Posters were displayed around the village together with a set of rules for the competition. Judging took place during the months of May, June and July and final judging in July and August. The organisers in Whimple, namely Cllr Sue Ayres and Cllr John Schofield, worked hard to involve many Whimple villagers in helping make the village as attractive as possible, encouraging residents to make their front gardens look delightful and to help in keeping the area neat and tidy and litter free. 

WHIMPLE HISTORY SOCIETY PROJECT TO REMEMBER THE START OF THE GREAT WAR IN 1914



This is a poignant time of year to be asking you for help.

The History Society has embarked upon a project to commemorate the centenary of the start of The Great War. We hope to open the Heritage Centre in 2014 with an exhibition of stories and pictures which illustrate the social history of Whimple when news of the war broke out. We also want to be able to tell the stories of the many Whimple people who not only went to fight in the war but also stayed behind. To do this we need help. Some people have already kindly made themselves known but we need more volunteers to help us piece it together. Can you spare some time? A few hours, one day or more - any amount.

Below are a few extracts from David Parker's book 'The People of Devon in the First World War' I hope they will encourage you to contact us.

The high summer of 1914 was like many summers before, with final preparations being made for a host of popular events on and around the Bank Holiday, Monday August 3rd. Advertisements were appearing all over the county for horse and pony shows, regattas, horticultural shows, flower shows and in Whimple the villagers were preparing to host a sports day.

On the evening of Sunday August 2nd 1914 news of the imminent prospect of war reached the village of Broadclyst. During evensong the daughter of the verger appeared in the doorway of the church with a piece of paper in her hand. The verger was a Naval Reservist, and a telegram had arrived. On reading the telegram he got up noisily, hung his cassock on its peg in the tower vestry and left. By the time the congregation came out of the church he was on his way to the depot in Exeter. Throughout Devon thousands of others with military and naval training received similar calls.

On Bank Holiday Monday, August 3rd Germany declared war on France and its armies immediately invaded Belgium and Luxembourg. On August 4th the British Government sent an ultimatum to Germany to evacuate those countries: by eleven o'clock in the evening there had been no reply and by midnight Britain was at war.

On August 7th Lord Kitchener called for 100,000 more men to create a 'New Army'. Despite the high numbers in Devon's Territorials, local mayors were asked to stimulate more recruiting and to identify reliable recruiting contacts in all the parishes.

We have the names of over 100 Whimple men who joined The Great War and we are looking for volunteers to help research the part they played. If you would like to help please contact me. You can also approach anyone from the History Society or pop a note into our post box which can be found outside the Heritage Centre.

A CONVERSATION WITH LUCY SMITH

In our latest chat, Lucy and I spoke about Whimple's Christmasses past, and more general 'bits and pieces' about the village. Lucy was very involved with the church as a young lady because both parents were active supporters of St Mary's — her father, if you remember, was the main man for 'ringing the bells and stoking the coals', whilst her mother was flower arranging in the church and a member of the WI. Lucy had also run the Sunday School for a number of years, and at Christmas time, was responsible for organising the Nativity Play which was performed at the Victory Hall with a cast of some 20 - 30 children. These Nativity Plays had been put on at the Hall since the 1920s, so they were a well established tradition in Whimple. All the costumes were created by the army of parents, with some splendid scenery – and all performed to a full house for one night only. Lucy appeared as an angel some time in the 1930s, and one Roger Smith, aged seven, continued the thespian tradition by playing Joseph, and I believe, went onto bigger and greater things.

There were also Whist Drives with poultry as prizes, once a year in the Victory Hall and these were well attended by some 100 or so people - local Whimple folk plus people from the surrounding villages.


We had previously discussed the carol singing, when a group of Whimple singers would borrow a local lorry and tour nearby villages and towns, making a collection for a charitable cause. One of the causes St Mary's in Whimple supported was missionary work and the money collected was handed over to the vicar at Midnight Mass on the Christmas Eve. The carol singers also went around Whimple but apparently would be cunningly selective as to where they would go – aiming for the houses where they were most likely to be well received in terms of money given, plus with the chance of mince pies and something to drink – Dick Whiteway at Woodhayes was always a good bet for these!

The Harvest Festival was a highlight in the church calendar and the altar boy carrying the cross was known to speed up his pace so that he could get to the Harvest Festival dance that followed the service in the Victory Hall, and get a good seat! Who would think that he is now a well respected elder of our village?

Lucy also remembered the Cricket Club – they would have a 'start of season' dance, held at the Victory Hall, and Lucy could clearly remember the sandwiches (without crusts, gentle reader....how they lived in the old days!), and all the evergreen decorations around the fire (which was not alight, thank goodness!).

Since this was written we have learned that Lucy has had a nasty fall and is in hospital. We send her our best wishes and hope for a speedy recovery

Simon Egerton, presented by Villages In Action

This one-man show was a first-hand exploration of the life of 'Paul' through a combination of story-telling and song. The tale included his slightly unorthodox family unit as a child ('posh, and a bit camp'), through puberty, marriage, his Mother's death and the surprising reasons behind his Father's subsequent move overseas. Simon cleverly used the combination of clear and precise dialogue, and some very powerful song writing and musical performance to evoke a range of emotions in the audience. His approach made the audience feel as though he was talking to us as old friends. We thoroughly enjoyed the show and would recommend it.

Prior to the event, however, I decided to take a look online to get an idea of what we could expect. This was a mistake. As is often the case, the online clips captured none of the atmosphere or personality of a live act. I suspect a number of people may have done the same as me and decided not to come on that basis, as the audience numbers were low and the event was very nearly cancelled completely.

Whimple is extremely fortunate to have a number of people who work very hard to bring high-quality and good-value entertainment (live music, comedy, film, speakers etc) into the village for the benefit of local people. The time, effort, stress (and cost) involved in organising these events should not be underestimated and it is only feasible to run such events if there is good support from local people. I have had many people say to me how amazed they are that so much goes on in Whimple compared to other much larger communities. It is a fact Whimple should be proud of. Therefore, I would ask that before deciding that a future event is not 'your thing', take a risk and support some of these events. You may be pleasantly surprised. If you don't take that risk, you may find that things start to get a lot quieter around here!

Many thanks to all who are regularly shopping with us and changing their shopping habits. We would love to see more people so please feel free to let us know what sort of things you want. As mentioned before we hope in the future to be able to offer tea and coffee but this will take some time and other immediate repair costs have taken priority. Don't forget that Frank is still happy to deliver fresh fish on a Wednesday – if you would like to place an order with him please call on a Tuesday evening 01823 277669 and we will hold it for you at the shop until you can collect.

Many people ask about our current suppliers and we have bread, cakes, pasties and sausage rolls delivered daily from Shauls Bakery in Exeter. We have fruit and veg delivered 3-4 times a week from Milfords in Exeter. We also get freshly picked veg from Broadclyst Community Farm and the chard and kale are particularly delicious and popular. We have a delivery of homogenised westcountry milk for all those who don't like the creamy un -homogenised milk from Ashclyst Dairy. Surprisingly the westcountry milk is more expensive for us to buy as there is a chain before it gets to us. The Ashclyst milk is organic, delicious and very local. It is made, processed and bottled at a farm just outside of Broadclyst and the family and their team are a pleasure to deal with. They have a great range of cream and yoghurts which once tried will remind you of how yoghurts used to taste.

We currently have a lovely range of produce from Courtneys and we can take orders for these items or anything else. Cheeses may be worth ordering in for Christmas. Cheese, hams and pates come to us from Hawkridge Farm and whilst we order in a small selection they do offer a very large range. We can also order in home made cakes, although we hope to offer a small selection at the weekends.

Looking ahead we hope to be working with Fresh & Green from West Hill. They produce veg and offer a medium or large veg bag for £9 or £12 — delivery on a Thursday afternoon. We need a minimum of five people to make this work for Fresh & Green so please contact us if you are interested. We are also talking to local farmers about supplying fresh meat and hope to receive some beef from Dartmoor Farmers in the near future. They are offering vacuum packed quality beef reared on the moors. We should also be getting some Faith in Nature shampoos and some Little Pod vanilla paste.

As many of you know Lucy has given up her paper round and we are delighted that so many people have chosen to come to us for their daily and weekend papers. Our area is unusual for papers as there are two wholesale distributors and at the moment we cannot get the Times or Sun newspapers. We are investigating if this can be changed sooner than next summer when our wholesaler will have the contract for those two papers.

Christmas opening hours are in the magazine. We have decided to open on Boxing Day and New Year's Day so that you can get your emergency supplies and newspapers.

The opening hours over Christmas will be shorter to give us a breathing space and allow us to spend some time with the family. We hope this doesn't cause you too much inconvenience. Thank you for your support so far and we wish you a Merry Christmas and all the best for 2014.





Whimple School gets inspected

The school has had an unexpected visit from OFSTED and the inspector's report will be available to read online by the time you read this.

Our overall grading this time was 'Good' with the behaviour and safety of pupils being judged as 'Outstanding'.

It is disappointing that we did not retain our overall 'Outstanding' grade. However, if you read the new report, and compare it with the previous one, you will see that there has been no change in provision but that the 'goal posts' have been moved.

At the time of the last inspection 9% of schools were being graded as 'Outstanding' and this has already fallen to less than 7% under the new inspection regime. Schools are now graded as 'Outstanding' only if they are judged outstanding in 'teaching and learning' as well as in other aspects.

Our SATs results in 2012 put us as one of the top performing schools in England, but in 2013 a dip in reading skills for our highest attaining pupils reduced the assessment to 'in line with', rather than 'above', similar schools. This was sufficient to put us outside of the 'Outstanding' criteria.

We remain proud of Whimple School's achievements and the views that were expressed by parents were resoundingly positive.

Christmas time for pets

Christmas time, full of joy and cheer with the presents under the tree and Christmas dinner smelling better than ever! We, as vets, want to make sure that you and your pets have a fantastic Christmas without a trip to the practice.

Cats are often more fascinated by Christmas trees than us and like to climb and explore. Make sure your tree is very secure and any glass tree decorations or those with sharp edges are well out of the way of your intrigued feline. Cats also can enjoy a nibble on tinsel. They tend to eat lengths of stringy material which can then cause a concertina effect on the intestines. This can be very harmful and requires surgery to treat, so keeping tinsel and string out of harm's way is much safer!

What Christmas is complete without chocolate? Unfortunately many dogs, and sometimes cats, also believe this to be true! Chocolate can cause vomiting and diarrhoea and in larger doses, liver failure and can be fatal. The higher the cocoa content the more the risk so keep those expensive dark chocolate truffles out of the way of any investigative hounds in the house! Be wary of chocolates on the tree and wrapped in presents within reach. Remember a small number of extra treats can lead to rapid weight gain which can take a long time to lose.

Dried fruit is also a risk to dogs and can cause renal failure so keep Christmas pudding, mince pies and Christmas cake away from low tables or other places your crafty hound may be able to get to.

For some of us, it can all get a bit much at these festive times. We may like our house being filled with family, friends and music but not all our pets do. 
