction with the Patrons, has appointed the Revd Chris Martin as Team Rector for the Golden Cap. Chris is currently the Vicar of the Churches 4All Mission Community, a group of four rural parishes in East Devon within the Diocese of Exeter. We believe Chris to be the right fit for us here and in the deanery and we are looking forward to welcoming him, his wife Tina, and pet Labrador Welly, sometime in the New Year and to a licensing towards Lent."

This has come about rather unexpectedly for us, but we do believe that God has placed us on this particular path and we are now choosing to follow where it leads. We are glad that as Revd Marc sees out the rest of his curacy here, he will be available to help the parishes begin the transition to whatever is next for them. It is not yet time for 'Goodbyes'. But please do pray for us at this time of change, as we shall be praying sincerely for you all.

I wanted to write an article about Chris for this edition as he has done so much for Whimple and the surrounding parishes and we met up to have that conversation. I was interested as to how he had made an application for this position, knowing nothing of the way the Church of England works and we had a lovely relaxed chat during the afternoon of my visit. Earlier in the year he had been on a sabbatical break and that had provided him with valuable thinking time about his future, and what was happening with his family circumstances as his daughter came to her final year of university, potentially leaving him and his wife, Tina, by themselves.

'Was it the time to move on?' was the question he was asking himself as he was aware of the Dorset vacancy. Initially he had no interest but he found that this opportunity kept coming up in conversations with his church colleagues. So he obtained more details of the Dorset opportunity, and spoke to the Archdeacon who would be his immediate 'boss'. He was aware of lots of threads appearing in his daily life about this position and that had to have some meaning. Chris told me that God had put his feet on this new path – now he had the choice of whether he followed it. He applied and was interviewed – and was offered the position. Currently Chris has four parishes – in this new job he will have 12! He is both excited and daunted by this prospect as it means he will have to look at working differently in the new church set up.

One of the things that he will take away from our parish is how he hopes that he has helped to develop the skills of valuable lay people who provide wonderful support to him. The old days of 'one parish, one vicar' will never return and the Church is learning how to recognise and deal with the new world of multiple parishes, and declining numbers of new vicars joining.

I asked Chris about particular highlights from his stay with us, and he mentioned the production of 'Godspell' in St Mary's Church that was directed by Tom Samson from Talaton. From that experience, Chris learned about trusting people and giving them the opportunity – and said that he was at the first night of this production and felt enormous pride at his, albeit, small role in its coming to Whimple with such a committed and motivated team of people. He also felt that the Alpha course that he set up in 2015 was another highlight – he advertised the course and was delighted to find that some 60 people from all four parishes expressed interest and it went on to be a very successful series of events. At the end, some people wanted to carry on and established their own groups to continue with discussions and support to each other. This theme of people taking responsibility and achieving much is another highlight for Chris – the Church has to operate in a different way in this 'new world' and if you can offer help to lay-people then they will rise to the occasion and delight you – and themselves! Several people have offered to lead services and that has certainly helped with the workload.

Chris is very aware that his stay here with us has been a 'two way street' in that he has worked with many people to develop their confidence and skills and will take these lessons to his new position. And Chris himself has learned from these experiences, and says that he has changed for the better, having been influenced by so many good people in this part of East Devon.

We thank Chris and Tina for all their work in the Churches4All Mission Community and wish them every success in their new home in Charmouth.

His last service will be on 26 January and he will be licensed for his new position on 24th February.
