

# WHIMPLE STORES 2



We would like to say a big thank you to the people of Whimple for the ongoing support of the Stores. We have had many positive comments about the layout changes that we made at Easter and we believe that the extra space is encouraging shoppers to browse freely of our range of products. We cannot stock everything, but make an effort to provide a comprehensive range and can often get things in from suppliers if there is demand. We also make an effort to bring in 'price-marked' products, which provides both transparency on product pricing and lower prices than the same products elsewhere. For example, an 85p price marked can of drink will have a recommended price of £1.05 in other shops.

#### Dogs in Shops

We have received a number of queries as to why we allow dogs in the shop when other retailers do not and thought that we could explain this here. Food Hygiene Regulations place the responsibility on us, the owners, to determine if we can allow access by animals to the shop area, whilst preventing access to unpackaged food products where the risk of contamination is greatest. As there was already a policy set by the previous owners, and unpackaged food is out of reach, we did not wish to upset Whimple dog owners by changing the policy without justification. Most of the dogs who visit the shop are trained and very well behaved and their visit is brief. We have though had a couple of incidents, which have upset customers, and we will work with the owners to prevent these situations in the future.

#### Post Office

We have now operated Whimple Stores and Whimple Post Office for eight months and while the Stores are doing well, the Post Office continues to be a financial and personal drain on the business. Post Office Ltd. pay a small fee to us for each transaction we conduct such as selling postage or providing cash. This fee covers approximately a third of the staff cost to manage the transaction. The rest of the staff cost is subsidised by ourselves. There are a lot of other activities that we are required to perform which are unpaid, and the till system (Horizon) is so complex that it can only be used by shop staff after undergoing extensive training at our cost. It also provides a large financial risk to us if a staff member makes a mistake. We believe that the business model of Post Office Ltd. in regards to small shops is exploitative and we cannot continue to subsidise this facility.

We are now undertaking a review of how we can continue to provide essential community banking services using a less complex till system and provide postal services through alternative providers. We will run a consultation meeting with Whimple Village in the late summer / early Autumn to lay out our proposals for alternative services. We will provide more information from the Stores once the consultation date has been finalised.



Hello my friends,

What is the difference between a house and a home? Well, I suppose one is a place you live, and one is a place you feel grounded, welcome, safe, part of something. Builders create houses, people make homes. The difference is like that between a group of houses, say an estate, and a community. Estates are built, but communities need to be nurtured. Ironically, both require the supply of labour and materials. Houses need bricks, blocks, timber and cement, ground workers, bricklayers and carpenters plus numerous other trades. Communities require empathy, trust, compassion, time and people who care.

Whimple is an ancient village, the church for example dates back hundreds of years and the village would have been there then. Over those hundreds of years it has changed and changed again, houses being built and rebuilt, businesses coming and going, farming practices changed, diversified, roads built and improved upon, the railway line added, station opened, new families arrived and others moved on. The stories of every village are unique, but they also reflect, and are woven into, the fabric of the history of our county and country - history is literally made by people like you and I. This history is not only written in local papers, books and articles, legal documents, and publications held by our very own History Society, but also in the graves, monuments and church registers of births, marriages, and deaths.

It is the history of these individuals and families, their lives, loves, losses, hopes and dreams which contribute to a community. The everyday dramas which somehow inhabit the very fabric of a place and give it meaning. There is an old saying 'if a tree falls in the forest and no one is there to hear it, does it make a sound?'. Well, in a very similar way, without people, without community, does a place have a soul? Without community a place to live becomes just a dormitory. It is at times of national importance, both good and bad, that the difference between 'a place where people happen to live' and a community comes to the fore, during a pandemic, a war or a Jubilee for example. Then the people in that place come together to support, sustain or celebrate, to share a sense of what makes life important.

However, communities don't just 'happen', they do not somehow appear on their own, they are created by the hard work of those who care about a place, who care about building and sustaining a place they love. These people believe that that is something special, something worth cherishing.

So this month I would like to dedicate this short piece to all of those individuals and groups in our village who make community happen, the organisations like our school, hall, cricket club, history society, doctors surgery, pub, shop and other business, the many clubs and associations and individuals, too many to name (and, of course, our church).

It is these village groups and individuals which are the building blocks of our community and it is all of you, who are the work force who construct and nurture it, who make Whimple a place where folks want to live and feel loved. This work goes on, often unseen, day in and day out, behind the scenes of village life. Please know what you do makes a difference and through your hard work you make the world a better place for all of us to be part of.



# A Window on Whimple's Weather – March/April 2022

Welcome to the next instalment of weather summaries from Whimple's two weather stations;

Slewton Crescent and Cobden Lane. This report presents data collated from both sources.

May – After an exceptionally dry April, May delivered 52.8 mm of rainfall, slightly lower than an average of 59mm, the wettest day being the 30th, when 10.9mm of rain fell. Met office warnings of thunderstorms on the 15th & 16th did not significantly materialise around Whimple. Following a chilly start to the month (maximum daytime temperatures around 10°C), temperatures climbed in the first week to a very pleasant 22°C on the 7th; the warmest day. Nights were quite cool at the end of the month with the 28th being the coldest with a low of 4.3°C. However, overall, the temperatures and sunshine were all slightly below average for May.

June – brought some welcome sunshine for the start of the Platinum Jubilee weekend celebrations, though the Saturday and Sunday, whilst cloudy with a few light showers, turned out mostly dry! The month started clear and cool with the coldest night on 1st (3.6°C). Daytime temperatures climbed to an exceptionally hot 31.9°C on the17th, the warmest day of the year, triggering Met Office weather warnings for heat. Total sunshine for June was slightly higher than average whilst rainfall at 46.5mm was slightly lower. The tail end of Tropical Storm Alex threatened Scotland with severe gales and produced Whimple's windiest day on the 8th, with sustained gusts of over 48kph.



**By-election result** 

The Liberal Democrats did well in Tiverton & Honiton By-election in our neighbouring constituency on the 23rd June. Richard Foord took the seat from the Conservative party with more than 22,000 votes, which was a swing of almost 30%. A decisive result in this part of Devon.

#### Ukraine

Following on from the last edition, currently there are now at least four households in Whimple hosting Ukrainians, who have arrived in the past couple of months. All are settling in well and have received a warm welcome by the village. Some have already found local work, and they are all enjoying the amazing weather and the beautiful, peaceful Devon countryside. Let's keep the Blue and Yellow flag flying in Whimple.

Cranbrook a brief history

In the 1980s, against the background of a buoyant housing market, proposals came from the private sector to develop new towns and new villages in the UK especially in the South. These were to be 'balanced communities' developed to a high standard of design, extensively established by a consortium of house builders. This was known as the 'Developer Led approach' which is now a discredited form of development. In 2007 the concept was turning into a reality, when the 'go ahead' for five new Eco-towns was established - a policy to increase the numbers of housing stock. It was always intended to be a New Town. Building work began at Cranbrook in June 2011 and the first residents moved in during the summer of 2012. The original Town was set between the old A30, London Road and the Waterloo railway line for Exeter. However, plans were submitted for four additional developments, which form part of the Master Plan for Cranbrook. The others being: Treasbeare (south of London Road), Bluehayes to the west side of Cranbrook, the Grange to the east of Rockbeare and Cobdens, to the East of Cranbrook. It is understood that the original site for the Town Centre has shifted nearer to the London Road, adjacent to the Cranberry Farm PH.

The Town centre site has been fenced off, extensively to get the Morrison's supermarket built, but the other retail shops could be a long time coming. There should have been a pledge to build the two elements together.

POW+R group has made several responses over the years and more recently challenged the approach of the Planning Inspector. At this point in time, there is no news on the four added developments, although the expectation is the summer of 2022, which could include a number of modifications to the Plan. As it stands, the planning application of Cobden Estate, includes a section of 500 homes in the Parish of Whimple.

At present there is no decision made on Planning Application Ref: 22/0783/MFUL for the Solar Farm.

### Neighbourhood Plan

The original hard copies of the village questionnaire have been downloaded onto the on-line survey, so the data is ready for analysis. There are a cluster of replies to the letters sent to over 100 other organisations, local authorities, businesses and statutory bodies.

The NP Team has now built a larger team to focus on the key subject areas of the plan, using their individual expertise as much as possible. We will make reference to other approved NP's, the 2018 village survey, the feedback from the public at our Village Hall event and the data captured through the questionnaire process. We are still getting some responses from the other organisations. The progress will all be reviewed each month to ensure we are on track for the 31<sup>st</sup> October completion of the draft NP. There will also be a chance to engage with villagers to seek feedback to the Draft Neighbourhood Plan. This is being done with consideration to the EDDC local plan and we are working with a Senior Planning Officer to ensure good communication.

If you want to be part of the process to 'Protect our Whimple and Rockbeare' we'd love to hear from you! The Neighbourhood Plan will be achieved by: Ambition, Determination, Cooperation **and you.**





# Tale Valley Choir. St Mary's Church Whimple. Sunday 3rd July 22 Emma Palmer and the Tale Valley Choir have done it again!

When I first wrote about T.V.C. in July 2018 the choir was not so long in the tooth as it is now. They were good then and many audience members left their concerts with smiles on their faces.

This time was the same but also the choir, justifiably, had broad smiles on their faces. They work hard – I know – I am a groupie with a chorister spouse.

Four years on since I first saw them, with a pandemic in between, they are even better. They are all together as one. The basses and tenors sing as one with the sopranos and altos.

'At last' says Emma to herself in a quiet moment.

The choristers sing without score folders. Stories that Emma wears the words on her front (back to the audience) are greatly exaggerated,...but legible...at a distance..

Beginning with works written in the 11<sup>th</sup> Century through to 'modern' composers like Purcell [1690] they sang in many tongues; Latin, Spanish, French as well as Olde English and (new) English.

The men sang a stirring Purcell [1690] in the round, "I Gave her Cakes". Some time before that was "Greensleeves", purportedly Elizabethan, and Your Hay It is Mowed with Robert, soloing from the pulpit.

The concert began at the back of the church with **O Virtus Sapientiae** a Latin Plainsong written around the early 11<sup>th</sup> Century

They ended with more Latin ,O Lux Beata, which came from the 4th Century

There are others of course. Mournful songs but nevertheless beautiful. Ay! Linda Amiga - Spanish and Weep O Mine Eyes - English.

There was also an old favourite in the form of Pleasant and Delightful known by the likes of me as 'Nancy', where the men and women part and talk to each other in song.

The Whimple folk I spoke to were all enthusiastic. The most notable were: 'I never expected to enjoy it so much. I really came along to support the choir. But it was marvellous and it brought tears to my eyes' and:- 'It was pretty ancient stuff and I thought I would just have to sit it out to support somebody in the choir. Well it was pretty amazing.'

Emma Palmer finally seems to have cracked the use of a tuning fork without having to succumb to surgery.




