# WHIMPLE STORES 🙈

Late in 2022, as part of the plan to replace some of the Post Office facilities with our own services, we applied to several companies for a parcel service. Whimple is deemed too small for the likes of Evri but we persisted with the Post Office's Drop and Collect service and have just received verbal confirmation that we will be getting this service (subject to contract etc.,). The service allows for your postage paid parcels to be dropped off at the Stores ready for collection by different couriers including Royal Mail and for online shopping parcels to be sent to the Stores ready for your collection. This benefits the community that have online access to parcel services and we are discussing, as a team, how we can also make this work for Whimple residents that do not use online services.

We will let you know when this service is in operation but we were told it takes nine weeks to set up, so potentially by August.

We are pleased to be stocking large and small Ice cream tubs from Langage Farm in Devon. We also have greek yogurt, natural yogurt and flavoured yogurts from them. The ice cream is delicious and the large tubs retail for under £5 which is important to support our policy of good customer value. Please try their ice cream by buying a small tub first. You will be instantly converted! We still also hold a limited range of Salcombe Dairy ice cream and can order in specific flavours from their range if required. Please ask.

A few months ago, Courtneys launched their Devon Dimpsey Cider which we now sell. It is cloudy, slightly sweeter than other cloudy ciders and is perfect for sitting outdoors with friends after watching the sunset over Exeter!

On the theme of buying local, we are selling beetroot and lettuce leaves from one of our Apple Juice suppliers in Whimple and last year we sold courgettes, tromboncinos and other vegetables, grown by a Whimple resident. We love to do this as the carbon footprint is zero, it supports local growers and provides fresh produce for our customers. We also stock, when available, Devon honey and Whimple honey, both locally sourced. Please watch out for these lovely products when they are available.

In early May, two thunderstorms on the same day created a tidal wave down Church Road and caused the stream in The Square to overflow onto the road. After the storm had ceased, water started to creep into the shop from the back wall and quickly became a serious issue when the levels flooded the floor and started to rise. We were able to control the level by sweeping the water from the back of the shop to the front door and we are extremely grateful to Mark and Jenny for their help in keeping the water levels low and for a sack load of towels to help dry the floor. We are also grateful for the many offers of assistance from our customers. Fortunately, no stock was damaged but a couple of cardboard display units got a bit soggy. We think that the pressure of water under the ground pushed its way up through the cob walls. Whimple, its lovely and supportive community and of course the marvellous Whimple Stores was put on the map by a reporter from Devon Live (www.devonlive.com). A video interview from our own Sabrina as well as Jenny Sanders showed how active the village is and how supportive the community are towards each other.

We always support local events by placing posters in our windows and by selling tickets and we are currently collecting goods for the food hamper prize at Whimple Fest on 8th July. All you have to do is buy something (non perishable) from the shop and pop it into the fest basket. If you wish to donate a perishable product, we will create a voucher for the winner to exchange. Your purchase supports both our shop and the Whimple Fest. We are also selling the Fest's raffle tickets.

Finally, a reminder if you have any 1st or 2nd class postage stamps that don't have the new barcode on the side, that these will expire on 31st July. Use them or get them swapped. We can tell you how to arrange a swap out if you need.

Any picture stamps, Christmas stamps and stamps with the value printed on them don't expire.

## Introducing our new District Councillor

Todd Olive. His thoughts on his new job, his academic studies and what makes him happy,

1. How do you feel after your recent success in the East Devon District Council Elections? To be frank and honest, I'm mostly tired from walking around Rockbeare and Whimple!! But no, seriously, I think that it's hard as a young person to be taken seriously sometimes, so I am thrilled and delighted that the village has chosen to put its trust in me. I think that I have a lot to offer and I'm excited to get started.



2. Have you always had a desire/dream of getting into politics? No actually, I've always wanted to be a teacher. From an early age I was going to teach English. Politics for me is not an ambition. I don't sit here and think 'Yes I want to be involved in politics'. It's more about doing the best for the places that I care about, and giving something back, as well as bringing my skills and expertise to try and make a difference.

3. Tell me about the young Todd. What was your childhood like? I was born in Hammersmith, London and lived there until I was about 10yrs old. It was obviously very different moving to Devon, having spent half my childhood in the big city. But Whimple is great, so much quieter. I love it.

4. What are the challenges you see as a young councillor? There are three young councillors in East Devon, which is the most there ever has been at one time. I think it is fantastic that there are three of us and I look forward to 'banging the drum.' I don't think the challenges in politics are unique to young people though, it's a question of people thinking 'Well it doesn't make any difference anyway, so what's the point?' Especially with local council politics. It is very different to Westminster and people aren't always aware of what the local council does.

5. What are your first thoughts on the sort of councillor you want to be? Being open and accessible are important. So I'll be running surgeries once or twice a month here in Whimple. I intend to be up front about what the council is doing and relating that to our day to day life. At present, there is no parish council in Rockbeare so I shall be following procedures to get that back up and running as soon as possible. I see the role as championing and listening to what the community wants, then following up to try and get these things done, rather than just putting my stamp on what I want, or imposing my priorities.

6. Your degrees are in Global Sustainable Development. Can you describe this simply? GSD is about the buzz phrase at the moment - 'Global Challenges'. So it's along the lines of the United Nation's Three Pillars of Sustainability -

## (with my10 questions)

The Economic, the Social, and the Environmental Sustainability. Looking at what causes those problems, how they manifest, how we understand them and what we do about them. Then consideration of how these all interact in the complexities of policymaking.

7. As a teacher myself, I was interested in the aspect of the 'Academia-Society Gap' you mention in your PhD Study. Has your research brought up anything interesting? I'm only in my first year! So ask me again in four years. But basically, quite frequently sat within the university there is a self-awareness, a self-consciousness that the academic community is often really separate and quite detached from how we see things in the real world. This is one of the things my PhD project is specifically looking at with regards to Sustainability. How these high academic, political concepts of sustainability are actually understood, and how big the gap in perceptions is between the person on the street and the academy.

8. You are juggling several balls at the moment - Councillor, PhD student, and your job in a consultancy company. How do you manage your time? I've always enjoyed juggling! Since I was much younger I had my fingers in loads of pies, and always had lots of things going on. So, I'm not worried about it, I'm used to being busy. When you are that busy you're forced to be hyper-organised to keep on top of everything.

9. On a lighter side, tell me about Todd outside of all this. What makes you happy? Our dog Pablo makes me happy, even though he wakes me up barking at 6.30am! I do a bit of behind the scenes theatre stuff - such as lighting design at university. I also do a lot of climate activism and campaigning. I'm a Climate Reality Leader, which involves going into communities and community groups and building awareness. I'm involved in several things, but they're not work, they are my leisure time, really. What makes you laugh? All sorts of things make me laugh. My own idiocy, sometimes. It's really important, not taking yourself too seriously, isn't it?

And how do you relax? That's a difficult one! One of the problems with studying sustainability is that there is SO much to worry about, it's actually very difficult to relax!

**10.** You are obviously ambitious, where do you see yourself in 5 years time? The honest answer is: I'll probably still be finishing my PhD in 5 year's time. But, ultimately, I'd still like to go into teaching. Teaching and making a difference have always been important to me. I can't see myself sitting on the green benches, heckling. It's not me.

#### EARLY DAYS

The D.Day Landings took place on the 6th. June 1944. At that time I was 6 years old In 1979 I wrote my tale concerning my memories of that time in W.W. II.

I do not know the day I was born. I am told it was April thirteenth of nineteen thirty-eight. My first thoughts of life are of tanks and planes, guns and men who were off to fight the war again. I sat on the wall and saw these men preparing to fight and die that I may live my life. What are they doing now these men?

I remember rabbits in cages. They were all colours shapes and ages. My father kept them as pets for me. I never slept in a bed at night. We slept together in an iron shelter. It was covered in green in our living room. We ate and slept and played and wept in this cold dark shelter in that room. Would it have saved us? I wonder now But here I am to tell this tale.

For part of my life, I lived in London. Just dad and me in a little house. When bombs fell, we lived in fear under the stairs all cold and damp. In the day when doodle bugs came we stood in the garden and watched them fall. There was nowhere for us to run at all. My dad would say "We cannot run my son for they will fall And if we stand and watch will know it all"

My dad was a butcher in the war. There was a small shop where I would go. It had no windows just boards and wire because of bombs and mines out it would blow. I would often sit in this little shop and draw and paint in pen and ink. He kept those pictures while I was small and showed them with pride to one and all. Those were my younger days of life which I remember best of all



### A Window on Whimple's Weather – March/April 2023

Well, what a wet spring Whimple had! But thankfully, we needed the rain for our green fields.

After the dry summer last year and some dry spells over the autumn and winter, especially February, our reservoirs needed refilling, a very wet March and fairly wet April came to the rescue.

**March** – The month started dry but cold, with a couple of sharp frosts. Pressure then fell heralding an exceptional period of rain between the  $8^{th}$  and  $31^{st}$ ; there were only 2 dry days. The  $8^{th}$  was particularly wet with almost an inch of rain, while a deep depression crossed on the  $9^{th}$  followed by strong and blustery winds, with gusts to 60km/h in the small hours of the  $10^{th}$ . With all the wind and rain, sunshine was well below average, but at least temperatures remained on the mild side, especially the final 3 days of March in strong south-westerly winds.

**April** – After 4 drier days of high pressure, the unsettled theme continued. Unusually, night-time temperatures were lower in April than March, resulting in 3 air frosts and a number of ground frosts. The long Easter weekend started with a sunny Good Friday and Saturday was fine too, though thereafter typical bank holiday weather prevailed! Storm Noa crossed the country on the 12<sup>th</sup> with gale force winds and gusts to 62km/h causing some damage. The next day though was very sunny and 18.2C was reached on the 15<sup>th</sup>. While Spain basked in a heatwave we had a deluge of rain on the 27<sup>th</sup>. After one of the dullest Aprils on record, let's hope for a sunnier May and summer!


Thanks to the team for the opportunity to put something into Whimple News.

#### Eurovision Ukraine fundraising in Cricket Club


Once I found out that the UK was hosting Eurovision on behalf of Ukraine, I knew that a party was needed to watch this years contest!





# National Walking Month

#### A fantastic time to start exploring Devon's countryside on foot,

We all know walking in natural surroundings is good for our body and soul. But, sometimes, we just need a reminder to get out and do it! The wonderful months of late spring and early summer are an ideal time to pull on your walking boots. To my mind, it really is the best time of the year with new life in abundance all around us. The emerging leaves and fresh grasses are the most vivid shade of green, while meadows, hedgerows and woodland are studded with wildflowers.

Devon CPRE is the local branch of the countryside charity. We campaign to protect the countryside for the benefit of all and to preserve it for future generations. Part and parcel of that is encouraging people to appreciate the landscapes and green spaces on their doorstep, and walking is one of the best ways to experience the countryside and the coastline up close and personal, whether you live here year-round or are just visiting.

Here in Devon, we're lucky to have a wonderful network of walking routes that allow us to explore the whole of Devon's varied shoreline, the rugged terrain of Dartmoor and even venture from one side of the county to the next along the 99mile Devon Coast to Coast walk. There are many flatter and accessible sections of footpath too for those with limited mobility, like the Tarka Trail in North Devon and the Granite Way near Okehampton.

My husband, Paul, and I like a good hike, often around Belstone or Meldon on Dartmoor as they're not far from where we live. Fortunately, a section of footpath called the Ruby Way - a former railway line - passes close to my home in northwest Devon, and it's my regular haunt with my dog, Merlin.

I know not everyone has a footpath on their doorstep, but many of the most popular walking routes in the county can be reached by public transport and many double as cycle paths too. Leaving your car behind for a day benefits the environment. It also makes you see the landscape from a new perspective.

A few words of caution though if you're taking a canine companion walking with you. Lots of popular beaches have a dog ban from the beginning of May to September so please leave your dog at home, not in a hot car. Also, keep in mind that livestock roam free on Dartmoor so your dog needs to be kept under control and on a leash near sheep, cattle and horses. And, of course, no one wants to walk in dog mess so make sure you have bags with you and pick up anything your dog leaves behind! As they say, take only memories, leave only footprints.

Wherever your feet take you, I hope you have a happy summer exploring Devon.

#### Local Plan for East Devon

The EDDC has been examining the implication of the Government's change of policy on housing quotas and a shift in emphasis, giving greater flexibility to local councils. This emanated from considerable opposition to building in open countryside in politically sensitive areas.

On the 23<sup>rd</sup> May, the Neighbourhood Plan Team for Whimple received an update from EDDC regarding the consultation on the draft East Devon Local Plan. This report provided a succinct overview of some initial observations on themes coming through in the feedback and some data drawn from the online consultation. It also included the response to the programme of face-to-face exhibitions at various venues around the district, which included Whimple Victory Hall. Approximately 200 people attended, which was greater than previous events of this type.

The EDDC has a lot of work to undertake now analysing of all information received. One key fact which has been revealed was that residents were not in favour of building a second New Town south of the A30. In addition, concerns were raised regarding the ability of infrastructure to cope with additional housing. There were also concerns that the percentage of affordable housing on 'qualifying sites' is too low and what constitutes 'affordable'? There were many concerns relating to the environment impact of developments and the push for development away from designated AONB (Area of outstanding Natural Beauty).

EDDC has indicated that the new Local Plan, *"will set out the housing provision requirements for designated neighbourhood areas in East Devon"*. It went on to identify the designated neighbourhood areas that this would apply to, of which there are 40 in East Devon, including Whimple and Rockbeare.

According to the information received by EDDC, and in view of the sensitivities and evidence gathered, it is of the utmost importance for the Whimple Neighbourhood Plan core team to spell out our desires, aspirations and wants to avoid wholly inappropriate large-scale development in Whimple. Whist we appreciate the desires of EDDC, we strongly believe in the principles of localism. The knowledge/data gained from our recent village survey, the Whimple element of the 'Common Place' Local Plan survey, and the face-to-face consultation, gives the greatest insight into village feelings.

#### Neighbourhood Plan

POW+R Group and WPC held a project management meeting on the 25<sup>th</sup> May to evaluate the achievement so far of completing, in draft form, approximately 75% of the Neighbourhood Plan. There are a few further sections to complete plus creating policy statements which will inform planners to make appropriate professional decisions.

The policies will be born out of the evidence gained across the Whimple Parish. . Once it is all pulled together, we then go out to a six-week consultation on the final draft. It is estimated to be completed during late summer.

#### New Fountain Public House

We at POW+R Group wish, Kevin Wheaton, Lee Wheaton and Kaya Taylor and their team well. The planning application claimed that the pub was unviable - well, have we got some news for you!! A further point of interest is that the New Fountain was recorded in the CAMRA, Good Bear Guide in 1976, which was one of the early editions, and has been until 2018.

#### The Thirsty Farmer

POW+R Group recognises that the vibrancy of the village is the importance of maintaining and patronising both our village pubs. Both are assets to our village and we hope they will maintain the high standards of the previous tenants. We wish them well.

#### Pithayes Farm, Church Road

Despite strong opposition from POW+R Group, submitting detailed objections to the proposed change of use from agriculture to four residential dwellings at Pithayes Farm Church Road, this application has been granted approval. The basis of our objection was that the development is outside the built-up area of the village and would therefore constitute to being in land designated as open countryside. It is acceptable to use farm buildings for family or agricultural workers, but not for additional residential housing. Regrettably the EDDC has granted approval, without reference to the emerging Neighbourhood Plan.

#### Cranbrook

The outline planning application for land at Cobdens, North of London Road, which is for 1435 homes and ancillary developments, has so far not been approved as there are issues with access. A detailed report was set before the Council on the 25th April 2023.

A reference was made within the report that Cranbrook Town Council remains of the view that the town should be administered by one local authority. This has a fundamental effect on the western parish boundary and loss of a significant number of hectares of land.

The report adds that the objections raised by POW+R group are very much shared by Whimple Parish Council. It states that, *"The expansion of the above provision, for this outline planning permission, far outweighs the last application made that included the traveller's site, which encroaches on the Parish Boundary. The current application conflicts with the agreement laid out in 2016 to cede part of the Parish of Whimple to the new town of Cranbrook, this should remain legally binding."* 

**POW+R Group** continue to be proactive in protecting our village against anything that would harm the distinctive character of our community.

For 50 years the acorn has pointed the way. For each of us that live near or have walked, all or part of the South West Coast Path it will hold its own memories. It is a unique challenge to undertake this great coastal path, as it celebrates its 50th Birthday this year. At 1,014km (630 miles),



the South West Coast Path is the longest waymarked hiking trail in England and Wales. It runs along the southwest coast of England, taking in beautiful coastal scenery and known for its famous acorn waymarker posts.

Having been created by coastguards on the lookout for smugglers, the route hugs the coast from Minehead in Somerset to Dorset's Studland Bay. It takes in some of the finest coastal scenery in the UK, including: Exmoor National Park, UNESCO Cornish Tin Mine scenery, Land's End and nearer to home, our own Jurassic Coast. It has gone on to become one of the most popular tourist draws in the south west.

High praise must go to the South West Coast Path Association who valiantly campaigned from 1973 to gradually open the path in sections before it was designated as a National Trail five years later. For many, it is a way to simply walk, breathe sea air, forget the demands of normal life and to connect with nature and recharge one's batteries. Its preservation and the people who care for this path have a passion for the great outdoors. The same passion is taken on by POW+R Group as we aim to protect our village and its orchard landscapes.
