Bed Closures at Ottery Hospital

After Christmas, as a cost cutting exercise, NHS Devon is proposing to temporarily close 7 of the 21 beds at Ottery Hospital. These proposed closures will come at a time when, historically, Ottery Hospital has had 90-100% bed occupancy and when the most vulnerable people in our community will need community hospital care. Bed closures will certainly save money from the community hospital budget. However GPs will be forced to admit patients to RD&E Hospital, Exeter. This is a more expensive option for NHS Devon and patient stays are expected to be longer as there will not be an option for rehabilitation in the community hospital prior to home discharge. Relatives and friends visiting these patients will incur additional travel costs.

Some beds at Ottery Hospital are currently being used to accommodate patients from other community hospitals which are experiencing bed shortages and those patients who would usually be cared for at the Bungalow in Honiton, Stowford in Sidmouth and Conybeare at Axminster. These three specialist sites for the elderly mentally infirm are currently suffering bed closures themselves, which is increasing demand for community hospital beds and putting additional strain on community hospital nursing staff.

Swine Flu Vaccinations

If you are in one of the priority groups described below, please telephone the Doctor's surgery to book an appointment to have your swine flu vaccination.

The vaccine is offered to patients who are most likely to become seriously ill if they catch swine flu. This is a slightly different group of patients from those who usually receive a seasonal flu vaccination.

The patients in the following groups will be offered the swine flu vaccination:

Adults and children over six months of age who have a long-term health condition, including:

- Chronic Lung disease, Chronic Heart disease, Chronic Kidney disease,
- Chronic Liver disease, Chronic neurological diseases, Diabetes mellitus-Immunosuppression caused by a disease, or treatment for a disease.
- For example this may include patients who do not have a spleen and people who are on immunosuppressant treatment such as chemotherapy or are taking high doses of systemic steroids.
- Pregnant women at any stage of pregnancy
- Patients who live in the same house as someone whose immune system is compromised by disease or treatment.

The vaccine should not be given to anyone who has had a confirmed anaphylactic reaction after being exposed to egg products. We understand that an alternative vaccine will become available for these patients in due course. Anyone not in the priority groups listed above may be offered the vaccine at a later stage.





EDDC Neighbourhood Assessment

Environmental Health will be carrying out a Neighbourhood Assessment survey in partnership with the Police in Whimple on 14th January 2010.

These assessments have been organised in various towns and villages across East Devon during the past two years.

Environmental Health Officers and the local Police will carry out a door to door survey of around 300 to 400 randomly selected properties in the village, completing a short questionnaire and asking whether residents have any concerns about their neighbourhood in general. We will particularly be asking about issues such as dog fouling, litter, crime, traffic, refuse etc and StreetScene's operatives will be in the area to litter pick and clear any problem areas.

We also offer advice and assistance to elderly, vulnerable residents around their home. A free fire prevention visit, free home security check from the Police, advice regarding insulation grants for every resident etc. There will also be a representative from The British Red Cross who will ask residents if they would like to attend a free life saving/first aid course, which may be held in the village in the near future.

Following the assessment a newsletter is produced highlighting the issues raised and informing residents about the outcomes of the assessment.

IMPROVED RAIL SERVICE - BUT NOT FOR WHIMPLE


The new "improved" hourly train service from Exeter to London Waterloo is due to come into force from 14th December 2009, but the additional trains will not be stopping in Whimple. The result for this village will be a REDUCTION in the rail services, particularly at peak times – notably the loss of the 9.10 to Exeter in the morning and the 4.44 in the evening, which are to be replaced by a 9.26 and a 4.30 respectively. These will be too late to get to Exeter before 9.30 and too early for those who finish work at 4.30. Exeter College students who finish at 4.30 will be expected to wait 1½ hours before the next train.

As I recall, there have been two peak time trains serving this village ever since the new modern trains were introduced over 20 years ago. The loss of the local service to and from Honiton will leave us with just one peak time train each way. The new timetable has yet to be fully published, but I understand it already includes stops at Cranbrook!

South West trains have stated in a letter to me that "the new timetable allows for trains to either stop at Feniton, Whimple (and Cranbrook when it opens next year) or Cranbrook and Pinhoe only." As I read it, this means that those who currently commute to Sowton via rail and bicycle will be out of luck as the trains stopping at Whimple will not stop at Pinhoe!

I, for one, will be forced into my car by these changes. I know others will be forced to do the same, and we will inevitably add to the peak time congestion in Exeter. Surely this railway line could be put to better use during the rush hour.





News from the Parish Council

Station footpath stream.

There has been much concern over the height of the water under the bridge at the bottom of the footpath, especially with the amount of rain recently and the possibility of flooding. Devon County Council's Bridge Maintenance Department and South West Highways Bridges Agent have examined it and DCC are obtaining quotes to clear away the debris. They realise the urgency due to the flood issue and are keen to do the job but are constrained by their lack of funds. When the work is carried out they intend to build a silt trap upstream from the bridge so the debris can be cleared away regularly.

Street Lighting.

Devon County Council has decided that, with some exceptions, all street lights not sited on main (A & B) roads will be programmed to go off between the hours of 0030 and 0530 every night. This will be put into effect over the next 2 to 5 years and will dramatically reduce the carbon footprint – the savings are expected to exceed 4000 tonnes of CO each year. Exceptions will be directly influenced by the police and parishes where a need to keep lights on can be proved – crime and safety issues will be paramount. The county hopes to save nearly £500,000 per annum. An additional benefit is that we shall be able to see more stars!

Best Kept Village Competition 2009.

Whimple was placed 8th out of 22 in the 'large village' category in Devon and received the highest mark in this category in East Devon. The District Council will be holding an event in December to congratulate winners and runners-up in each category in East Devon. Whimple will be presented with a cup and a certificate.



A VISIT BY THE VILLAGE PRODUCE ASSOCIATION TO ADAM'S APPLES

One of the best ways to help an apple tree fight off canker disease is to apply lime to the ground. It is better to prune apple trees in August rather than winter as it reduces excessive re-growth. Apples should be picked slightly under ripe if they are to be stored for long keeping! These were some of the useful tips passed on to a group of us who visited Adam's Apples nursery at Luton near Payhembury.

The nursery run by Adam and Kim Powell was originally at Talaton, where they became well known, not just for growing apples but heathers and blueberries, which are sent all over Britain and Europe. We were privileged to hear how the new site has been established and their plans for the future. A demonstration of grafting was given, followed by a tour of the modern polytunnels which began with an explanation of the propagation from cuttings, and ended with the finished container grown plant ready for sale. The extent of the large number of container grown varieties of heathers and blueberries was obvious, but they have also expanded recently to include shrubs for hedging and gardens, many of which are sold to landscape contractors.

All the plants are available for purchase by the public but a visit needs to be booked beforehand to make your choice or arrange collection, please do not just turn up! Advice on establishing an orchard of top or soft fruit is readily given with purchases. Everyone was impressed with the vast knowledge that Adam has and his high standard of plant carae. One lasting impression will be the large area of sunflowers grown as a break crop after removing grafted apples. They also provided a splendid view from the house and kept the bees and finches happy!



Wasters of Whimple

Cardboard/plastics volunteer collections

Apologies for the error with the October collection. Dates are posted on the Parish Council notice board in the Square and the Post Office and tend to be the last Saturday of the month.

It is worth highlighting that this is a service run voluntarily. We are a small group of villagers who were disappointed with the recycling available to us kerbside and we felt there was a need to improve things. Our intentions have always been to help people without transportation or people with small amounts that are not worth a journey to the recycling centre. If you have more than 2 bags then you probably have ½ a Car load and we would ask you to still come along but instead of unloading, we would ask you to top up your car and take a full load to the recycling centre. Alternatively, please consider getting together with neighbours and sharing the recycling trips. We would also ask people not to just leave bags in the Car park without seeing the volunteers to ensure there is a collection that day. Due to the high volume currently being received we may have to turn away large quantities.

We have heard from EDDC that Whimple will not see an improved kerbside collection until November 2010. We find this quite shocking. This collection will not take cardboard or 'other' plastics only plastic bottles and kitchen waste. Other plastics – detailed below and cardboard will still be recycled at the recycling centres and we hope people continue to make use of this. Nearby recycling centres are available just past Tipton St John, Exmouth and at Marsh Barton. These are run by Devon County Council which is why they offer a different range of recycling. We hope people will share trips with friends or neighbours or will incorporate visits into other trips.

We will have to investigate whether our group can continue the monthly collections for another year. We had intended to stop when the kerbside collections came into force but we had expected this to be Spring 2010. We will update you when we have discussed this fully.

A reminder also that all Cardboard and plastics should be clean. This helps the recycling process and is a courtesy to the volunteers who very often use their family vehicles to transport the material collected. Remember 'Clean and crushed' to help our wonderful volunteers.

A reminder of plastics that can be taken to the recycling centres:

All plastic drinks and milk bottles (squashed and lid back on or milk lids to the church for Charity), all plastic household cleaning bottles, preformed biscuit or chocolate box trays, plastic sandwich containers, yoghurt pots, margarine tubs, ready meal containers, plastic fruit containers (excluding polystyrene), CD's and Cases, clean plastic flower pots.

A list is available of items that cannot be recycled along with this list on the Devon County Council website.
