As I write this article, the Balfour Beatty Boys are doing their thing in The Square. With the road closures and diversions. We have been impressed by the number of our customers who are making their way to us despite the difficulties, and we thank all for persevering through all the mess and mayhem.

We would like to welcome all Halifax and HBOS customers with personal current accounts to the Post office 'banking family' i.e., LloydsTSB, Co-op, A&L and Barclays. You are now able to check your balance and withdraw money from your accounts. If you're not sure what Banking transactions we can offer you, and your chosen bank, please ask.

We are still finding many people not understanding the 'Pricing in Proportion' scheme introduced by Royal Mail over two years ago, which can mean that the recipient of a letter with underpaid postage has to collect the item from their sorting office and pay the admin fee, plus the difference in the postage. As many of you will be sending cards in the next month please remember that if the card has any extras, such as ribbons, badges decoupage, or is extra large, it will probably need extra postage. Cards in these categories will cost 42p for second class , or 52p for first class. If you are not sure, we have a size guide in the post office, or ask us.

We also sell a large selection of Christmas Cards, gift wrap and packaging materials.

'Christmas Greetings from Whimple' cards remain as popular as ever and are the same prices as last year. Special 'Tipsy' Marmalades are also available now, as well as homemade mincemeat.



#### Whimple in Wikipedia - Wassailing

Our last edition included an excerpt from wikipedia, the on-line encyclopedia, which told the world about the village we call home. Our esteemed editor's exhortation to join the wassailing on 17th January prompted me to see what wikipedia had to say about wassailing and I was delighted to find that ours is considered to be one of the world's most important annual wassails. Another claim to fame for Whimple! This is what appears in wikipedia.

#### The Orchard - Visiting Wassail

In cider-producing areas of England, such as the West Country, wassailing also refers to drinking (and singing) the health of trees in the hopes that they might better thrive.



An old rhyme goes: "Wassaile the trees, that they may beare / You many a Plum and many a Peare: / For more or lesse fruits they will bring, / As you do give them Wassailing."

The purpose of wassailing is to awake the cider apple trees and to scare away evil spirits to ensure a good harvest of fruit in the Autumn.{"England In Particular", Common Ground 2007} The ceremonies of each wassail varies from village to village but they generally all have the same core elements. A wassail King and Queen to lead the proceedings, and song and/or a processional tune to be played/sung from one orchard to the next, the wassail Queen will be lifted up into the boughs of the tree where she will place toast that has been soaked in Wassail from the Clayen Cup as a gift the tree spirits and to show them the fruits of what they created the previous year. Then an incantation is usually recited such as

Here's to thee, old apple tree, That blooms well, bears well. Hats full, caps full, Three bushel bags full, An' all under one tree. Hurrah! Hurrah!

Then the assembled crowd will sing and shout and bang drums and pots & pans and generally make a terrible racket until the gunsmen give a great final volley through the branches to make sure the work is done and then off to the next orchard. Perhaps unbeknown to the general public, this ancient English tradition is still very much thriving today. The West Country is the most famous and largest cider producing region of the country and some of the most important wassails are held annually in Carhampton (Somerset) and Whimple (Devon), both on 17th January (old Twelfth Night).

Private readings about people in Somerset in the 1800s revealed that inhabitants of Somerset practiced the old Wassailing Ceremony, singing the following lyrics after drinking the cider until they were "merry and gay:"

"Apple tree, apple tree, we all come to wassail thee, Bear this year and next year to bloom and to blow, Hat fulls, cap fulls, three cornered sack fills, Hip, Hip, Hip, hurrah, Holler biys, holler hurrah."

Christmas Greeting from Edith Marie-Louise Grout

The bright fire glows and crackles The air smells sweetly of spices Of tangerines, apples and chestnuts Of wine and warming mince pies Tree lights twinkle bright The happy memories of Christmas In many long years ago Of snow and bright, berried holly And young, cold faces aglow And there in the lamp-lit stable With cattle, shepherds and kings, The child who was born at Christmas Sheltered by angel wings. So, along with the carols and feastings The peace, goodwill and cheer The voices of happy children Excited squeals of delight The smiling faces of loved ones Christmas

With the same rhythm year after year, with wonderful carols in every church in the land, a festival of light, hope and love.....that is the nature of GOOD NEWS and a story that bears telling and re-telling. The Christmas story reminds us of the angels, proclaiming and bringing good news to the whole world. It also tells us that everyone is included - the rich, the poor and the marginalised. It tells us of a moving human story, of a baby born a child and yet a king, but not in a princely palace with a warm bed and servants busying themselves with mother and child, but to refugee parents in an ill-lit stable in an occupied land. Today there are still millions of refugees with nowhere to go – not even an ill-lit stable. It is therefore important for all of us to remember the story and think of the less-favoured.

Before the actual celebrations, there is the period of four weeks' preparation and expectation called THE ADVENT. The word Advent comes from the Latin word 'aventurus' and the Old French 'aventure'. It is a time to prepare for and expect an event – a season of good will leading up to Christmas.

The birth of a baby is always an event full of joy, love and promise. I have very recently experienced the joy of becoming a great great aunt to a baby girl, Isabelle, born in far away New Mexico.

The modern world seems to be obsessed with celebrities, and I wonder what the band of angels made of the message they were to give, with no stage, no crowds and a 'one night only' performance! Their audience that night could have dismissed the message as a sort of dream, or delusion of cold and tired men. Why would they listen to a voice that seemed so irrelevant to their way of life, their work and their status? Yet the pull was so strong that they followed the angel's directions, and were guided by a single star to the stable.

This ancient story explains the meaning of life and it places a special value on the dignity of human life in poverty. Each child is born a unique individual, with their own gifts and abilities. The world we live in is our inheritance and so is the message of Christmas.

The rhythm continues into the New Year, with the Feast of Epiphany celebrating the Wise Men, who brought their gifts to that special and unique new-born baby. They also followed the star but, after remembering an extra bit of news which may harm that special family, they quietly returned to where they came from.

From my window in The Square I love to study the seasons. The birds fluttering from branch to branch at the moment looking like filigree against the sky. On a sunny day, it is quite magical. At this time there is not much singing, except for the plaintive song of my robin waiting for titbits, which the blackbirds are eager to share.



We are gliding gracefully into a New Year, so the Church Bells tell us:

The little brook winds round and round
It covers quite a lot of ground
And loves to laugh and play the fool
Like children coming home from school.

The little brook, too old to play,
Will have to work another day
Yet, while its baby course is run,
It seems to have a lot of fun.

The log was burning brightly
It was a night that would banish sin
For the bells were ringing
the old year out and the New Year in.



#### A Most Excellent Birthday Present

Earlier this summer (sorry about the appalling language already!) the current Mrs H was going through the normal annual tribulations of wondering what to buy husband for his birthday. ..what can you get a man who has everything...? But no, gentle reader, the current Mrs H is famed for listening to the ramblings of an old man and filing them away for later use. I had been beating my gums about wanting to have a review of my driving skills, as it was some centuries ago when I took my driving test. I think it was the same week that they invented the wheel.

And so it came to pass that I found myself the proud owner of a voucher for a 3 hour Driver Development session at the Devon Driver's Centre based at Westpoint, which I proudly presented to Mike Hull one Friday afternoon, at the DDC office. Mike explained that he would be my trainer/instructor for the afternoon, and gained 10 out of 10 from me (as an ex trainer) when he asked me what I wanted to get out of the afternoon. I explained that I wanted feedback on my driving skills as they had not been reviewed for many years and I was certain that I had some bad habits, which were invisible to me. Mike told me that for the first ten minutes he would give me directions but no feedback because he wanted to see how I drove 'normally'. We then set off towards Exeter, and ended up parking in the Pizza Hut car park near Tesco. Gentle reader, my heart fell as I suddenly thought that I was going to be a chauffeur for a trip round Devon to see how many fast food outlets we could visit in 3 hours, with Mike piling his way though burgers, pies, pasties, fizzy drinks, cakes, kebabs, fish and chips...where would the list end? And HOW would it end would the fire brigade have to remove the roof of the rather smart Mondeo TDCI that I was driving and lift him out?

No such thing! Mike offered useful feedback about what he had seen, and we then set off for a drive that used all types of roads, including motorways. During the drive, he told me that I was slowing down in a very 'old fashioned' way, because I was using the gear box and the brakes to slow the car down. This was the way that I had been taught all those years ago, based on the theory of sharing the load of slowing down between engine and brakes. This was one of those invisible things that I needed just that sort of feedback on. Mike challenged me to slow down earlier as I approached obstructions, and then select the gear that I would pull away in. So I started to try that, and I have to admit that I found it really difficult to 'unlearn' that particular bad habit. As the afternoon went on, I felt more comfortable with that and now do it regularly – but I still have to think about it!

The Mondeo was fitted with an in car video camera, and I had especially asked for this car, as I knew the value of video feedback. As it was, the video feedback wasn't needed as I agreed with all the comments that he gave me, delivered in a very positive and constructive way. It would have been useful if we had disagreed on a particular point, and he could have shown me the evidence.

One of my concerns on motorway driving was that I didn't plan far enough in front when I was overtaking, and would often find myself too close to the vehicle I wanted to overtake, trapped by a succession of other cars overtaking me. So we did some practising down the M5 and there was one exercise which had me driving at 70 mph – not 69, not 71 but 70 on the nose, down the motorway and overtaking safely, at a constant speed. I found that very useful – and very difficult!

So what did I get out of the afternoon? I was told that my slowing down was 'old fashioned' and have changed that, and that should be of benefit to my car; I feel easier about planning where I need to be on overtaking; I accept that I drove up to hazards too quickly; I plan to read the Highway Code and check that I am up-to-date with my knowledge; I am more observant about changes of speed limits especially 30/40; I am using my wing mirrors more, especially when I set off after stopping; and the most important lesson for me was about setting a safe distance from the car in front using the '2 second rule'. I was very confused when Mike mentioned this, as I couldn't see how it could be done. Mike explained it for me - when you are driving behind another car, on the open road, check your distance by watching when the car in front passes a stationary object at the side of the road and then say to yourself ' Only a fool breaks the 2 second rule' which in itself should take 2 seconds. If you arrive at the same object before you have finished that phrase, then you are too close and you need to back off.

Would I recommend it to any one else? Certainly - I found it invaluable, and it is a worthwhile review of your driving skills. We all think we are good drivers - but it is healthy to challenge that view. All you need is an open mind to see the benefits of such a review .

So now you know what to say when you write your letter to Santa!!

#### WHIMPLE HOUSING NEEDS SURVEY REPORT

In the September of 2008 the Devon Rural Housing Partnership with Whimple Parish Council, carried out housing needs survey in the parish. The purpose of the survey was to discover if there are a significant number of people living or working in Whimple who have not been able to obtain housing suitable to their circumstances.

#### WHAT WE ASKED FOR ......

Households were invited to complete a three-page form. This was designed to gather details of the reasons for which the current accommodation failed to meet its needs, and the type of accommodation required in the future.

#### WHAT YOU SAID......

There were a total of 292 Surveys returned, which is a response rate of 40.3%. This is a good response.

- Thirty-one households were found to be in housing need.
- Eleven households require housing immediately, or within the next year
- Twenty-one households need housing within the next three years.
- Twenty of those in housing need have incomes of under £15,000 per year.
- The biggest reason for wanting to move was setting up an independent home.
- 76% of those replying said they were in favour of a small affordable housing development for local people.

#### WHAT THE REPORT RECOMMENDS......

- Provision for the need of 31 affordable homes needs to be made in the parish.
- Twenty-five percent of properties should have one bedroom, fifty percent 2 bedrooms and twenty-five percent 3 bedrooms.

#### WHAT NOW??

The Rural Housing Enabler will work with Whimple Parish Council and East Devon District Council to work up proposals for affordable housing in Whimple.







The recent Housing Survey had a return rate of 41%, which Alan McArthur, of the Parish Council, is very pleased about. The major points from the survey revealed that there are 30 people who require housing in Whimple, but there are only 4 people registered with the East Devon Council. If any of the 30 wish to be considered for accommodation that is under the control of East Devon Council, they need to register directly with the Council.

#### Update on W.A.R.T.S.

Our last oil order was delivered on 23rd October and attracted 13 households to purchase between them 8700 litres. We managed to accomplish better than a 10% improvement on the price of a single load of 500 litres.

The next order will be placed on 8th December for delivery shortly thereafter and this time around we can expect around 30 or more households to be ordering.

Naturally we are enthusiastic about achieving an even greater economy.



# TV AERIAL SCAM UNCOVERED

UNSCRUPULOUS COMPANIES and trades people are duping consumers into believing they need upgraded aerials to receive digital TV.

Trading Standards (TS) offices around the UK say that this is currently a very popular doorstep scam, and even those who have not been cold-called by con artists are being led up the garden path.

Mystery shopping tests were carried out by Leicestershire and Dorset TS officers. Leicestershire officers found that more than a quarter of 31 aerial installers approached by its 'shoppers' claimed a new TV aerial would be needed, without even looking at the existing one. Dorset officers, who called 14 aerial installers and visited 15 electrical retailers, found nine of these gave misleading advice.

However, research carried out by Ofcom found that only five to ten per cent of households will need an aerial upgrade.

David Bull, head of Leicestershire County Council TS, said: "There are many honest aerial installers, but there are some who will aim to catch out unsuspecting and vulnerable consumers."

In both mystery shopping procedures TS officers posed as consumers, saying they had a three-year-old TV aerial and asked if a new aerial was required in preparation for the digital switchover.

Some people were told they needed a digital aerial, when there is no such thing. One electrical store wrongly recommended a new television costing £1,000, when all people need to convert an old television is a Freeview set-top box costing £20.

In Whimple, where our signals are broadcast from the Stockland mast, we are scheduled for the switch off of our Analog TV signal in May 2009, so we all will need a digital TV signal.


