

News from Whimple Stores

As you will have noticed the Post Office has now relocated to the shop. Many thanks go to Jim and Alison for their support, encouragement and for all the cake at their leaving celebration.

We have had a trainer with us for ten days to guide us through all the transactions and to make sure we could deal with everything correctly. We may all be a bit slow whilst we are learning to work with the system but we should be able to provide most of the services that were available before. We can process 98% of transactions that were previously available in the village, with exclusions being complex and large banking transactions.

We can do fishing licences, health lottery, buy & sell Euros, order other foreign currency, moneygrams, travel money cards, gift cards, itunes vouchers, mobile phone and electricity key top ups, cash withdrawals (including all Santander banks), cash and cheque deposits (please ask for envelopes if you need them), bill payments and 'drop and go' for parcels.

Currently we cannot do The National Lottery and there is a problem with the post box. Royal Mail had not sorted out any planning permission to move the box and therefore we have agreed to have a temporary box in the shop. Hopefully in 6 - 8 weeks they will have secured a permanent home for a box in the centre of the village for use 24 hours a day and not just during our opening times.

If you have visited the shop recently you will have spotted the tables and chairs as well as the waft of freshly made coffee. We are pleased that we can now offer a selection of tea and coffee either to have in the shop or to take away. Coming soon there will be freshly made sandwiches.

Just a reminder that the Post Office and shop are open for the same opening times:

Monday - Friday 7.30am - 6.00pm Saturday - 8.00am - 1.00pm

Sunday - 9.00am - 1.00pm

All bank holidays we are open 9.00am - 11.00am for the shop only.



A conversation with JOHN GRIFFITHS

John was born in Crediton but brought up in Weymouth. His father worked as a herdsman on various local farms, but chose to move into boatbuilding hence the move to Weymouth where John lived from 1964 to 1978. Ever since his schooldays John has had a love for all things music, along with buying and selling records – which he is still doing today.

John started his working life as a trainee chef for Trust House Forte, which meant that he attended college for one day a week whilst working at a hotel in Sherborne for a short time. Then the music industry called to him and he found himself as the manager of a band that went up to London to find work. John did this for some 18 months before, at the ripe age of 19, the band told him that they wanted a

19, the band told him that they wanted a new manager. He went back to buying and selling records, moving to Exeter to be near family.

John got married and had to get a 'proper job', and went into Sales, selling tights and stockings to the wholesale and retail trades – which explains a lot of things about his pantomime career here in Whimple! He moved from hosiery to an electrical company selling equipment to the building trade, which he did for some 20 years but still keeping connections with the music industry. He was divorced around this time and went to live in Payhembury for a couple of years before moving to Whimple – basically because he liked the house in Church Road that he bought, and he just wanting 'to move'. He continued with his record selling/buying business, also working closely with concert promoters.

He then decided he needed more space; this, combined with meeting Penny, meant that he made the enormous geographical leap in Whimple down the road and into the hallowed area of The Square, where he lives today. He still needed more space for his business and bought the old Hansford's undertakers office, and he refurbished the roof and the floor to create a new centre for Handsome Dicks Records (he borrowed the name from a group member when he was in management). Some 18 years ago, he extended the scope of his record business and set up a website which helped him to grow the business.

However, his first love is face to face meetings at record fairs which he attends throughout the South West whilst running and organising the fairs at Exeter and Plymouth.. In the summer, he will attend various outdoor events and sell CDs, guitars, and pop memorabilia. He will also go on record buying trips to Europe and the USA to bring in new and unusual stock. John became involved with the Parish Council via the 'back door' when there was a debate about the siting of a bus shelter in The Square – he raised his head to express an opinion (Dangerous in Whimple!) and found himself co-opted onto the Parish Council. After 4-5 years he found himself as the Chairman, and finds himself and the Parish Council having to look at different ways of doing things in the light of reduced local government budgets. Whimple has made good use of volunteers in such tasks as cutting the grass in the Square and running village 'tidy' days.

John enjoys living in Whimple because we help each other and get on together; the strong community spirit and the fact that there is always something happening in this village. In his spare time he likes to go and see bands in other local venues, and has organised several bands (with Alex Tooze) to come to the Victory Hall. He will still go up to London to see a 'special' gig; he plays golf on a weekly basis, enjoys the pubs and has been in the panto for a number of years (the final challenge for him here is to sing a song on stage! Watch this space!).

From Peter Bowden, County and District Councillor

After many days of door knocking, discussion and good cheer, votes have been cast and a new government has been elected. East Devon District Council elected 24 new councillors (out of 59) and I was delighted to be elected to the Whimple and Talaton ward. Pleased as I am to be representing you all in both District and County Councils I am aware that the next four years will prove challenging. I also wish to express my regards to Martin Gammell, who worked hard to ensure that you were properly represented and always informed. I wish him the very best for the future.



As expected, once elections were over the diary was promptly re-filled and work began in earnest. A range of meetings to welcome the new faces in council, time spent with officers to catch-up with planning applications and many calls and emails have been addressed. I have just spent two days at the Talaton formal inquiry hearing into development planned for the village. In six weeks or so the inspector will make a judgement that will require the Wisdom of Solomon to satisfy everyone who spoke, both against and in support of the application. In addition Whimple will soon have to address the eastward expansion of Cranbrook towards Cobden Lane and concern about losing even more green fields. A limit will have to be drawn somewhere. As I said in March the planned application to quarry at Straitgate is about to be published and I am a member of the committee in Devon County Council that will ultimately be called upon to decide the future of this application.

The Government has decided to review the county and district boundaries in Devon to reduce the total number of councillors in DCC to 60 in all. This has revealed a massive change in East Devon (who will not lose a councillor) wherein Whimple and Talaton detach from Broadclyst and Cranbrook and become individual parts of a single division stretching from Whimple to the Dorset border. This massive division will be called Whimple and Newbridges and will be completely rural in character. Go to the Boundary Commission website to see more and add your comments

Follow this link; www.consultation.lgbce.org.uk . Review the maps and exercise your right to comment - which ends on the 6th July. Decisions come into effect in May 2017.

Items of other news include the future of our local hospitals. Much discussion has taken place and decisions will be made in the near future. The OFSTED report into Devon County Council revealed improvements have taken place but all was not perfect. I was pleased to note that children were being properly protected and young people leaving care were receiving special attention. Of particular interest to us all is the future of our rail connections. I understand that conversations are taking place that include the ambition to be running a half hourly local service between Exeter and Axminster and direct connections to Barnstaple and Exmouth within ten years or so. (I note we still have to open Cranbrook station first)!!



Don't Become the Victim of Summer Crime

REVD HAROLD TUCKER 1922 - 2015

In the last issue of the news we reported on the death of Father Harold Tucker who was once our vicar. Harold was a dedicated steam and traction engine enthusiast. Here is a copy of an article from the 'Old Glory' magazine with a tribute to Harold.

West Country Remembers Father Harold


Known to many of our readers, Father Harold Tucker passed away peacefully on February 11 aged 93. Harold had attended almost every Great Dorset from the very first party until last year He was a founder member and past chairman of the Devon Traction Engine Club, chaplain to the Showmen's Guild (Western Section) and to the Great Dorset Steam Fair.

He was an enthusiastic supporter of the legendary Lynton 81 Barnstaple Railway and was the last remaining person alive to have travelled on the line (on the footplate!) prior to its closure in 1935.

The funeral took place at St Winwaloe Church, Poundstock, Cornwall, on February 27; bearers were George and Simon DeVey of Anderton & Rowland, Peter Phillips, Richard Evans and Steve Postlethwaite all well known in preservation circles.

As a vicar, Father Harold was a one-man band who frequently preached, played the organ and led the prayers; the bells at the funeral were rung by, among others, Cornish engine owner Dave Goodwin and RLS journal editor Steve Parrott. Reference was made to the Yelverton rally, organised by the Devon Traction Engine Club.

In the 1960s and 70s it tended to move around and one year was held at Exeter Racecourse. Father Harold helped on the pay gate, and when one local worthy turned up, having handed his money to Harold, remarked: "Well I never thought I'd see the day when I'd find a parson taking money at a racecourse on the Sabbath!"



Farewell from Tim

Favourites included chilli powder on a tossed green salad (no really, it tastes great!) and a quick remedy for scouts who have spent two hours washing dishes in cold water; chocolate digestives in a bowl of instant custard. Surprisingly, neither of these dishes featured when the Troop won the District and County cooking competitions earlier this year.

Seeing the Scouts beat Explorers at the go-cart circuit at Woodbury was obviously pretty sweet but seeing a couple of scouts take on the aeronautics badge and actually fly planes last year was even better. Also, the shooting camp run last autumn by fellow scout leader Bruce Harvey, from Ottery Troop, was a great experience for our budding marksmen and three scouts went on to achieve the Master at Arms badge.

It is difficult to pick one or two favourites out of the tens of scout camps but the 'close to nature' camp at Horner Woods in 2011 was especially memorable as scouts hand-fed lemurs, held a 15 foot python and provided sustenance for the ticks at the campsite. That brings me neatly on to recent news. For the first time in Woodjam history, the competition in May was won by a team from 1st Whimple Scouts. Our other teams also scored well and the performance of all the scouts validated the many sessions spent pioneering, orienteering, fire building, camp cooking, tent erecting and just generally working well as a team. Well done Troop!

Before Easter the Troop attended the Exeter Quay Climbing Centre and over four sessions attained their level 1 climbing certificates and in this coming half term they will be gliding. We also plan to stage a display at the Village Day this year and so please pay us a visit.

Having told Ed that I would fill a page I suspect that I have gone well over so will end by saying "Thank you" to the other scout leaders, parent-helpers and mostly to he scouts for the past six years, and to appeal for someone new to step into the role. 
