

# WHIMPLE VICTORY HALL at the heart of the community

Did you know that Whimple Victory Hall is a registered charity? Did you also know that the Trustees are volunteers dedicated to ensuring the hall is kept in good condition and accessible to all?

In March I wrote about everything that was going on at the hall and I now want to update you all.

I'll start with some not so good news. You may remember I reported that we had submitted a grant application to the **Queens Platinum Jubilee Fund** (for the improvement of older village halls). Our aim was to improve insulation and to save energy at the hall by replacing the current single skinned **metal roof with triple layered insulation panels**. The Jubilee Fund review panel met on July 12th and sadly we were not successful. We were told the decisions were very difficult to make because the value of the applications received was greater than the grant funding available. Our plan is to continue with the work during the summer of 2024, whilst looking for other grant opportunities.

We are also continuing to pursue our plan to build a new small hall extension on the north side of the current building (car park side). Our aim here is to provide a versatile hiring space that will be available to the community during the day, every day of the year. We have a clear idea of what is required and we have drawn up a draft floor plan. But the lack of knowledge and experience within our group means that progress is slow. I am very pleased to tell you that Murray Ross, who lives in the village and works for Avalon Planning and Heritage in Exeter, has kindly agreed to help guide us through the planning and development process. We are very grateful for his help.

With all that said, a handful of enthusiastic Trustees and Murray cannot complete the task alone. If we are to succeed, we need the support and engagement of each and every resident in the village – whether in a big or small way.

If you would like to support our plans to improve our village hall why not come along to our AGM on 4th September.



#### Hello my friends, I am back! Well, sort of

Many of you will be aware I have been off work since last October but may not know why. In July of last year, I had a fall and was knocked unconscious; despite being a nightclub doorman for many years and a policeman for a decade this was new for me. I had various tests and was diagnosed with concussion which caused problems with my memory, fatigue, difficulty focusing and headaches. I assumed that over a fortnight or so my symptoms would improve, they didn't, they seemed to get worse.

Most folks probably could not tell; one problem with any sort of brain injury is that outwardly one appears completely fine. However, my family could tell I was far from well and insisted I get some medical help. Eventually, through a very kind individual, we managed to get an appointment with a consultant neurologist, and he told me as a result of a traumatic brain injury I was suffering from Post-Concussion Syndrome.

This occurs when concussion symptoms last beyond the expected recovery period. The usual recovery period for concussion is weeks to months, post concussion syndrome can last a lot longer; the risk of developing it doesn't appear to be associated with the severity of the initial injury but does increase with age.

It causes: headaches, irritability, feelings of dizziness, restlessness, nausea, impulsivity and self-control problems, sensitivity to light, difficulty concentrating, sensitivity to noise, feeling depressed, anxious, sleep disturbance, fatigue, memory problems, difficulties thinking and problem-solving. In short, it plays havoc with your mental health.

There is no 'cure', rather the goal of treatment is to effectively manage symptoms and hopefully time will do the rest as the patient's brain tries to rewire itself.

It is very hard to describe what it is like to suffer from PCS: you look fine, but are often very tired, your memory is a lottery. Angie wrote notes of each day's schedule up on the backboard in our kitchen for me, plus I had to carry a notebook at all times. If I went out for a walk on my own, I tended to write my destination on the back of my hand just in case, which sounds kind of funny, but really is not. My recovery is not yet complete and actually it is impossible to say when improvements might stop, however finally, just over two months ago, I was given permission from my GP and the church's occupational health officer to start a phased return to work, I am certainly not 100% yet, but God willing, heading back to something near my own special version of normal and it is wonderful to finally get back out into the parishes I love. Angie and I really appreciate the outpouring of love and prayers from so many people; it has really helped lift me when I was down, which was frankly, quite a lot of the time.

During my absence our leadership team have been doing an amazing job, I am so grateful for their amazing work, I know a lot of folks have taken on extra work and the churches have coped incredibly well. And, whilst I have been recovering there have been some brilliant new additions to our staff team: Rev Gudrun was licensed recently and although she lives is Rockbeare, will be focusing a chunk of her time on Broadclyst, Sowton and Clyst Honiton. Plus, our new curate (priest in training), Richard and his family have moved into Broadclyst vicarage and was ordained in Exeter Cathedral last month. Watch this space for updates from them both. I look forward to seeing many of you around and about over the coming months.

It was great to find connections between the children and 'Messy Church' or 'Open the Book'. It was a wonderful day of talking, explaining who we were and building bridges - even the rain could not dampen our spirits. Well done to the Whimple Fest organising team, we'll be back next year.

#### Dear neighbours,

What a privilege it is to be writing my first Whimple News update as your District Councillor. Thank you to everyone who put their trust in me, and indeed to everyone who voted – it was wonderful to see such a high turnout.

I should acknowledge, too, the efforts of my predecessor Richard Lawrence over the past two years.



On top of a substantial training programme put on by East Devon, the past two months since the election have been a whirlwind. A community speed watch for Whimple is in the works, the results of a collaboration between residents, Whimple Parish Council, and myself – please get in touch if you're interested in volunteering!

I have met with POW&R regarding the all-important Whimple Neighbourhood Plan, which continues to progress and spoke at Planning Committee only a few weeks ago against an application to expand Cranbrook across the old A30. I am also involved at East Devon in the ongoing process of developing the new Local Plan; the results of the public consultation on the draft plan, conducted over Christmas 2022, are now available on East Devon's website and I'd encourage everyone to have a look at that: Chapter 6, Part C, summarises comments on the various sites in Whimple. I'll be working hard to make sure the views of the village are properly reflected in the emerging Local Plan.

To help ensure I'm accountable and transparent in my work on the village's behalf, I have also started a regular programme of surgeries held twice a month here in Whimple. These are walk-in sessions – no need to book – open to everyone in the village to come and raise concerns with me, or to discuss ongoing issues in and around Whimple and East Devon that I can help with. These are held at The Hive, opposite the Thirsty Farmer, between 4pm and 7pm on the first Monday of every month, and between 8am and 12pm on the third Monday of every month. #### A Window on Whimple's Weather – May/June 2023

The March/April edition of A Window on Whimple's Weather signed off with "let's hope for a sunnier May and summer"! Perhaps the author had a premonition of what was to come with one of the sunniest May and June periods for years. This was caused by a "blocked" weather pattern of high pressure over the UK, deflecting low pressure systems to our North and South and persisting for several weeks. The fine dry weather was rudely interrupted by an extreme rain event in May, resulting in the most dramatic flooding in recent memory, in and around Whimple.

**May** – After a rather dull April, May delivered the anomaly of wall-to-wall sunshine and yet well above average rainfall; most of the rain falling in one period over the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>. This relatively local event contributed 55.7mm to a total rainfall for May of 72mm against an average of 59mm. Falling on parched ground; this deluge caused severe local flash flooding. However, bright days and clear skies throughout the month delivered slightly above average temperatures. The 28<sup>th</sup> was the warmest day (23.4°C) but on the night of the 16<sup>th</sup> temperatures fell to a chilly 2.6°C. As you might expect from so many sunny days, sunshine was recorded as being 18.5% above average.

June – The high pressure blocking pattern persisted throughout much of June, resulting in exceptionally high temperatures. The Met office reported the hottest June on record (since 1884) and the sunniest since 1957 - with mean temperatures over 2.5°C above average. Their analysis clearly attributes this persistent warmth to climate change. The Whimple weather stations reflect these conditions with the highest daytime temperature of 31.2°C on the 13<sup>th</sup> and nearly 24% more sunshine than average. The average mean daily temperature recorded for June was high at 18.3°C, when compared with averages of 15.9°C and 15.3°C for 2022 and 2021. June rainfall of a meagre 25.1mm was just under half the monthly average; leaving our reservoirs (and gardens) desperately short of water!



### Sidmouth & East Devon Walking Festival,

The festival, now celebrating its 10th anniversary, runs for one week 16th – 22nd September. Join us for a fabulous week of free guided walks and discover wonderful scenic coastal and countryside walking as well as learning about the heritage and natural history of the area.

The Festival includes the opportunity of walking the entire 40 mile length of the East Devon Way over 5 days. All walks are free of charge and led by experienced volunteer guides but must be booked in advance. The only charge is £10 per day for the East Devon Way to cover the cost of transport from Sidmouth to the start and back from the finish each day.



## Water, water everywhere!

Devon's residents are facing a hosepipe ban despite a soggy spring. Is it down to poor management of this vital resource, or are large new housing developments draining our supplies?

"In his poem *The Ancient Mariner,* Devon-born poet Samuel Taylor Coleridge famously wrote: "Water, water everywhere and not a drop to drink!" It aptly sums up our current situation in Devon where clean fresh drinking water is apparently in short supply, despite the wettest March in years and a rainy April too. So, who's to blame for this predicament? In my opinion, South West Water lacks foresight in its management of this most precious resource. In a county like Devon, you don't need a crystal ball to know that the population will multiply over the summer as tourists flock to our green and pleasant county. You'd imagine the water companies would have algorithms to calculate the resulting rise in demand for water. Are they just erring on the side of caution by restricting hosepipe use now?

More to the point, why are water reserves so low? Put simply, demand has exceeded supply. Why? Basically, because too many houses have been built without increasing water storage facilities.

Roadford Lake was the last reservoir completed in Devon in 1989. Since then, Devon's population has rocketed, without, it seems, South West Water objecting to vast housing schemes like Cranbrook and Sherford. Extraordinarily, SWW is not even a Statutory Planning Consultee. It means those responsible for determining planning applications do not legally have to seek an opinion from the water company over the viability of supply, let alone sewage disposal.

Devon CPRE believes this must change to give SWW the power to object to the glut of large-scale housing developments on farmland, which are (incidentally) destroying land capable of contributing to another vital resource - home-produced food supplies.

Our charity commissioned a housing report in 2018 which clearly established that a third more houses than needed were being built in Devon. It seems this dystopian remit continues unabated, with recent aspirations to increase the size of already large developments at Cranbrook, Cullompton and in the Greater Exeter Region. The water supply crisis is only going to get worse.

Although statistics vary, it's generally accepted that Devon's population has risen by almost 36% since the 80s. Yet instead of extending the capacity of Roadford Lake to accommodate the rising demand, holiday lodges have been built on the surrounding land!

The UK's water supply and sewage are inextricably linked; why on earth do we use drinking water to flush our toilets? Our sewage disposal mechanisms are broken too – sewage pollutes every river and almost every beach in the area, yet the Government has failed to insist that discharging effluent into storm drains must stop.

2022 was a dry year, so why were a number of districts served by SWW blighted by over 5,000 sewage discharges, amongst the largest of any area in the country? Clearly, it wasn't because of excessive rainfall overwhelming the storm drains, No, it's because there are too many homes with insufficient sewage treatment facilities. It's time for some joined-up thinking or our drinking water and sewage crises are doomed to go from bad to worse.

#### Working to protect the Villages of Whimple & Rockbeare

#### **Impact**

Since POW+R Group formed in 2019, we have been vehemently opposing inappropriate development, especially the impact of the Cranbrook expansion on our doorstep. It is certain that as a Group we have made some impact on decisions made by EDDC, but not when it comes to the illogical rationale of the Government Inspector's report on the Cranbrook Master Plan.

One of the issues that POW+R Group was highly critical of, was the extensive development site west of Gribble Lane, London Road, Rockbeare which has been approved for 180 homes at a planning meeting of EDDC on Tuesday the 18th July. This has been a very controversial site, as when the original proposals were submitted for 200 homes, there were 200+ local objections (many from Whimple) and no-one in favour of the scheme.

#### Revised Planning Application - Gribble Lane

Approval was given despite, in this case, more than 100 public objections to the revised scheme, as well as from Rockbeare and Whimple Parish Councils. It was suggested that the development contravenes the Local Plan and Rockbeare Neighbourhood Plan, that Cranbrook was originally planned with no building south of the former A30 (London Road), and it would have an adverse impact on wildlife. Furthermore, it would have a "detrimental impact on the rural character of the area," and cause greater pressure on local public services, go against efforts to reduce climate change, and lead to a loss of good quality agricultural land. The worst element of this approval by East Devon District Council, is going against the wishes of local people, when the mission of the Government is for localism. This is an important area as it has been defined as part of an established country estate and would not normally be built on.

The application is for 180 houses of which affordable housing will account for 15 per cent of the homes (classed as up to 80 per cent of market rates), and four per cent will be custom or self-build plots. The development includes an adjoining piece of land to be used as natural green space / SANGS (Suitable Alternative Natural Green Space), which it is anyway. All other matters will be considered as part of a detailed 'reserved matters' application at a later date. The big question is how affordable are affordable houses, because, they will be out of reach of most families in East Devon, especially in-line with cost of borrowing.

POW+R take the view that the Rockbeare Neighbourhood Plan should inform the Cranbrook Master Plan, not the Cranbrook Plan taking precedence over the Neighbourhood Plan. The planning committee voted to approve the Gribble development by eight votes to three.

#### **Latest Government Policy**

The Government's policy on housing quotas has shifted its emphasis, giving greater flexibility to local councils. Mandatory housebuilding targets for local authorities were dropped by ministers last year after a rebellion from Conservative MPs concerned about the impact of developments and considerable opposition to building in open countryside in politically sensitive areas. The latest update was on Monday the 24th July, that the goal of building one million new homes over this parliament will be met - mostly in cities to protect the countryside. This may be a positive change of policy, which can be highlighted in the text of the Whimple Neighbourhood Plan, which is moving forward to complete to draft stage.

#### Whimple Neighbourhood Plan

On the 15th June 2022, EDDC held an online Question and Answer with Parish NP group leaders regarding the new emerging East Devon Local Plan – Designated Neighbourhood Area Housing Requirement. The published notes are being examined by POW+R Group. In addition, POW+R Group is going through the recently published, 510 page Feedback Report on the consultation on the draft East Devon Local Plan (Regulation 18) that was consulted on from 7 November 2022 - 15 January 2023 (Approximately 200 people attended the Whimple Event on the 29th November 2022).

We are aware that that Government policy indicates that EDDC have to set a housing requirement for all of the Designated Neighbourhood Areas in its strategic policy in the Local Plan. At present there is guidance for a small number of houses in our village, but we are working with the Parish Council on the 'last lap' of the Draft Edition. This will include setting out defined settlement boundaries and a Land Use Map for the Parish.

Currently, we are working on the last sections to complete plus creating policy statements which will inform planners to make appropriate professional decisions. The policies will be born out of the evidence gained across the Whimple Parish.

**POW+R Group** continue to be proactive in protecting our village against anything that would harm the distinctive character of our community.

There have been a lot of changes within education recently which have challenged school communities to think more creatively to ensure that we are best placed to keep our thriving village schools open for children in future years. After considerable research into the alternatives, Whimple School and the Exe Valley Federation governors took the decision for Whimple to join the federation from September 2023.

A federation is a family of schools, with each school retaining its unique character, its own budget and performance tables and having a separate Ofsted inspection. The current admissions processes will remain the same.

Joining the federation will give further opportunities for collaboration and ensure that Whimple remains sustainable for the future, sharing good practice and achieving greater economies of scale:

- Sharing strong and proven leadership
- Sharing teaching expertise and sharing best practice and joint training of staff to impact on children's learning
- Greater availability of teaching resources
- Increasing opportunities for the children to mix with a wider group both academically and socially
- Greater access to a wider range of resources (human and physical), and opportunities to make some savings to reinvest in children's learning
- Joint planning and curriculum development opportunities for staff

Day to day the children will probably not notice too much change. Staff, uniform and daily activities will stay the same. The biggest change is that Whimple School Governing Board will be disbanded and the schools within the federation will share one governing board. Together they will make decisions in the best interests of all of the children across all of the schools. Two of our current governors will be moving across to the new board to continue to give Whimple a voice.

It has been a pleasure to be the Chair of Whimple Governors and I have had an excellent team of governors alongside me. Many thanks to all of them. I am sure the school will continue to be a positive educational environment as it moves forward into this exciting new chapter.
