

#### **HEAVEN IN DEVON**

This was the logo used for the celebration of the foundation of the Diocese of Exeter 1,100 years ago, which covers the whole of the County. I found it most inspirational and 5,000 people turned up for a great service outdoors on Cathedral Green, taken by the Archbishop of Canterbury. It was the culmination of months of planning and preparation. The following Friday there was a very moving service to celebrate the return of the Royal Marines from Afghanistan and the Duke of Edinburgh took the salute. What a very wonderful homecoming to Devon and what a joy and relief for the families.

What a great shame we were deprived by the BBC on Friday 4th July of that great tribute to our brave troops in Exeter and in the Cathedral, when they replaced it with tennis. Someone had their priorities sadly missing in good taste.

As I walked round my garden in the early morning, looking up at the sky and admiring the fleecy clouds drifting in the breeze, there came to my mind such a gentle, yet elated, sense of joy to be living in Devon, heavenly Devon.

August in Devon villages is the month of our wonderful Flower Shows. As you can imagine, the months before are not spent in idleness but in planning, growing, taking the greatest care in cultivation to bring the best exhibits to the show. What anticipation and hope! The new schedules went out early to whet the appetite of prospective exhibitors. I must say I was most impressed by the way it was conceived. It is so good to know our school is very involved. When we lived in London, I used to get invited to special previews of the Royal Horticultural Society in Vincent Square and, by chance, I found this little poem which depicts it so well.

The King walked into the flower show tent He is just an average English gent Neat black jacket and grey cravat Rolled umbrella and bowler hat He thinks to himself "The flowers are fine But nothing at all compared with mine."
The Queen comes into the big marquee
She is just a gardener like you and me
A bit of Old Chelsea in powder blue
Vastly enjoying the private view
She thinks to herself "I'll eat my hat
If I could not grow lupins like that."

As a gardener myself, I am always happiest out of doors with a trowel or fork. To touch the earth with your hands is such a special contact with Mother Nature. To look at my flowers, see bees humming and butterflies fleeting from one bloom to another, to let the sunshine fall on my open hand and try to hold it is heavenly, especially when my robin follows and sings a sweet melody. I wish it would last for ever. Our Square has looked especially lovely this year, although some careless people still manage to drop litter. We now have elegant flower pots to prevent people from parking in the narrowest parts, which blocked traffic. "Say it with Flowers" seems to have worked so far although, unfortunately, one of our containers was damaged by a careless driver – but it was immediately replaced.

I just do not know where the months have gone. It seems that we have only just celebrated the Summer solstice, the longest day, and yet here we are nearing the end of the Autumn Equinox, when day and night are of equal length. September brings morning mists and the first sparkling, heavy dews. The colours in our beautiful Devon countryside are changing, with dramatic displays of bright red, bronze and yellow, and the birds are starting to make preparation for migrating to warmer climes. I feel that September brings an abundance of berries, some green and others bright and red, attracting the voracious birds. One often hears the expression INDIAN SUMMER applied to September. It was so called in the nineteenth century in North America because the native Indians used such balmy and warm days to store their crops and prepare for the long Winter months.

The spiders are also creating delicate pictures of great beauty which festoon shrubs and, for my great joy, my window.

The ragged, noisy boys intrude
To gather nuts that ripened
As soon as shook will patter down
And harvest ends its busy reign
And leaves the fields their peace again
The Autumn shadows idly move
And tinge the trees with many hues.

### **VINTAGE YEARS: Coram Hammett** remembers:

I remember the house where I was born, an old cob (mud wall) and thatch roof dwelling, deep in the beautiful Devonshire countryside. The midwife had come in a pony and trap and, when she found she could not cope, the Doctor came the same way and I was brought kicking and screaming into this world as though I knew what was in store for me in this life. Three years later my sister Kathleen was born. We had our first tender years in this beautiful place. We were happy without resentment about our poverty. We had nothing but our health and happiness and we had God. Neither of my parents was demonstrative in their affection, but they did love us. I later realized that they in turn were acting in the same way as their parents did. We are all products of our childhood's environment.

Most of my childhood was spent while we were still in this cottage, and I spent my days in the forest and down by the river. I got to know every bend, waterhole, large rock, and all the large trees on the river bank. I used to catch eels, which mother would fry for us. We were poor and any food was good.

I once fell into the river and instead of sinking, I floated on my back until I could get out or was rescued. So my guardian angel was watching over me. We got all our water from a well fed by a crystal clear spring. One has to buy such water nowadays; it does not come out of a tap. After dark we used oil lamps and candles.

Both my parents came from large families who had lived in Devon for generations. My Mother was one of fourteen, my Father one of nine. My Father lived 66 years and my Mother lived 91. They were married in St Mary's Church, Morchard Bishop on 29th June 1925 and I was born on 28th June 1926. On 17th October that year I was baptised in St Peter's Church, Oakford. One of my given names was Coram, which is really a Devonshire family name that can be traced back 600 years.

At Oakford I started my schooling. That was three miles away, a journey I had to walk in all weathers. In the middle of the classroom was a pot-belly type heater which used to burn coke. There was only one teacher in this school. We used to be given one or two Ovaltine tablets free every day, provided by the government. A dentist would come and check our teeth once a year. He had a portable foot-operated drill if we needed a filling. I was not to become a great academic, just learnt to read and write and do simple arithmetic.

After a few years we moved to another cottage on the top of a hill, called Wind Whistle. It was there I saw my first aircraft. An airship moving silently and slowly along. Sometimes we saw gyrocopters, the forerunner of helicopters. I can remember my Father making wooden pegs for his rabbit traps and snares. I was fascinated by his skill in woodwork; he would sit on one log and use another for a chopping block. He could do all the repair jobs around the house as well as trapping rabbits, working on the farm and as a woodman with one axe and a cross-cut saw. We had no radio and only got one newspaper called the News of the World on Sundays..... to be continued





## The History of Whimple News

In the interest of historical accuracy we must point out that at no time did we ever produce the Whimple News as a team of two! Whimple News was born out of a parish appraisal in the late 1980s and a team including Edith Grout, John Mackie, Jane and Andy Hughes and ourselves began the News, substantially in the same form as it is today. Andy had acquired an 'almost free' photocopier and it was he who had the mammoth task of photocopying each issue, firstly in his garage and then in their spare room.

At the beginning, the 'copy' was typed but then computers came in and Derek Browning (formerly of Plumtree Lane) joined the team and produced it on his computer. Once copied (several days later!) the magazine was collated on the billiard table in the Hall by another team of people and then delivered to the deliverers as Ed does today.

Several years and photocopiers went by, the village was growing and an original 'run' of 475 had become 675 by which time the new housing on the Whiteways site was becoming a reality. For a brief time the then parish clerk took on the photocopying but the team felt that they had done enough and it was time to hand over. There was no break in continuity as the new team took over and the News is in substantially the same form, albeit with a lot more advertising which, of course, enables it to be professionally printed. It remains a great way of communicating and, as ever, the quality of its content depends on us, the readers! Well done Ed and the team.

## June 6th D - Day + 65 Years

#### **Background Information**

During my life before Devon, I had the honour and pleasure of becoming involved with a group of men known as Normandy Veterans. It was on a shopping trip to Bracknell town centre with my then eight year old daughter Rebecca that I met Peter Thompson (no relation) who was the chairman of the Surrey branch of the NVA, (Normandy Veterans Association). He was collecting money to help subsidise a visit to Normandy Beaches the following week and, during our conversation, I said that I had always had the desire to visit Normandy and the cemeteries. Peter's reply was that I would be doing him a favour if I was to join them the next week, as a veteran had just dropped out through illness and he could return his deposit if I was to join them - so this was how I became involved. On this first trip I was one of only two people of my generation on the coach; the rest were all in their late seventies, eighties or nineties. We arrived in Normandy at a place called Arromanches. The visit was incredible and I made friends with veterans whom I am still in contact with today.

#### The 2009 Visit

Having now visited Arromanches approx eight years out of the last ten, for the 6th June Commemorations, I'm always looking for new and interesting ways to get there and this year, while in conversation (after a few drinks) with friends who live in and around the village, I decided to cycle. I thought one or two friends may join me but finished up with eight, which was fantastic.

We split into two parties known as the "Advanced Party" (Gordon, Jerry, Chris M, Mike) and the "Mechanised Division". (Nick, Chris N, Steve and me). Gordon took his truck containing all our luggage and four bikes for the Advanced Party.

My party left Whimple Station with our pushbikes and headed to Portsmouth. We left on the Wednesday night ferry at 11pm, arriving at 6am in Caen. We then cycled up the Caen Canal to the famous Pegasus Bridge, which was the first place to be liberated by the British on June 6th by the glider troops. Here we were, supposed to meet up with the Advanced Party, but they let us down due to an overindulgent first night in Arromanches (lucky the boys 65 years earlier had more discipline!) so the new meeting point was now Courselles, which is a beautiful fishing port half-way between Pegasus Bridge and Arromanches. We stopped here and had a fantastic lunch of moules and beer. The weather was fantastic and the cycle trip was all along the beach edge, flat and very scenic. We arrived in Arromanches at approx 3pm and headed to the house we had rented, which was just a short walk to the village centre. After a quick clean up we headed out for dinner.

### Friday 5th june

We cycled to Omaha Beach, made famous by the film "Saving Private Ryan".

This is an American landing beach and we visited the large American cemetery which contains over 9,000 American servicemen who lost their lives during the Normandy campaign. After this visit, we stopped on the way back at Port en Besson - the cry of "8 croque monsieurs and 8 bieres" goes up for the umpteenth time.

We ended the day with a cross-country mountain-bike-friendly cliff-top ride which is great if you are not on a racing bike like Chris N. The day was completed with another great meal and lots of very nice French wine and beer.

#### Sat June 6th

The big day: the 65th anniversary of D-Day, the beginning of the liberation of Europe. I still have trouble getting my head around what happened here back then. Arromanches was the site of the Mulberry Harbour, which was a harbour built in the UK, then towed across the channel and constructed to offload supplies for the next three months. Without it the push forward across France would not have happened. Men, fuel, trucks, tanks - everything came through this small village to the front line.

Our day started with a cycle ride to Bayeux in order to be with the British Veterans for their annual service in the British cemetery. More than 800 veterans marched into the cemetery, which is incredible when you consider the youngest veteran is now 82. The ceremony is always very emotional and at the same time very uplifting. Prince Charles was here with us, Gordon Brown was along the coast in the American cemetery, making a fool of himself by calling the beach there "Obama Beach"!

After a short lunch of - you guessed it - "8 croque monsieurs and 8 bieres", I headed back to Arromanches as I had a date,!!!!! (see picture on next page). The rest of the boys headed off to see the Bayeux Tapestry but I think my date beats that !!!! Arromanches takes on a party atmosphere for the rest of the day with the locals mixing with British Veterans and much singing and dancing and drinking. We do our bit and dress up for the occasion (see picture on next page). Fireworks are always laid on for the veterans on the evening of the 6th June, and I'm always amazed by how many nationalities congregate here on this day every year, particularly the Dutch who really do appreciate our Veterans more than we do. Maybe this is because they were occupied for so long and then liberated by these amazing men.

This year they are saying that this is the last big reunion of Veterans here but having been here most years out of the last ten, I can't imagine it will be as the Veterans love it here and the French people love having them here.

The stories I have heard over the years from these men are incredible. I'm really pleased that I had the opportunity to take some friends with me to meet them while the history is still living and real, as in twenty or so years time this part of our history will only be accessed from books, films and the internet.

Now the other seven have seen Normandy for themselves they can be assured that I will not bore them with all the stories from my veteran friends, but there is no guarantee that if you meet any of them around the village they won't bore you.

Finally I will leave you with a slogan the Veterans use on some of their literature, which is a slogan that is relevant for today's conflicts as well as yesterdays:

The largest number of comments were based on the car park facilities. We are very fortunate to have on site car parking as other practices in East Devon do not offer any facilities at all. Our staff do not park on site unless they are working an early morning or late night shift. However spaces are limited. Therefore we ask patients who are mobile to park in the public car park which is only a short walk away from the practice. Unfortunately there have been instances where our car park has been 'blocked' preventing ambulance crews, doctors and nurses from entering and leaving the premises to attend to patients. If you are visiting the local shops and businesses in the town please do not use our car park as a free alternative to the public car parks.

We received some very positive feedback ranging from "excellent" and "this is the best practice I have ever registered at" to "am very satisfied". It is encouraging to read that our patients value the service they receive from us. We welcome feedback and are happy to receive suggestions and comments regarding the service we offer. We are continually working to maintain and develop the standard of service we provide for patients and your help with this process is very much appreciated.

### WHIMPLE OVER 60's SOCIAL CLUB

#### 'COUNTED IN'

In late 2008 East Devon Volunteer Centre initiated 'Count Me In'. It was a Devon-wide project to record and celebrate hours given by volunteers to groups, charity, school and other organisations without receiving money in return. It was to help develop a full picture of the enormous contribution made by volunteers and develop further the role of voluntary activity in Devon.

In supplying information as to personal details and ethnicity, with the name of the organisation involved, activity role and hours per week on average given, each person would receive a certificate recording their achievements. Each person would also be entered into one of eight cash prize draws of  $\pm 50$  for the area.

Having cajoled committee members to fill in the survey forms, I firmly believed they should receive some recognition for their involvement in running our Over 60's Social Club. In giving time and refusing any recompense, a certificate in recognition of their services would at least be a significant reward.

Certificates duly arrived and nothing was heard until the end of April when I was informed that our Over 60's Club had won a second prize of £500 in the 'Count Me In' prize draw, and that Lucy Smith was the lucky entrant. The prize money is intended to support and celebrate our volunteers.

Presentation of the cheque was made at the Bishops Palace gardens on the 1st July where 170 guests gathered to praise volunteers. Bishop Michael Langrish presented eight Devon Community Foundation Volunteer of the Year Awards whilst Emily Wood of BBC Spotlight presented the other awards to the organisations. Invitation to the award ceremony allowed myself as Chairman, Beryl Iball (Secretary), Ena Northcott (Outings Coordinator), Lucy Smith (Birthday Card Organiser) and Shirley Peters (Committee Representative) to attend. We were welcomed with drinks and given lunch in the marquee. Speeches were given by Councillor Roger Croad, Cabinet Member for Community Services, DCC and Emily Wood, BBC Spotlight & Winston Churchill Fellow. Presentations followed and many balloons, each representing the thousands of volunteers, were released from the palace grounds.

The foundation has awarded £6.6m in grants to 1,900 small voluntary and community groups run by volunteers. In Exeter more than 177 groups have been supported with a total of £800,000 in grants.

As a self financing organisation we **are** extremely grateful and proud to have been 'Counted In'.



- headache
- muscle aches

- DO NOT COME INTO THE SURGERY OR GO TO A HOSPITAL AS YOU MAY SPREAD THE DISEASE
- If you have been with someone who has flu-like symptoms please telephone the Flu Pandemic Helpline for further advice on 0800 1 513 513

#### **Key Actions**

#### <u>Prevention</u>

Remember that preventing the spread of germs is the single most effective way to slow the spread of disease such as swine flu. You should always:

- ensure everyone washes their hands regularly with soap and water
- clean surfaces regularly to get rid of germs
- use tissues to cover your mouth and nose when you cough and sneeze
- place used tissues in the bin as soon as possible

#### **Preparation**

You can also prepare now, in case the swine flu becomes widespread, by:

- establishing a network of 'flu friends' friends or relatives who can help if you fall ill. They could for example collect medicines and other supplies for you so you would not have to go out.
- having a stock of food and other supplies, including basic cold remedies, available at home. This should be enough to last two weeks, in case you and your family are ill.

# CHECK YOUR MOBILE PHONE BILLS

You may be in for a big shock, I got a big surprise last month.



Imagine my surprise when I received my mobile phone bill last month, which was more than 10 times greater than usual. A quick check showed I had been **billed** for two calls each lasting more than 30 minutes to an 0900 number at a cost of £150. My immediate reaction was what should I do, as I knew I had not made the calls. I also pay off my account by direct debit each month, so my bank account would be £150 less than it should have been.

I immediately phoned my mobile phone provider and, after being passed from one department to another, was able to <u>verbally dispute these two calls</u>. The reply I got was that they had been billed to them from the premium line provider and **they could do nothing about it.** They offered to put me through to the premium line provider who informed me that the service was to a **psychic advice line**.

My next call was to South West Trading Standards, who were most helpful, having had many similar instances related to them. Their first advice was to keep a log of all the calls I make and to re-look at the bill to see if I could remember what I was doing at the time of the alleged calls. Then, if I could identify what I was doing, put this **in writing** to the head office of the premium line provider sending it by recorded delivery and disputing the calls. They advised not to stop my direct debit as this would have broken my contract with my mobile phone provider.

It was at this stage that our diary came in very handy, which reminded us that at the time of the alleged calls we were towing our caravan back to Whimple from our holiday in North Devon and the mobile phone was in my pocket whilst I was driving. Also I noticed that the two calls were supposedly each made for 30+ minutes and shown as being made at 12.14 hrs and 12.15 hrs, which was physically impossible. This information was relayed to the premium provider by recorded delivery and, on receipt, I had a telephone call informing me that a cheque was in the post to reimburse the cost of the calls. This arrived two days later. At no stage did I get an apology.

The moral to this is that I now look at every bill I receive in a different light to the past! I advise everyone to do the same.
