

Have you ever come across this remedy for a fit of the blues? It is a very simple cure – to look only at the good things around us. I remember vividly the story of that admirable garden raconteur Canon Ellacombe, who was always full of good advice and country common sense. He must have enjoyed a good lunch with a bowl of roses on his dining table when he wrote in June 1871, 'Is there any other month in the year when you can enjoy a triplet of good things from the garden - including a plate full of lovely green peas and a bowl of bright red strawberries? A feast fit for a king. '

Nowadays it seems to me that we get roses, green peas and strawberries all the year round and we do not experience the same delight. But for me, I still have a great feeling of joy when I go into my garden in The Square and see and smell my roses and hear the concert of my birds. As my sight is failing I cannot sit in the peace of the garden reading a book but I have discovered a new great pleasure. Armed with my pocket radio, I listen to classical music gently, and I am not alone as the birds join in as well.

When friendship is rooted fast, it is a plant that no storm can blast and I am blessed with many friends in the village.

The under manager at Nestlé provided us with shilling tickets for the 'Gods' in The Royal Opera House at Covent Garden. As our digs were in West Ealing we often walked all the way home from the great metropolis.

Subsequently, when I married and lived in Brown's Hotel just off Piccadilly Street, I discovered another great aspect of London walking - which was in the magnificent parks. We spent many a pleasurable hour savouring the peace and quiet, away from the hustle and bustle of constant city traffic.

What fun we had; unfortunately, at 92 I am now the only survivor of those days - but I do have my memories.

It takes days of practice to learn the art of sauntering. Commonly we stride through the out-of-doors too swiftly To see more than the most obvious and prominent things. For observing nature, the best pace is a snail's pace.

The village wanted a magazine and that is how the Whimple News was started on a shoestring. We had such a good team. I will never forget Andrew Hughes receiving the copy to print on his photocopier. Can you imagine the hundreds of pages that he printed? That photocopier worked overtime, and then a new team took over led by David and Sarah Smith, and then Peter Smith became the editor. The magazine is still distributed free of charge to every household – what an achievement!

I feel now that I am in my 93rd year with failing sight, that it is time for me to step down gracefully with my last article of farewell. A great number of those stories were published in my book with the same title, (for my 85th birthday) with a very successful launch – all the 1,000 books printed have been sold for charity.

I have enjoyed these last 25 years immensely – my readers are so faithful and encouraging. Thank you for your friendship. I am still here in the Old Manse.



WHIMPLE TENNIS CLUB - A BRIEF HISTORY

The earliest records date from 1946 when the village Tennis Club did not have a permanent home, but played its games and East Devon League matches on courts (mainly grass) in and around the village such as the Old Rectory, Woodhayes and the poultry farm at Straightwayhead owned by Mr Rastall. There was also a hard court built by Lewis's the local builders on grounds behind The Croft in Village Road.

This continued throughout the 1950's and into the early 1960's when the membership of the club averaged about 20 Seniors and 18 Juniors. The Club was in need of a permanent home because of the regular matches it continued to play in the East Devon League. A site to build a new court next to the Victory Hall was offered by Whiteways Cider Company and the old cricket ground also became a possibility, but both were neither popular nor practical. Eventually Mr Eric Whiteway offered a piece of rough ground immediately behind Fordton Farm, with the entrance off Knowle Cross Road.

Fund raising for construction of the new court began in earnest in 1957 and various sports and recreational grants and loans were applied for. There were a variety of fund raising activities including dances, concerts, whist drives, jumble sales, skittles and raffles. Planning permission was granted in 1960 and in the following year members undertook the clearing of the site ready for levelling. In 1962 the site was levelled by a bulldozer from Broadhembury and members erected fencing and laid field drains around the perimeter. In May of the same year the En Tout Cas Company finally laid a Gragreen Bitumous hardcourt. The dimensions of the site only allowed for the court to run East to West - not ideal on sunny days as players will know! The total cost of all the works including the fencing and drainage was just short of £800.

A small pavilion was also erected, costing £28, and two hardwood bench seats were generously presented by one of the original members of the Club, Mrs Peggy Wyld, in memory of her late husband. The court was officially opened on Saturday 30th June 1962 by the Secretary of the Devon Lawn Tennis Association.

The Tennis Club leases the ground from Whimple Recreational Trust who are, in effect, the landlords. A small annual rent is paid. The current 30 year lease is due for renewal in May 2013.

In 1970 the small pavilion was replaced with a larger one which cost £164 and a small wooden structure with an Elsan toilet was also erected at the far end of the court.

For some unknown reason the Club went through a bit of a crisis in 1973 as there were only 10 adult and 4 junior members!

After 22 years use the court began to show signs of real wear and tear and it was resurfaced and repainted in 1984 by Constable Hart Ltd for £3,507, with the assistance of grants from the Sports Council and East Devon District Council.

In 1986 the old pavilion was replaced with the current one and in 1987 the perimeter fencing was also completely renewed.

In September 1990, 6 years after the previous repaint, the court was again repainted by Colour Court from Bristol for £694.

In 1997 the court was again in need of resurfacing and painting, some 13 years since its previous resurfacing in 1984. This was slightly short of the expected lifespan of such a hard court.

10 years later, in 2007, the court again needed repainting and this was undertaken by Avon Road Mark Ltd of Yate, near Bristol at a cost of £1,441.

A new net and centre strap band were purchased in 2008 from Sweatband and Knowle Nets of Bridport for £74 and a new brass winder handle from Edwards Sports of Bridport for £60.

In Spring 2009 it was decided to task a professional company to try and clear the court of the perennial and increasing problem of moss. This was done by Surface Cleaning Services from Dorset and cost £444. The gate and sections of the perimeter fencing were also repaired by Atlas Fencing of Feniton for £782.

Additionally in 2009 flagstones were laid immediately in front of the clubhouse, together with a gravel path from the road entrance gate to the clubhouse, at a cost of £558.

In 2010, to keep the moss under control, the court was again cleaned professionally. In addition some small patches of crumbling tarmac were made good and repainted and sections of the fencing tightened up by replacing some of the old winches and clips. This was carried out by Surface Cleaning Services at a cost of £580.

The court is still in a fair condition and plays quite well. However it is very likely that the Club will be faced with a complete resurface within the next 2/3 years with an anticipated cost of approximately £10,000 plus VAT. Over the years the Club has been building up its funds in expectation of this and currently has a healthy balance of £9,670.

Membership has grown since 2002 as the village has become bigger. It has fluctuated between 70 and 130. Prior to 2002 the figures were much lower. Total membership for 2010/11 was 105. These figures include both Seniors and Juniors.

ROBIN TUCK

It is with sadness that we mark the passing of Robin Tuck.

Robin was born on 25th July 1931 so narrowly missed becoming an octogenarian. In his younger days he was in the Royal Marines. In a sense we might say he never left them. His father bought him out before he completed his service, to join the family building business. He did a number of other jobs, including in an electroplating firm; it was almost as if he tackled a job, measured himself up against the requirements to his own satisfaction, then said, "I've done that, what shall I attempt next?" But it was the Royal Marines which had a formative influence on him, giving him a disciplined identity which stayed with him the rest of his life as he made his own way independently. He kept up with his old comrades and met new ones at the White Ensign Club in Exeter, and many of them came to his funeral to pay tribute to his memory. He went to an open day on H.M.S. "Exeter" when it was moored in Torbay with a neighbour an ex-H.O. Royal Navy rating and an ex-Marine parachutist; the Lieutenant who guided them round the ship was very interested in comparing notes as to what life was like aboard in Robin's day.

Robin met Sadie at a dance in Cookham Dean, Berkshire, and after they married they moved together to several different places, and after retirement went to Spain to live in the English community in the Spanish sunshine. But the longest they lived in one place was in Bramley Gardens.

There used to be a song, "It ain't what you do, it's the way that you do it," and that was personified by Robin, as whatever he did it was done in a highly focussed way, very disciplined, paying attention to every detail in planning and meticulous in execution.





Veterinary Services at Whimple

The Vale Veterinary Centre has provided veterinary services in Whimple for the last 20 years. Having started from humble beginnings at lvydene, we moved into part of Brook House in the mid-1990s. This building allowed us to improve the services we offered with more space and some basic surgical and kennelling facilities.



The ethos of the practice is to provide excellent veterinary care for our clients and their pets and this means that we want to be able to offer the full range of veterinary services for 24 hours a day. Whilst we have tried to do this within the constraints of the building in Whimple, it has not been possible to develop this to the level that we want to be able to offer our clients.

In March 2011 we opened our new practice in Honiton. Located on the Heathpark Industrial Estate, it is just 10 minutes drive from our present Whimple Surgery. These brand new facilities are fully staffed with familiar veterinary surgeons, nurses and reception staff. The new practice will be running consultations throughout the day between 8.30am and 6pm Monday to Friday, a late night clinic until 8pm on Thursdays, and on Saturday mornings from 9am till 1pm. We continue to provide a full 24 hour emergency service.

The Honiton surgery has three consulting rooms offering consultations at convenient times throughout the day. It has full diagnostic equipment that includes x-ray, ultrasound, and in-house blood analysis that can provide immediate results for interpretation by our clinicians. With its separate cat and dog hospitalisation wards and its own operating theatre, it is designed to provide full inhouse surgical facilities. This means that any routine surgical procedures, including neutering and dental work, as well as emergency diagnostic investigations and surgery, can be carried out at Honiton. Now that we are able to offer a complete veterinary service at Honiton, we will be closing the Whimple clinic on May 28th.

To thank you for your continued custom, when you register with the Honiton centre you will receive £10 off any veterinary services. For clients who find Honiton difficult to get to, we would like to offer free nurse visits and a drop off service for repeat prescriptions for your pets. We will also continue to offer house visits to your pets by a veterinary surgeon if you are unable to get to the surgery. We will continue to offer a 24 hour emergency service, as we do at present.





Here are two stories, almost certainly fanciful, about the origins of these much enjoyed foods.


