



Closure of Ottery Minor Injuries Unit


Until recently our nearest Minor Injuries Unit was at Ottery St. Mary Hospital.

Update from the Parish Council

Currently, all Councils operate within tight financial constraints which means we need to find innovative ways of delivering services. The tough decisions being taken by both East Devon District Council (EDDC) and Devon County Council (DCC) to ensure they balance their budgets has meant that they have withdrawn or reduced many services. Whimple Parish Council has always been keen to provide support to our residents/parishioners and tried to cushion the loss. Each year we offer grants to worthy village organisations e.g. support for the Whimple News, new equipment for the Front Row Club and money towards the Queen's Diamond Jubilee mugs given to the children from the school. We have provided dog poo bins around the village for several years when additional bins were not forthcoming. This is a costly service but one we feel benefits us all and keeps our roads free from dog mess. If you see an irresponsible dog owner failing to clear up after their dog, take a photo as evidence and report it as the dog warden (01395 517455) will prosecute.

The Parish Council wants to share our plan for the village for the coming year. Our priority is to reduce the risk of flooding by keeping water off the road and in the ditches or drains. To be able to do this we are proposing to increase the precept. We plan to employ someone to provide street cleaning and general maintenance. DCC used to send a lengthsman twice a year for eight days in total to keep trouble spots free of vegetation and dig out critical ditches. Whilst this service was much appreciated, in recent times these workers have been redeployed to conduct storm damage repairs to the road network across the county. Even with this investment we need your help to keep drain grills free of leaves, twigs and other detritus, particularly when bad weather is forecast. It is the responsibility of landowners to make sure their hedges are cut, their ditches are clean and vegetation is cut back to allow free flow of water.

Over the past few years we have been working hard to deliver the Parish Plan objectives and we have achieved over 90% e.g. providing courses in IT training in conjunction with the primary school. This also includes the building of seven affordable homes in the last two years. This is an amazing feat when public money is limited. We are grateful to the EDDC housing team, the housing associations and builders who have made it possible. We are keen to now start work on the next version (Neighbourhood Plan).

We always need your help and support to keep the village tidy and clean and we greatly value you being the local eyes and ears to report problems. All faulty road surfaces, street lights, road signs etc can be registered on the DCC website:

We are going to enter The 'Best Kept Village in Devon' competition, which we won in 2013, but sadly lost in 2014 mainly due to some irresponsible dog owners not cleaning up their pets' poos, combined with litter in general. District Councillor's Report

Well, 'Happy New Year' to all my readers in Talaton and Whimple. I trust that you are looking forward to the challenges of 2015 as I am. I do not have much to report this time as over the Christmas period there has not been much going on at the Council. However, below are a couple of items that have caught my attention and have pertinence to our doings in the ward.



Beavers Breeding on the Otter

In January the Devon Wild Life Trust (DWT) announced that beavers have been living on the river Otter for some time. A breeding pair with young were filmed in 2014 south of Ottery with evidence of activity from Honiton to Budleigh. The DWT are speculating that at least nine individual animals are involved although no one knows how they got into the river in the first place. At the meeting the DWT announced that the Government proposes to capture the animals and remove them from the natural environment. In reply the DWT proposes a long term plan to monitor the animals in the wild to ascertain what their impact will be upon the natural environment. Preliminary findings suggest that the activities of the beavers are beneficial to wild life in the areas where they are active with increases in the health of the river as well as increases in some other species of wildlife.

Have any of you ever seen a beaver? I haven't. The trust had a stuffed one on display and they are far larger than I ever imagined. They are about the size of a middle sized dog where I had thought they were the size of an otter. For more information go to the DWT website www.devonwildlifetrust.org/devons-wild-beavers-appeal.

Status of Local Hospital Provision in East Devon

In January I attended an inaugural meeting held for the various stakeholders groups involved with the five local hospitals in East Devon. These stakeholders will be meeting regularly (bi-monthly) with the head of locality commissioning for the new Devon Clinical Commissioning Group (Tamara Powderley) to consider further operating options for the local hospitals in the future. Local GPs will also be attending these meetings and therefore contribute their knowledge and experience.

The aim of the meeting was to set the terms of reference of the group. This was achieved after considerable discussion about the anxieties of the various individual stake holder groups with regard to the hospitals that they represented. For example in Ottery, although the local population is expected to grow by 25 per cent, there has been no corresponding increase in provision in the hospital facilities. Issues that have been raised to be dealt with in future meetings include; what will a community be offered if a hospital is closed? What are local needs - status quo or change? Is there sufficient capacity to satisfy all safe levels of staffing? Should we be lobbying government to consider the persistent underfunding of the NHS, Care Provision in Devon, transport and finances and integration of local and RD&E service provision?

CHANGES TO THE WAY WE LOOK AFTER YOU

Over the past few years we have been subject to a number of retirements and changes to our GP team. We know this has a significant impact, not only on the practice team, but also on our patients. We are particularly aware of those of you who have had to re register a number of times with new doctors.

We have been discussing ways to make sure we continue to provide a safe service to you and better manage changes to our doctor team so that patients are less affected. We would like to take this opportunity to describe a new way of working which will be implemented from 1st February 2015.

Our practice is committed to patient-centred care, to provide a high quality medical service and make sure every patient has a named GP who oversees their care. We also have a duty of care to ensure that an individual doctor's workload is sustainable.

From February 2015 all GPs will:

- consult with patients (face to face, telephone and visits).
- make referrals to and action letters back from other healthcare providers including hospitals.
- $\cdot\,$ request, follow up and action results for tests and investigations
- · follow up and manage on going conditions

In addition GP Partners, that is Drs Chris Dilley, Simon Kerr, Kate Gurney, Matt King, Nigel de Sousa and Emma Stuart will:

- \cdot divide 16,000+ patients between them on a ratio dependent on the number of sessions they work
- \cdot oversee the care of patients on their list and delegate on-going care and consultations to non partner GPs
- also be responsible for medication reviews, carrying out quality and safety audits including prescribing and quality and outcomes framework.
- $\cdot\,$ carry out non clinical work and other management functions

What does this mean for you?

In the past we have asked you to see your own GP. From February 2015 you will be asked who is dealing with your problem. If it is a new problem you will be asked to see your registered doctor or one of the other GPs.

This model allows for:

- \cdot an increase/decrease in GPs and GP Partners.
- \cdot a direct line of care management to be followed even if a GP partner does not do the consultation.



Keeping our pets slim to keep them healthy

Just like people, dogs and cats can quickly put on unwanted pounds, especially as they get older and exercise less. In fact, a staggering 45% of all dogs and 40% of all cats in the UK are overweight or obese and most owners don't realise it, until they take their pets to the vet for another reason.

Overweight pets are likely to develop related health problems, such as diabetes, breathing and/or mobility problems, arthritis, heart disease, cancer and even behavioural problems.

It can be difficult to regulate your pet's weight, especially if your pet is particularly greedy, doesn't enjoy exercise or is a fussy eater who will only eat human food!

As responsible pet owners we must feed and exercise our pets in a way that keeps them healthy. With a healthy, balanced diet and plenty of regular exercise, there should be no reason to worry about weight related health problems.

Cats are trickier to monitor as when at home they tend to do a lot of sleeping and when they are out we don't know what or where they are eating! Avoiding 'adlib' feeding and encouraging your cat to play, will help keep unwanted pounds off.

When choosing the right diet for your pet, take into consideration the breed, age and the amount of exercise they do. Some breeds are more prone to weight gain (Labradors, Retrievers and a few of the oriental cat breeds) so it is important to choose a food suited to them. If your dog is classified as a 'working breed' they don't necessarily need to be fed a working dog food, (unless they are actually working!) Food for working dogs has higher calorie content and could lead to unwanted weight gain.

Most food packaging will give you a rough guide to how much your pet should be fed per day. If your pet gets too light or too heavy, adjust accordingly within the recommended daily amount.

Vets recommend that most dogs are fed twice (or three times daily if younger than six

months) and cats are fed three to four times daily. Eating smaller meals little and often (just like us!) will help keep the metabolism ticking over and can help keep their weight under control.



Ottery St. Mary Choral Society usually set themselves a challenging and varied programme for their Christmas concert and this year was no exception. The central piece was the charming *Mass in D major* by **Dvořák**, performed beautifully by the choir under their conductor Malcolm Matthews.
