Whimple Post Office News

Royal Mail have announced price changes from 31st March:-

First class stamps have gone up by 2p and now cost 62p.

Second class stamps have gone up by 3p and now cost 53p.

If you purchased stamps before 31st March you can still use them. Any stamp that has 1st or 2nd class on them can be used regardless of when you purchased them, or how much you paid for them at the time.

Small parcels under 1kg will go up by 20p. However, small parcels over 1kg will actually be going down by £1.40. So e-bayers please be sure to quote the new prices by picking up a leaflet, or asking us how these changes will affect you.



March District Councillor's Report

Yet more on the railway saga

The other week I struck up a conversation with a First Great Western train driver on Whimple station. He told me that there is



It is exiting also to hear the talk of reopening the line from Oakhampton around the north of Dartmoor down to Plymouth. If we remember that on the Dawlish Warren line it has been a constant struggle to keep open for 150 years with storms breaching the line and cliff falls regularly cutting it. It has been an expensive headache for the company to keep it open. Indeed, in steam days waves would flood the fireboxes of the locos and bring them to a halt as well. When both lines were open the drivers of both companies had to regularly work each other's lines to be familiar with the route in case either was incapacitated – a very sensible arrangement.

An important day for E.D.D.C.

A first for the Council has been the presentation to the Cabinet meeting on the 5th of March of the Lympstone Neighbourhood plan. This is the first neighbourhood plan of the dozen or so in preparation that that has been completed. The District Council is required to consult formally on the plan for six weeks before appointing an independent examiner to consider the soundness of the plan and any representations on it. Well done Lympstone and good luck in their final examination

At the same meeting an application to designate Clyst Honiton as a neighbourhood area was made. If this is approved then Clyst Honiton may make a formal application to produce a neighbourhood plan setting out how the local community would like to see the village develop. In reality, they will have to settle for a much reduced designated area as so much of the parish has been engulfed by the airport, SkyPark, the intermodal interchange and the Airport Business Park.

The New Council Offices.

So, it's official – at the last full council meeting E.D.D.C. announced the selection of SkyPark as the choice for the location of the new council offices. This is despite the fact that it is right at the Exeter end of the District which rather contradicts their declared aim to place the new offices more centrally and more accessibly in the centre of the district. In fact, this principle was taken up by a number of councillors (including myself) who put forward a motion for the council to re-examine the idea of looking more closely at the option of staying at the Knowle and spending the borrowed £5 million that it is estimated is needed to build the Skypark premises to refurbish the Knowle. This intention to borrow for SkyPark is another broken promise as we were all assured that the move would be cost neutral. This motion produced some very lively debate but the motion was lost –so-SkyPark it is.

Afterwards in conversation with fellow councillors it became apparent that the new location will be as awkward to get to as Sidmouth and will affect more councillors and this will be equally true of members of the public. I wonder how far the decision was influenced by the council's commitment to placing new jobs and growth in the Growth Point area.

The East Devon Public Health Plan 2014-2017.

This report presents a draft Public Health Plan for the district. This plan has been prompted by the transfer of public health responsibilities back to local authorities this year. It focuses on a small range of priorities which it is felt can have a positive effect on community health. It does this by complementing the medical professions which focus upon curing sickness by concentrating upon the prevention of sickness. The plan has been produced jointly by the District Council and the County Council. The County Council contribution has been provided by a public health specialist, a public health consultant and a public health analyst. The public health plan is also made consistent with the Council's Health Equalities Policy which has been in place since last year.

The plan argues that it will be able to make effective interventions in terms of Cardio Vascular Disease prevention, increasing levels of overall physical activity, emotional health and wellbeing and the reduction of poverty. It is intended that these areas will be the council's initial priorities and that the perceived challenge is in targeting the Council's health interventions where they can make the most effective, and positive improvement in the health and wellbeing of individuals and communities. The delivery of the programme will - amongst others - involve the voluntary sector, schools, churches, leisure centres, community centres, care homes and children's centres. In fact a whole community approach.

The Review of the Pest Control Service

The Council is intending to create an in-house pest control technician post in May of this year. Until now the Council has employed a contractor to provide this service on Council land (parks and gardens, depots and the sea front) as well as supplying a contract service to residents if they request it. Unfortunately, there have, apparently, been problems with this service which has prompted the decision to trial an in house provision even though the Council has no legal obligation to provide a pest service. The proposed service will use a qualified Royal Society of Public Health technician who will be a mobile field based worker communicating by mobile phone who will treat rats, mice, fleas, bed bugs and wasps on residential premises as well as public land and property.

A Travel Threat to the Elderly

An alarming piece of news from the Local Government Association (LGA). It appears that free travel for the elderly is under real threat. It has stated that government funding for local government has fallen by 39% since 2010 and it has reached a state where some councils have begun cutting free pass routes. Buckinghamshire, Cumbria and Somerset are among the County Councils that have been affected by this development, Who will be next I wonder? Certainly, I find the pass a great help for local travel on a daily basis and I will certainly miss this privilege if it is withdrawn

A Chance to Shape the Future of your Village

The current edition of ConnectED includes an article on the Council's new initiative to draw the inhabitants of the villages in East Devon into the process of contributing to their villages development. The intention is to produce a Villages' Development Plan Document (DPD) by a process of consultation which has already started and will continue until March 10th 2014. The information gathered by consultation will be used to write a revised document which will then go for further consultation in the summer. This second consultation, which includes a map and comments made by the Government Inspector on our Local Plan, will focus on specific policy for village development as well as the constraints limiting development.

The draft DPD document lodged on the E.D.D.C, website goes into a large amount of detail about every village and also suggests some revisions to the current, built up areas, which ring fence the land and that may be considered for building. It also seeks the views of the public, community groups and organisations, businesses and other interested bodies or individuals on proposed sites and policies for development in East Devon villages as well as the Greendale and Hill Barton business site.

Good News on Public Speaking in Committee Meetings at the Knowle

The Standards Committee has been considering ways to increase the effectiveness of public speaking at Council committee meetings which are made inefficient by the three minute limitation upon being able to address the appropriate committee and the frustrations of strangers who wish to speak upon the same issues who are unable to elect a spokesperson. The Standards Committee has now made recommendations on ways to increase the effectiveness of public speaking events

The Development Management Committee has recommended that a working group considers revision of the arrangements for public speaking to increase the efficiency and efficacy of the meetings and reduce the intolerable length of DMC meetings which recently have been running to eight or nine hours of debate where it is well established that meetings that have run on more than 50 minutes rapidly become inefficient.

The Devon Waste plan - energy out of waste

The County Council, as you know, have been advocating waste/energy plants at four sites located throughout the County. The thinking so far has been to locate two of these in East Devon at Hill Barton and Greendale Barton each with an 80,000 ton capacity.

Although E.D.D.C. welcomes this energy plan, at the same time, it is determined that only one site is located in the geographical area of East Devon because of its concern with increased density of lorry traffic as well as the polluting hazards of these plants when they are operating at full capacity. I look forward to the resolution of this argument with interest.

SNOW WHITE: A review

Regrettably this reviewer must begin by offering apologies for what it appears were comments too frank on last year's performance of 'Hamlet'?, 'Swan Lake'? - old men forget (quote Albert Einstein?/William Shakespeare?) - by The Whimpletons so that offence was given even where it was intended. How else explain the receipt from the Box Office of two complimentary tickets for the opening night with an accompanying note —'for yourself and a friend — if you have one', to which the only possible reply was 'unfortunately cannot attend opening night; can the tickets be exchanged for the performance on the second night - if there is one?'*. In the event the all-singing, all-dancing performance of 'Snow White' ran for not only two nights but in addition for a matinee and a third night, which this reviewer was privileged to attend. Privileged indeed, since the cast excelled themselves in a production of which the writer and director can rightly be proud (ably assisted by a cast of thousands - well, enough to fill a whole page in the FREE programme - and in those acting in more technical roles of equal importance, e.g. the bar staff.) It would be invidious to single out any individuals from such a star-studded cast but that has never been a problem in the past to a 'fair-minded and incorruptible reviewer'? - so a few of the cast can hopefully be mentioned without causing bitter reproaches (and threats) from those stars too numerous to list, so here goes:

Chester the Jester opened the performance and carried it along with numerous appearances which called back to their seats those members of the audience who felt that the horror of the role played by characters such as the Queen threatened their enjoyment of what was intended to be a light-hearted evening's entertainment; the Queen herself played her role in a manner that was not only good, it was wicked (the fact that your reviewer found himself sitting next to the Queen's real-life partner in no way influenced his opinion).

Snow White needed to do little but be beautiful, and effortlessly she did, but added to this by her singing and dancing, aided by a tempting Prince Rupert (tempting to Snow White, not only to those members of the cast and audience who expressed their appreciation of his gay and enchanting role-playing), and last but not least to those characters who made the reviewer's task easier when commenting on their performances either by threats or appreciative (and appreciated) donations, a small proportion of which were recycled to the Whimpletons via the bar and the raffle (fixed! i.e. the reviewer did not win anything) namely the Seven Dwarfs, or as was maintained by some members of the audience who had spent too much time and money in the bar, the Fourteen Dwarfs whose enthusiasm for work was an objectlesson to anyone who maintains an undeserved life-style thanks to contributions from the hard-working taxpayers. (The preceding sentence makes the author a strong candidate for the Oscar awarded to a writer who wastes none of his/her 'talent' (?) on the quality of his/her words but makes up for it by an admirable quantity). At this point it would seem to be appropriate to draw the curtain on another superb Whimpletons' production and look forward to the next — with or without a review.

I loved the addition of the video at the start of the second act and, as usual, Slack Ma Girdle provided brilliant musical accompaniment; so much better to have live music at the panto.







The Countryside Code



The countryside code began in the 1950's to help protect, respect and allow people enjoy the countryside in England and Wales. Due to the spring and summer months soon approaching, it is beneficial to the environment and farmers to remind dog owners how to conduct themselves while walking in the countryside. Key things to consider are:



Respecting other people – always leave gates as you find them and follow instructions on signs. Leave farm equipment and animals alone, if you think an animal is in distress try to alert the farmer or inform the RSPCA. Keep out the way if animals are being moved and follow farmer's directions.

Protecting the environment – always pick up after your dog, take litter home and dispose of appropriately. Ensure your dog is wormed regularly, at least every 3 months, to prevent infections and protect other animals.

Protecting your dog against diseases that can be contracted through wildlife — Monthly treatment against Lungworm protects your dog from the 'silent killer' that is carried by foxes. This parasite is not killed with regular worming treatment - ask your vet how to protect your dog.

Protecting livestock and wildlife - Make sure your dog is under control near any wildlife or farm animals by **keeping your dog on a lead**. Pay attention to any signs which may not permit dogs to walk on certain





Livestock can behave unpredictably especially if they have young animals; give them space so that they don't feel threatened. Some dogs have the tendency to chase animals; please keep them away from livestock, especially pregnant ewes and ewes with young lambs.

It is a legal requirement to keep your dog on a short lead on 'open access land' (no more than 2 metres) near animals and horses for safety reasons.
