

Whimple Stores

Many thanks to all of you who continue to support the shop and Post Office and who have encouraged our 'no bag' policy by bringing your own bags or by providing recycled ones.

Just a reminder that our policy is to charge 10p if you need a bag (of any size) or you can borrow one of our reusable bags or take a recycled one. It is worth mentioning that we may not always have recycled bags available so please don't rely on this option. This may become more of an issue when the high street supermarkets start to charge for bags as we expect to have less handed to us for reuse when this happens. As we have said in the past this is not an exercise for us to make money but an encouragement for us all to try to remember to bring reusable bags to save the waste that plastic bags create. We would particularly ask parents to remind their children about this as bags are often requested for small items which don't really need a bag or for numerous bags every time they pop in or for every child in a group.

As well as press coverage about bags and waste there has been the issue of paying our farmers a fair price for their produce. We are very pleased to sell Ashclyst milk, cream and yoghurts. Ashclyst Farm is about three miles from Whimple and Martin and Lorraine are lovely people who have worked very hard to produce a quality product. Obviously they have the costs of processing their produce but we deal directly with them and pay them roughly three times as much as the supermarkets pay their producers. For this we get a delicious, local, organic product for the same price as we pay for the processed milk that comes through other parties before it gets to us. Ashclyst milk looks creamier than other milks, but this is due to it not being homogenised or only partly homogenised. This heat process disperses the fat and gives the milk a texture that doesn't require shaking and a better shelf life. Some argue that homogenising interferes with the natural attributes of milk so there are pros and cons.

We also stock a good range of Chunk pasties, made in Ottery St. Mary and even the pasties from Dartmoor Farmers are made by Chunk using their own beef and lamb. Dartmoor Farmers are a co-operative supporting Dartmoor beef and lamb producers to produce a quality, well cared-for animal. We stock a small selection of their products, but we can order in joints and other products. Please order on a Friday for delivery the next Tuesday.

Please don't forget that to minimise waste in your home, feel free to buy small amounts of fruit and veg on a daily basis. Again we can order specific things in on request.

Post Office

Hopefully by the time this goes to print, there will be a new Post Box in the village Square next to the telephone box.

There have been problems in August with postal services and in particular the deliveries. Royal Mail have blamed this on staff sickness in peak holiday times. The delivery men and women who have made it to our village have often been working overtime after their normal rounds, so please be kind to them. It is worth mentioning that post and the delivery services are run by Royal Mail which is separate from the Post Office, and now there is no sorting office in the village we have very little input in deliveries, other than to store undelivered parcels.

As we approach the Christmas period, we expect to get busier and peak times still seem to be between 4.30 and 5.00pm. This is the time that we have to get the day's banking and post ready for collection and we may have to close the Post Office to customers whilst we do this. We only have one terminal to work from and the Post collection staff have to leave on time to be able to make their next stop, so we need to treat them as our priority. If you have anything that must go that day, please try to get it to us before 4.30pm to avoid any delays.

That leaves us to remind you of the last posting dates for Christmas:

1st Class UK - 21st December

Dear All.

I finally did as I was bid and finding my best tie I braved the camera lens and had a new photo taken by Sue Draycott. After hours with the airbrush she finally admitted defeat and here you have it. Me in all my glory. I hope all that have told me to do this will recognise me in daylight at least. I am told that I look years younger !!!! Delighted that I struck a chord with my last report and I



am pleased that many of you have responded and are considering volunteering to help with the Parish Neighbourhood Plan. This comes in a week when I understand that East Devon have made claim to an Enterprise Zone that will encompass the growth point East of Exeter and has the potential to benefit the area considerably. It has been suggested that the reductions in business rates and the investment that comes with such decisions will add millions to the district economy. Good News – but a lot of work to be done to make it successful. If you want to keep up to date with timely guidance notes the link is:

I hear that Cranbrook station will open in December. After so many delays I hope the wait will be worth it but I still believe that Feniton and Whimple have not been well served. Please support Roger Algate and co. in the continuing campaign to improve the timetable for our benefit. Recent decisions to re-let the franchise to SWTrains from 2017 will help to improve an under-used and under-invested service. The recent Peninsular Rail Task Group noted that passenger growth exceeded forecasts and had reached 123% over the past 11 years. In 2012 patronage had already exceeded industry forecasts for 2019. This despite rolling stock that dates back to the 1980's!!

In County Hall we continue to change the way we work to meet the challenges of reducing budgets and higher costs. In mid-year we were looking after almost 700 children in care. These numbers have reduced but my work with the Foster Panel shows no signs of slowing down and our concerns for refugees and others displaced by war are undiminished. There is much to be done.

STEPHEN G. HARDCASTLE



Stephen is the son of Ian and Anne Hardcastle from the village, and some weeks ago, Ian had sent me a copy of a prestigious award that had been made to Stephen, (with the pride that all parents would have) who now lives and works in Canada.

Stephen, who will be 58 later this year, went to school in Whimple and to King's in Ottery. He went on to Nottingham University in the late 70's and studied for a mining degree with Dr Malcolm McPherson and became very interested in the specialist subject of mine ventilation. He spent two summers working for the National Coal Board in the South Midlands and his last 'placement' was in Australia. Having gained his degree he then studied for a PhD in mine ventilation, working again with Dr McPherson. This was funded by the European Coal and Steel Community and Stephen published a number of technical papers on mine ventilation, and he started to make a name for himself in this field.

His next job was in Canada working for CANMET (Canadian Metals) Mining Research Laboratory at Elliot Lake and this was as a government employee. His research in controlled recirculation meant that the mining industry understood what it had to do to reduce heating costs, which was important to their balance sheets. In 1993 Stephen transferred to Sudbury, Ontario, becoming recognised as a leader in his field and this resulted in him being promoted to Senior Research Scientist in 1997 and then Ventilation Specialist in 2004.

Stephen has become world renowned for his mining ventilation expertise, and has produced over a hundred publications on related subjects. He presented several keynote addresses for international symposia. In June this year this led to David Loring, Chief Mine Engineer of Henderson Operations, presenting him with the Hartman Award for his contribution to this specialist technical area at the 15th North American Mine Ventilation Symposium.



Consultation on the new Franchise for Waterloo-Honiton-Exeter Railway.

Have your say...

In WN March 2013 I wrote...

"It is clear to me that the next four years are crucial for us if we want a better service. In those four years we need to describe what a better service looks like; get everyone to agree; deliver a unified front to government so that the DfT creates a Franchise Document that reflects our needs."

The government will begin its three month consultation before the end of December, or possibly November, so we need to be ready if you want to chip in. Governments seem to like consulting in winter and across Christmas, from Caesar Augustus to the present day!

The Parish Council will revisit and endorse the Parish Plan as it relates to rail, and add any useful detail thrown up by the Neighbourhood Plan process as it unfolds. Doubtless the County Council will champion its Metro vision, which includes Whimple and ultimately a half-hour calling pattern across Exeter. But what will turn you towards using the train from Whimple; or how can the train provide you with a more convenient way to get to school, work, shopping or the airport etc?

Ever since the timetable collapsed we have wanted a better, more frequent service to and from Whimple and the adjacent stations. Everybody knows that: the train operator (SWT), Network Rail, the three MPs, the County and District Council, and most of you. But until we can get that adopted by Government and enshrined in the basic Franchise Document we shall get nowhere. So our time is now, to push for that better service; but we do need to articulate clearly what that is - specifically. To that end WRUG will act as a forum to receive opinion. Dates for a meeting will be published in due course,

and the PO-shop has agreed to keep a box to collect your written responses (if you prefer); or you can email me (roger.algate@gmail.com).



A CONVERSATION WITH RICHARD DAVIES

Richard and Gail moved to Whimple in 2009 when they bought Sandfords, after the death of dear Mrs Pratt. The estate agent warned them that it was 'a project' and they certainly realised that when they spent their first year in the village living in a caravan in the garden as the Sandfords renovation was planned, and all the necessary planning consents obtained. You have to remember that Sandfords had not had any major work for some 50 years! For example, the kitchen floorboards, the joists and bricks on which they rested, were past it, so Richard and Gail found themselves gazing at bare earth before they replaced the floor. They are now established in the house, with a small number of tasks still outstanding, but they have achieved much of their 'To Do' list.

Richard and Gail had come across Whimple when they were house hunting in Devon, having lived and worked in London for 30 years. They both wanted to live in the country, and had friends in Devon. After a seeing some attractive but isolated properties, they felt that their original target of living 'out in the Styx' was not for them. They wanted a village where there were some amenities and the opportunity to shut the front door and walk easily into the countryside. Richard had two sets of house details when they visited – one for the shop and one for Sandfords. They loved Sandfords when they first explored the outside and, despite the enormous renovation challenge for them, made an offer which was accepted. Whimple ticked all their boxes for amenities and access to the countryside. They found a reputable builder of historic buildings... and so the adventure started! When there was somewhere to cook, shower and sleep they moved into the house in November 2010. Richard and Gail continued to work in London for two days a week, staying in a small flat attached to his practice rooms, and finally made the big move down to Devon, full time, in 2012

Richard originally comes from Swansea, moving to Maidenhead with his family in his teens. After gaining a degree in Physics he went to teach in Trinidad under the auspices of VSO. There followed a short time with Kodak and then an MA in social work at Canterbury before joining the probation service. He then trained in psychoanalysis working in a specialist clinic in the NHS for 30 years, latterly as its director, while also maintaining a private practice. During this time he played in an 'ageing hippy rock band' as a bit of light relief from NHS inspections and regulations. He currently has a private practice three days a week in Exeter.

Once they had moved 'properly' into the village, both Richard and Gail wanted to get involved, so they initially joined the History Society (who introduced them to Peter Hunt who has researched most of the older buildings in Whimple, and was able to provide them with a lot of Sandfords history), plus they joined the VPA and visited Soup and Sarnie. They ate in the New Fountain and Paul Mallett did his usual excellent landlord 'taking care of the new people' – just as he had done with so many others and making them feel welcomed.

Richard got involved with the Front Row Club in 2011 when Rob Davis advertised in the Whimple News for interested people to join him in a new venture, a film club for the village.

Rob, Richard and Gail and later Alan Smith formed the FRC team navigating the perilous waters of legislation, sound systems, and film hire contacts, until we have an organisation that not only provides good value popular films, with a 'Bring Your Own' drink policy, and with tasty nibbles provided, but live music and the chance to see opera! Richard is the one in charge of the sound deck and the bottle of red wine! He has also been sucked into the mysterious world of the panto where he has, with Rob, provided a filming and editing service for the Whimpletons which is greatly appreciated.

They both have other distractions – Gail works as an Adoption Social Worker and is involved with horse riding, and helping with Riding for the Disabled, tennis and gardening. Richard has interests in sailing and music (viola and guitar) – beware the Christmas carols in the Square!





Advice from Vale Vets on neutering your pet

Neutering is a general term used to describe an operation that stops your pet from breeding. This involves the removal of the uterus and ovaries in females (also called spaying), and the testicles in males (also called castration). The operation is performed by a Veterinary Surgeon while the pet is under general anaesthesia.

Dogs - Females; Bitches are spayed either before their first season or after their first season, which they normally have aged between six and twelve months. We recommend that you speak to a vet or nurse to decide when is the most appropriate time to spay your bitch. Bitches are usually in season every six months. If waiting until after the first season it is preferable to operate three months after she finishes her season.

Males; Dogs can be castrated from six months old.

Cats - Females and males; Cats can be neutered from four months old.

Neutering can prevent many problems,

- Pyometra in bitches. This is a potentially fatal condition where pus accumulates within the uterus.
- Mammary or Testicular tumours.
- Un-castrated or entire dogs can often get diseases of the prostate in later life or tumours of the anal tissue (anal adenomas).
- False pregnancy.
- Pets wandering or straying.
- Unwanted litters.
- It may be helpful in some cases of dominance and aggression problems.
- Urine spraying in tom cats.

Risks associated with neutering;

- Occasionally incontinence can occur in some breeds of bitch.
- Some breeds the coat can change texture.

These risks can be discussed with your vet.

Other useful information

We recommend treatment for lungworm a week before any surgery. This is because lungworm can cause unexplained bleeding.

Weight gain is very common after neutering due to the reduced amount of energy needed by your pet. A special diet or current diet reduced by 30% is recommended

In some dogs and cats one or both testicles fail to descend into the scrotum. This condition is referred to as retained testicles. It thought to be hereditary and it is therefore not advisable to breed from them. Retained testicles can become cancerous, and often go un-noticed until the condition is well advanced and often involving other internal organs within the abdomen. We therefore recommend that all dogs and cats that have retained testicles be castrated.

Ask your vet or vet nurse for information about neutering your pet.
