Whimple Stores continues to develop and provide a well stocked range of goods and services to the people of Whimple and surrounding areas, as well as our very welcome cyclists and walkers who have put a Whimple stop on their cycling or walking routes.

We have added Oak Park Dairy Milk to our stock, with deliveries to us on Tuesdays and Fridays. This has been a very successful new product and everyone who purchases this milk loves the quality and has quickly become used to the "bottle swapping" process.

If you are yet to experience milk that tastes like it used to many years ago, come in and purchase the milk in a returnable glass bottle (1 litre). You purchase the bottle as well and then swap the bottle when it is empty for a full one. You can, of course, get a refund on the bottle if you wish. The empties go back to the Dairy, for cleaning, sterilising and refilling. The milk is not homogenised, so the cream rises to the top and the milk is delicious. We also do their cream, which is thick and tasty.

If you wondered what we have done with the old Post Office counter, it is now the source material for the creative talents of the men in the Men's Shed in Ottery St Mary. Men's Shed is a community space where men can connect with each other, chat and create new objects from old materials and it does wonders for the mental health of the participants. We are glad to support this wonderful charity, even in a small way.

The Post Office space has now been converted into new racking so that we can increase our portfolio of wine, cider, beer and seasonal goods. If you like a particular drink that we don't stock, please let us know. At customer request, we now stock zero percent alcohol wine and beer (McGuigan Sauvignon Blanc, Peroni and Guinness), for our customers who wish to be alcohol-free, while enjoying the same taste. Great option if you are the designated driver for a night out.

We are planning to install a drinks chiller, ready for summer, and to move the canned drinks from the large fridge. Electricity costs have increased four-fold and are killing small shops like us. We hope that a dedicated chiller will be more cost effective than the large fridge, when the doors are frequently opened to access drinks.

Our Bill Payment machine from Payzone, which we have leased, is in use and is covering rent payments, council tax bills and electricity key top-ups. We hope to add gift cards soon. We also sell the main postage stamps and provide cash withdrawals (with a small fee). No news as yet on a parcel service.

We have worked hard with our local providers to overcome some of the food shortages that have been in the news recently. Eggs have become scarce and expensive in the main supermarkets but we have plenty. We stocked peppers, cucumbers and tomatoes during the shortages and we have kept the price of kindling and logs low when the prices doubled in the supermarkets.

Don't forget that we also stock products that are themed around events such as Mothers Day, Chinese (Lunar) New Year, Easter etc.

Thank you to all of our customers who support us. Whimple Stores is a central and essential part of the village but it can only survive for the village if the whole village uses it. While we cannot replace the "big supermarket trip" that is needed to feed the family, we have a wide range of goods that are competitively priced, well stocked, local and fresh.



Dear Whimple Residents

As your District Councillor I would take this opportunity to wish you all a Happy Easter.

As you know I previously served as a Whimple Parish Councillor, I worked with the POW&R Group, and for the past 2 years have been District Councillor for the Ward of Whimple and Rockbeare. During this time, I have taken on board a number of issues important to the wellbeing of residents and local businesses. I am also passionate about village maintenance and play areas, and in recent years I have helped make funds available for these purposes.



In a recent survey it was made clear by residents that by far the biggest issue of concern is the loss of our natural green space to the overdevelopment and industrialisation of our green and pleasant land. I agree that we need more housing but it has to be the right type of housing and to satisfy local need, not just the greed of developers.

We need 'proper' affordable housing so that we can encourage our young families to live in the village. This is vital if we are to retain local facilities such as the village school, village shop and railway station.

I also agree with the production of renewable energy, but solar panels should be on rooves of buildings and on brownfield sites, not by taking more of our best and most versatile farmland for so-called 'Solar Farms'.

Our villages and surrounding areas are going to be under considerable threat for some time to come and I feel that as a Member of both the Planning and Strategic Planning Committees I have the right knowledge and understanding to ensure that the wishes of our Residents are at the forefront of any development decisions.

Being a District Councillor is not about politics, it's about doing the best for the people you represent, irrespective of political persuasion. I hope you will allow me to use the considerable experience I have gained to date and give me the opportunity to continue to work hard for the benefit of Whimple and Rockbeare.

If you share the same passion and dreams as I do, please vote for me in the East Devon District Council Elections on May 4° 2023.



WHIMPLE VICTORY HALL at the heart of the community

Registered Charity 291496

Did you know that Whimple Victory Hall is a registered charity? Did you also know that the Trustees are volunteers dedicated to ensuring the hall is kept in good condition and accessible to all? And finally, did you know that to maintain and improve the building we rely purely on revenue received from bookings, donations, fundraising events and grants: we do not receive money from any other source.

You can see we have quite a task maintaining our 100 year old hall; a task that I have been made acutely aware of since I took on the role as Chairman of Trustees 18 months ago.

However, we have not been sitting on our laurels. Our aim in the coming years is to ensure Whimple has a village hall fit for community life in the 21st century.

So what have we been up to?

- 1. We started with a couple of small projects and successfully applied to the Devon Freemasons, Wake Fund, receiving £1,500 to repair the cushions and replace the baize cloth on the snooker table in the Billiard room. We also set about improving the ladies toilets.
- 2. The hall owned very little Audio-visual equipment and hirers wanting to give a presentation, play music or show a film either brought their own equipment or we had to scurry around finding what was required. No more! A £10,000 grant from the Peoples Lottery Fund along with £3,800 from hall funds has allowed us to install a good quality, super-duper new AV system including an electric screen, ceiling mounted projector, speakers and microphones all connecting via Bluetooth or plugged in, in the conventional way. To compliment the use of the system we will be purchasing a Performing Rights Society (PRS for Music) License, this will allow the use of streamed and other sources of music at the hall. So book yourself a party or a music event and have some fun.
- 3. The traditional **1947** red telephone box in the hall car park, donated to us by Rosemary Street is soon to be refurbished as a community book exchange. Restoration will be to a high standard and will cost around £1,800. After a year or more of fundraising, donations and a grant of £125 from the Parish Council, I am pleased to say we now have all the funds required.
- 4. We have also applied for a grant from the Queens Platinum Jubilee Fund (for the improvement of older village halls), to fund the replacement of the roof over the main hall. The application is still in the pipeline and I will update you next time. Sadly, the grant will only cover 20% of the total costs so our own funds will be needed. If successful, the work be carried out in the school summer holiday 2024.

5. Plans to build a new small hall on the North side of the building (car park side) are also underway. We currently have £140,000 in our building fund but some of this will be needed to cover the excess cost of the roof too – so we have some decisions to make before moving on to the next stage. We hope the village will be supportive when we start formally fundraising for this project.

A Window on Whimple's Weather – January/February 2023

Welcome to the first weather report of 2023 from Whimple's two weather stations.

Live and historical data sets are available for each station, through the links, above.

The start of 2023 saw unsettled, mild and very wet weather; followed by several weeks of stable, high-pressure systems leading to only one named storm to be declared (Otto); a relatively mild winter storm that mostly affected Northern UK areas on 17th February. This is in stark contrast to 2021/2022 when there were 7 named storms, 3 being named in one week in February! Consequently, much to the relief of many an insurance company, this made the 2022/2023 storm season by far the quietest since UK storm naming began in 2015.

According to the BBC – "The UK's lack of named storms this season is likely to be due to the position of the Polar jet stream, a ribbon of strong winds high in the atmosphere that create and drive weather systems across the Atlantic to northwest Europe."

January – The very mild late December weather continued well into January, with temperatures well above average, before becoming colder on the 15th; also being the wettest day of the month with 16mm of rain. Though the overall rainfall for January was slightly above average (97mm); almost all of that rain (94.2mm) fell up to the 16th; making the first half of the month one of the wettest and the second half of month one of the driest on record. Stable, high-pressure weather systems then took hold, causing temperatures to remain low (the lowest being -5.4 °C on the 21st) and 30% above average sunshine.

February – Stable, high pressure continued to dominate much of the month resulting in February being the driest for 30 years (10mm of rainfall as opposed to an average of 63mm) and very mild (5th mildest on record), with slightly above average sunshine.

TAKE TEN QUESTIONS WITH

Daphne Pemberton has had a really interesting life. There is far too much to include here but I hope this interview illustrates her pride in her family, alongside her love of country life and animals, especially horses. I hope you enjoy finding out more about another of our Whimple residents.



Q1: So, how did it all start, Daphne? Tell me about your childhood.

I was evacuated from SE London in the war, with my adoptive parents. My father was a senior master and he brought the whole school down to Staverton, near Totnes. I was 5 yrs old and attended the village school. We stayed on a nearby farm which had horses. My parents didn't have any interest in farm life, but I instantly loved all the animals and the countryside.

Q2: You've spent so much time with horses, can you describe what it is that you love about them?

I just adore them, the love is just there. Interestingly, much, much later when I looked back and traced my birth parents, I discovered that they had come from Newmarket and had always been heavily involved in racing. So I suppose it's in my blood and my genes. as well as in my daughters' and grandchildren's genetics. It was strange finding this out after so many years, how everything is intertwined. It seemed to explain everything.

Q3: Did you return to London at the end of the war?

Yes, we went back to London, but I always came back to Devon during the holidays, as I missed it so much. I had to wait until I earned my own money before I could go to riding school. I worked in an office in the City of London, but hated it as I really just wanted to work with animals. Later when I married, my husband and I had our own TV rental business. I was responsible for collecting rental money from our customers. A lone female visiting flats and houses with a bag full of money. I had doors slammed in my face, gangs of youths calling out at me on the landings. This really hardened me up. However, it enabled us to buy a small holding in Kent with ponies and a pig farm as a hobby. I bred goats and dogs for showing. Our daughters were born here which was much nicer than London.

Q4: So how did you end up back in Devon?

We bought a site near Okehampton which had planning permission for a caravan park. We couldn't move in immediately, so we lived in a caravan - two parrots, two cats, three dogs, two children and us two! Also, we built the stables for the ponies and a horse, before we completed our own house! The park was very successful for fifteen years, but then we sold up and moved to Whimple in 1989. I do love Whimple. Its friendliness, and I love the Square, because it can't be ruined. It is a real village centre, unlike other villages. It is the heart of the village.

Q5: Do you have an equestrian event yourself?

No, I only rode for pleasure, because running our businesses I couldn't do anything more.

But the girls and my grandchildren have gone from strength to strength. My daughters were really competitive, frighteningly so!

Q6: What were those early days like then, with your daughters competing?

They competed right across the board - gymkhanas, show jumping the lot. And we never had transport, like youngsters do now. They would hack everywhere with me following them in the Landrover with all their gear in. If it was dark on our return, they would just hack in front with my headlights to guide them, all the way back. Often up to ten miles.

Q7: Do you have a pinnacle moment in all of this?

Oh there's been a lot of moments, gradually building up to where my family is today. They are all independent, and don't rely on me, but I do still go everywhere with them. When I was younger I always had jobs to do. Last minute grooming, and usually the tailend to clean, or clearing out the horse box!! I was a timekeeper for them too, keeping them on task. Nowadays, the horses are too large and spirited, so I don't get to hold onto them. But my family knows I am always there, supporting them.

Q8: You must be very proud of your family's achievements within the equestrian world. Can you tell me a bit about them?

We all live almost as one big family in Whimple, in our Devon longhouse. We have fifteen horses between us, old and young ones as well as the competition horses. Both my daughters are still very involved and two of the grandchildren.

My granddaughter works with Devon County Shows and organises all the horses and livestock, as well as competing. She won a big dressage championship up in the Midlands with her horse *Harley*, which was a proud moment. One of my grandsons works for *Horse and Country* making instructional films, as well as full-time coaching. He was asked to attend Badminton Horse Trials to interview the top riders as well as commentate which was brilliant. He is still on his own upward climb too, competing at a very high level.

Q9: Has there been a particular horse that has been special to you?

Yes, *Bugsy*. He was a retired showjumper. But I don't ride anymore, our horses are so very fit and strong, and on their toes. They need to be for what they need to do. Also the traffic is so different now, it's scary really, especially through the village. But we do have a school for everyone to ride out in at the farm which is safe.

Q10: So, what keeps you going and what is next for you?

My family does keep me going. My animals too, they get me up every morning - the peacocks, sheep, and pony. I have tickets for the Olympics in 2024 so I do need to keep going as I'm looking forward to that. Also, I am planning on writing a book for my family, because I have done a lot in my life. Not just the horses, but I've raced go -karts, rallied landrovers, archery, fencing, breeding and showing. There's a lot to say really, and much to be proud of in my life.

Thank you Daphne, and I really hope I have as much energy and spirit as you when I am older



We have all felt the effects of inflation. The impact on food prices in the UK and around the world is severe.

In some places hunger is the norm. Globally, one in ten people don't have enough food to eat and at the moment things are getting worse, not better. For the 73 million children at school on an empty stomach, that stark fact makes concentration in lessons impossible, having a dire effect on their learning. Crushing poverty, coupled with inflation means that buying even a little food forces families to cut out things we would regard as essential. In some cases this means children and young people can't continue to go to school or college; with lasting consequences.

We have to start somewhere to make a difference, and it's always best to make a sustainable difference. As an example, Christian Aid's partners in Malawi are helping farmers achieve a step-change in their livelihoods using the humble but mighty pigeon pea: a drought-resistant, soil-revitalising, high-protein, low-cost, delicious crop. High quality seeds are needed to produce a crop in challenging circumstances and small farmers then need to be able to sell their produce for the best price possible, cutting out unscrupulous middlemen. Christian Aid are focussing efforts to bring this change about, though it is not a story you will hear much about in mainstream media.

In Whimple there is overwhelming evidence that people care very deeply and want to help those who are in trouble. Last year, in Christian Aid Week, Whimple raised £850 to help people who are in a far worse position than we are. Villagers looked beyond their own troubles and gave very generously to support the work of Christian Aid across the world, helping families with far, far less than we have. Thank you.

Once again, between 14 - 20 May, Christian Aid envelopes will be delivered into nearly every home in the village by a team of volunteers. We will all have the chance to reach out and make permanent, life-enhancing changes for the better, helping families who have unimaginably tough lives. Your donation can make a huge positive difference.

Once again, we have the opportunity to bring our donation envelopes to Whimple Stores where Rory, Sharon and Sabrina have kindly agreed to again be the main collection point.



Happily, due to so much fantastic support from the village, and also thanks to the late John Aiton for his push to register it as an Asset Of Community Value, the development prospect had been refused, leaving the way clear for a possible sale. The Wheatons, a local family, decided to come forward and purchase it.

Kevin has 54 years in the building trade, Lee 26 years in the motor trade, so a very different path for them, but Kaya has been a familiar and friendly face behind the bar in The Farmer and the cricket club over the years.

They, and their team of helpers, have been working ridiculously hard to transform, not just upgrade, the Fountain into an exciting new pub and eatery. Many of the original features have been preserved, but the restaurant area has been extended into the garages, giving a lot more internal space, which they hope will also be useful for local groups. They stress that it will be very much a community hub for all, with traditional pub games encouraged, too. Three woodburners will be roaring away and keeping everyone warm in the winter months.

It will be family run and they hope it will be open in April (perhaps even before this goes to press) and they will be using local produce as much as possible for the meals.

They have set up a Facebook page already – New Fountain Inn – which has an option to message them if you have any suggestions for events etc or any queries. Sky and BT Sports will be available.

The main focus will be a family friendly, traditional pub.

Kaya asked me to stress how much the family appreciate the support and encouragement they have received from everyone whilst they have been renovating. She says it has been wonderful.

So, as we also have new owners in The Thirsty Farmer, this will give both pubs a new launch. The village has long been able to support the two pubs, so we look forward to their new plans, too.

Exciting times for Whimple, and summer is coming!

POW+R Takes a wider view

POW+R always aim to be open and straight forward. We will praise things when the instigators have got them right. In this case, full marks for East Devon District Council for their innovative solution at Exmouth. So significant it has made the national news, as it solves two problems with one solution. The cloud data storage systems now being used all over the world use considerable amounts of electricity. It's estimated that data storage in the cloud will need as much as 8 percent of all electricity to power. These computer hubs generate a great deal of heat.

England has lost nearly 400 swimming pools since the austerity programme of 2010. Many are local authority pools which are at risk due to high energy costs. Eight organisations, including UK Active and the Youth Sport Trust, alongside the Local Government Association, issued a plea to the government in January to step in to prevent the closure of sports facilities. Without a change in policy, there would be more closures. These closures will damage further our national well-being, our sporting global status, the health of our nation and the requirement for further costs to the NHS.

A first of its kind in the UK, the Exmouth, 25-metre swimming pool is now heated by an onsite data centre run by 'Deep Green', cutting at least £1,000 a month off its energy bills. This pilot will be followed by seven other swimming pools, undertaken by 'Deep Green', and it suggests these 'digital furnaces' the size of a domestic washing machine could also be used in distilleries, bakeries, laundrettes and apartments. The brains of the data centre are submerged in mineral oil, which captures the heat from the processors and minimises the amount lost to the air. This heat is then transferred to the swimming pool through a heat exchanger. It will cut the energy bill by £20,000 a year. This would be designated as a win, win.

Battleship grey hut

Of course, the local District Council does not get it all right. For example, the changing rooms at the sports hub on London Road, near Rockbeare looks more like a tin shed you would find at a naval base, not a type of structure you should find in a new town with a remit to have quality as part of the design code.

Temp Halt to Local Plan

The Government is having a bit of a re-think on Planning Policy to enable local councils' greater flexibility about the amount of house building needed in East Devon.

From the January 2023 consultation, concerns about the impact that new developments would have on the environment, infrastructure such as roads, schools and hospitals were raised by members of the public. These issues were acknowledged in the Strategic Planning Committee in mid-February.

The Government looks like it will give councils more choice over the number of new homes being built, allowing East Devon District Council (EDDC) to address local concerns that have been raised, which are considerable.

EDDC leader, Councillor Paul Arnott, put forward a motion that no further discussions or decisions on potential sites take place until the Government makes its decision. EDDC's Strategic Planning Committee agreed the motion, which means council officers will only continue technical work needed to support production of the Local Plan, such as water, sewerage and other environmental matters.

This all ties in with the concept of localism - decisions taken at local level. This also is acutely relevant at Parish Level in developing our own Neighbourhood Plan.

Neighbourhood Plan

POW+R Group is continuing to work with the WPC on the NP and whilst progress is being made, it is taking longer than expected. Currently, we are bringing together all the sections completed so far, in one single document. It's a bit like a giant jig-saw, all the outside is done; now we are working towards the centre and completion. This will be the draft, which will go back to the village for a further 6 weeks consultation. We will come back to the village with further news in the next edition.

New Fountain Public House

Since the pub was taken over and established in October 2022, there has been an immense amount of work undertaken, not only in the extension of the bar area, which looks like a doubling of the floor space, but also a totally refitted kitchen, plus a makeover of the car park. It looks like it may open when the Parish Mag goes to press in the first week of April. We at POW+R Group wish Lee and his team well.

In addition, the pub has once again been listed as an Asset of Community Value (ACV). A huge well done to Jeremy Wilson and all those involved with the application. A fantastic achievement!

The Thirsty Farmer

It will be a very hard act to follow as Donna and Marc did a great job over the last 5 years in a very challenging market and all the implications of Covid19. They excelled, especially on food, customer service and on bringing in some great live entertainment and creating a great atmosphere. It is understood that a new tenant has come forward to take over the business. Many village groups and villagers will welcome the new landlord.

Pithayes Farm, Church Road

POW+R Group Member sent detailed objections to the proposed change of use from agriculture to four residential dwellings with new entrance and associated development at Pithayes Farm Church Road Ref. 22/2207/FUL. The basis was that the development is outside the built-up area of the village and would therefore constitute to being in land designated as open countryside. Awaiting decision from EDDC.

Communications Mast

An objection was made by POW+R Group to the erection of an 18m (reduced later to 16m) Electronic Communication Mast. Ref. 22/1968/TEL. Planning was refused on the 15th Feb 2023.

POW+R Group continues to be proactive in protecting our village against anything that would harm the distinctive character of our community.
