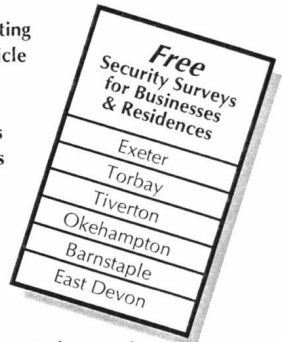

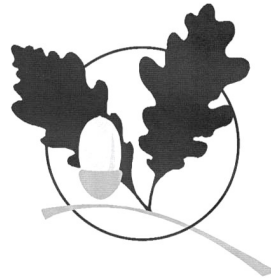

It really does make such a difference having that support and knowing that we were all fundraising for such a brilliant charity as Hospiscare. With your support and donations, we can now confirm that we have raised an incredible £4604.03. We have achieved and then, smashed through the target. A massive thank you to everyone who has supported us in any way.

Within minutes of finishing the London Marathon we received a text inviting us to try for a Ballot place for the 2020 London Marathon....and yes...we hope to go again in the 40th anniversary of this amazing event. We hope to be raising money again for Hospiscare (if they'll have us!!) and if not, we will try for one of the other amazing charity places available.

We'll be back!

Whimble Neighbourhood Plan –

Whimble, as can be seen from the recent Cranbrook Expansion Plan, is under pressure from developers and EDDC to build close to and even in the parish. If the parish wants to have some control over the development that is allowed/not allowed to happen then we need to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan. The Plan will set out what development would be acceptable and what additional facilities are needed to ensure that the quality of life in the parish continues to be of a high standard. The Parish Council started the process of establishing a Neighbourhood Plan for Whimble last year with an online survey (and a paper version) to gather resident's views.

I thought it may be useful to answer a few questions that I picked up in meetings and email exchanges over the past weeks.

Q. What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

A. Neighbourhood planning is a way for communities to take a proactive approach to deciding the future of the places where they live and work. Communities can use a neighbourhood plan to help shape the future development and use of land in their neighbourhood. This includes the development of homes, shops, offices and infrastructure.

Q. Who Produces a Neighbourhood Plan?

A. Anyone can identify the need for neighbourhood planning. However, only the relevant parish or town council can initiate this and in doing so, they will be responsible for the progression of the work required, in consultation and interaction with the local community.

Q. How can I get involved?

A. The Parish Council has already been contacted by some residents with a wide range of skills that they can now bring to the next stage of the process. If you feel you can contribute either by having specific skills (such as legal, planning, experience of NP's) or more practical skills (such as leaflet production, assisting in further resident consultation, helping with delivery to households, helping with public meetings, being part of a steering/project group, etc.) please email Kevin Finch, Parish Clerk, whimbleparishcouncil@gmail.com. Please give an idea of what you can do to help. A list will be compiled and more details will follow.

Q. What is the aim of the Whimble Neighbourhood Plan process?

A. The aim is to gather views to produce a plan that will decide the future of the Parish and give a clear direction to all, including EDDC and DCC. The Plan will look to establish:-

- **Policies on development in the right places, the Parish Boundary, Green Open spaces and infrastructure**
- **A Policy to protect the Green Wedge**
- **Policies to protect the rural nature of our Parish and areas such as woodlands, trees, hedgerows and Devon Banks**
- **Policies to support flood defence**
- **A policy to protect views and vistas**

– IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Q. Is there going to be another opportunity to feedback my views?

A. The Parish Council is now seeking residents with the skills and knowledge to come forward to join them in forming a new Neighbourhood Plan working party to drive forward the plan. The new group will engage with residents in numerous ways to collate additional feedback

The previous online survey was closed last year with 167 responses and the results analysed. This will shortly be available for all to see on the Parish website. Thank you to Mark Evans Martin, Chris Olive and Todd Olive for their hard work in producing the survey.

Q. How long does it take to produce a Neighbourhood Plan?

A. To draw up an effective neighbourhood plan it is essential to gather the views and opinions of as many residents as possible. From the further consultation exercises that will be agreed and rolled out, a timeframe will be drawn up leading to the public referendum of the plan.

As an example Rockbeare Parish Council recently completed their NP. Their Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group produced a plan over 4 years based on the wishes of Parish residents. By combining surveys, exhibitions, consultations and newsletters they arrived at a final plan that was guided and supported by the community and supported by neighbouring councils. The plan was then put to a referendum and voted on successfully and the Plan adopted by EDDC.

Q. How will residents be informed of progress?

A. At each stage of the Plan notices will be placed on the Parish Notice Board in the Square, on the Parish Website, in the Whimple what's On Facebook page and in Whimple News. It may be possible that the new steering group, with the support of a band of willing volunteers, are able to produce leaflet drops to householders at various stages of the plan.

Q. What next?

A. As mentioned on the previous page - If you feel you can contribute either by having specific skills (such as legal, planning, experience of NP's) or more practical skills (such as leaflet production, assisting in gathering further resident feedback, helping with delivery to households, helping with public meetings, being part of a steering/project group, etc.) please email Kevin Finch, Parish Clerk. Please give me an idea of what you can do to help. A list will be compiled and more details will follow.

Healthy summer salad

Friends of ours recently went to Italy on holiday. Before going their diets included meat at most meals. However, during their visit they started eating more fresh vegetables, fruits and fish. When they got home they decided to continue this regime and found they were feeling better, had more energy and even lost some weight too. We all know there is plenty of evidence to show that eating a Mediterranean diet is great for our overall health and wellbeing. Eating more plant based foods will help your digestive system, your heart health and your cognitive function. So I thought I would share another recipe this month that is both very tasty and easy to prepare. Go on, give it a try and see what you think. It is lovely as a main dish or can easily be used on the side with chicken or fish and new potatoes.

Baby Beetroot and Carrot Salad

Ingredients:

Salad ingredients	Dressing
12 raw baby beetroots	1 Tbsp raw cider vinegar
8 baby carrots	3 Tbsp olive oil or walnut oil
1 tsp caraway or fennel seeds	Freshly ground black pepper
3 Tbsp olive oil or extra virgin coconut oil (melted)	Sea salt to taste
1 Tbsp raw cider vinegar	
4 walnut halves broken into pieces	
1 handful of lettuce, rocket or watercress leaves	
150 g goat's cheese	

Method:

Preheat oven to 200°C/190°C fan/Gas mark 6 for the beetroots and carrots. Place a large sheet of baking parchment on top of a large sheet of foil. Place the beetroots and carrots on the baking parchment and drizzle oil and vinegar on top then add caraway or fennel seeds. Wrap the beetroot and carrots in parchment and foil and roast for 45 - 60 minutes or until tender.

Make the dressing by whisking ingredients together. Prepare a plate with salad leaves of choice and sprinkle goats cheese and broken walnuts on top. Add beetroots and carrots and mix together. Drizzle dressing on top and add herbs of choice to add a bit of zing. If you have any green vegetables to hand such as mangetout, fresh peas or asparagus, simply steam those and add them to your salad.

Coleridge Medical Centre Patient Participation Group April, 2019

The main business was discussion of the recent patient questionnaire. The participants were all attending the surgery for appointments at the time. All information was anonymous and most were filled them in in the waiting room. A variety of statistics were gathered, including a rough age bracket, gender, ethnicity and their own perspective on their mental and physical health. Nearly twice as many women as men responded and ages ranged from under 21 to over 80 with 29% in the 71 to 80 age bracket. A large space was reserved for comments on any aspect of the service or functioning of the practice as a whole.

Almost 50% rated Coleridge, in general, as helpful, professional, and friendly. Many contributors to the survey identified changes or improvements which could be beneficial. These ranged from better parking provision (10%), shorter waiting times to see 'own doctor' (9%) and difficulty getting appointments (2.15%). Many other subjects were, of course, flagged up but with smaller percentages, including improved music in the waiting room (1.5%), more time with Doctor (0.9%) and better signage in the surgery (0.61%) to mention a few. These issues will be considered by the PPG in due course. One improvement already actioned has been provision of solar film on the glass roof instead of blinds, though this may have already been in the pipeline? We will report on further progress.

The data already gathered may be used in further surveys and could provide future targets.

Dr de Sousa reported the establishment of a Primary Network comprising Coleridge, Sidmouth and Honiton surgeries. This will enable patients to access a doctor at weekends. So far no numbers are available. It is also hoped to have an expanded role for pharmacists in future and possibly to have a physiotherapist attached to the practise. Another new initiative will be the attachment of a student nurse to the practice for work experience.

The next meeting will be held in the early evening and, hopefully, this will encourage other people to join the PPG. Details are on the surgery notice board. **Linda Martin**

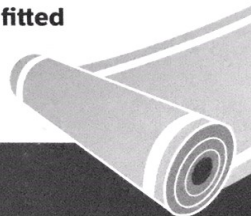

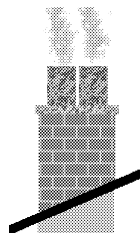

Some Background on the Victory Hall

What is Whimble Victory Hall?

The land and building were given to the village in 1920, in trust, 'for the purpose of a village hall for the use of the inhabitants of Whimble and the neighbourhood thereof' to celebrate victory in World War One and as a memorial to those from the village who lost their lives in the conflict.

It was originally a second-hand, prefabricated wooden YMCA hut which has since been improved and extended.

What is its legal status?

It is a registered charity.

Who runs it?

It is managed by trustees drawn from the users of the hall plus a small number of trustees elected annually at the AGM each September. All trustees are unpaid volunteers.

Who owns it?

The 'deeds' are held by the Parish Council on behalf of the village. The Parish Council is the 'Custodian Trustee' whose function is solely to hold the charity's property. It has no power to make management decisions and acts on the instructions of the managing trustees.

Who decides what the trustees can and cannot do?

The scope and responsibilities of the trustees are set out in its 'Governing document' which is currently a constitution approved by the Charity Commission in 1965. The trustees are each personally accountable to the Charity Commission for operating within that constitution.

Who uses the Hall?

There are 20 regular users and many more occasional users

What is Hallmark?

Hallmark is a national Quality Assurance scheme specifically designed for Village Halls which provides 3 levels of award. Each Hall may be rated from Level 1 to Level 3 (the highest level of award). Whimble Victory Hall has achieved Levels 1 and 2. Level 3 would require, amongst other things, significant changes to the structure of the building to meet energy efficiency criteria.

How is it financed?

The hall is entirely self-financing. Rental from regular and occasional users is used to pay for day-to-day running and maintenance. This is supplemented by fund-raising events such as Soup'n'Sarnie and occasional donations. We try to obtain grants when we undertake capital projects but these only pay for part of the work. Most of the money we have to raise ourselves.

Garden open for Hospiscare

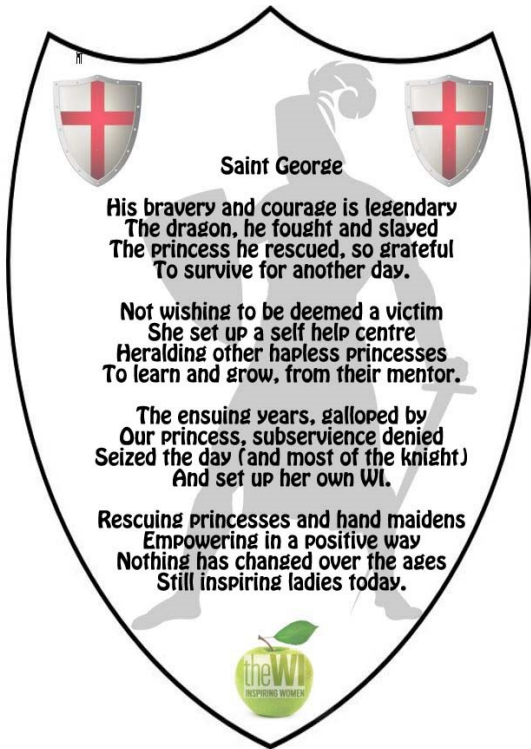

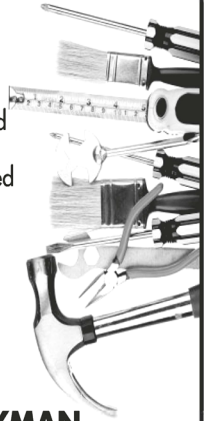

About the Competition

1. A knock-out tournament with as many rounds as required depending on entry numbers.
2. The tournament is open to all club members, new members welcome.
3. Individual competitors may enter the doubles tournament and be given a partner if possible
