Summer has arrived and our fresh fruit and veg is proving very popular. We order daily from Dart Fresh who promote local produce where possible, but it is possible for us to order in almost any kind of fruit and veg you may need.

We have a new supplier in Rose Farm. They are a family run business from Somerset making a lovely range of sweet and savoury preserves. The product looks and tastes great.

We are often asked for a bigger range of meat but it is difficult for us to make a regular supply of fresh meat work, without too much waste. We are hoping to work with a local butcher to provide a better supply of meat but it would be frozen so would require a bit more planning for meal times.

We will try this to see if this is a more efficient way of providing a meat option in the shop but we hope to continue working with Dartmoor Farmers so if you want to order in fresh beef and lamb we should be able to do this. Orders placed on a Friday for Tuesday delivery.

Fish is another thing we believe some people would like delivered to the village and there is a van that comes to the village on Tuesdays. Frank Houlding can be contacted on 07929 420236 and if you can't be in the village during the day to meet him, you can order in advance and have your order left at the shop ready for collection. You can phone him on a Monday to find out what he is likely to have available.

We are trying to stock as much as possible to make the shop as useful as possible to the village. We stock a small range of herbs, spices, wholefoods and stationery but if there is something in particular you would like us to stock, please feel free to talk to us and we will try to source and stock it if practicable.

We do try very hard to minimise waste so that we can keep the prices at reasonable levels and make shopping locally an attractive and practical option.

We hope you all have a lovely summer and hope to see you enjoying some time at the shop having a cuppa and cake or ice cream.

It is lovely to have people in and around the shop and village centre. Adults and children are very welcome and it makes for a great atmosphere for us.

We do have a bit of a problem with some of the youngsters hanging around the shop who are getting in the way of people, dropping litter and using some fairly shocking language. We would ask parents to remind their children that there are other people around and sometimes their behavior is not acceptable.

Post Office

Just a reminder that the Post Office is open the same time as the shop. That is Monday to Friday 7.30am to 6.00pm, Saturday 8am to 1pm and Sunday 9.00am to 1.00pm. The only exception will be on Bank Holidays.

With this in mind you the Post Office is open for over 60 hours a week allowing you to access the postal services, banking facilities, cash withdrawals, pay bills and buy euro's.

Useful tips:

- 1. You can order currency either on line or in branch before 1pm and your order delivered in store by 1.00pm the next working day.
- 2. If you receive a note saying your parcel has not been delivered but can be collected from the Post Office, it may not get back to us until mid to late afternoon, depending on the time it takes the Postie to complete his round.
- 3. Our busiest times are Monday mornings and between 4.30-5.00pm in the afternoon.

We are so lucky to have such talent amongst us. Go and support them again in September when they will do it all again.



The Summer Ball Team

The name Somme comes from a Celtic word meaning 'Tranquility'

The Somme is now synonymous with one of the bloodiest battles in human history.

Whistles were blown all along the British front line at 7.30am on July 1st 1916, driving thousands of troops out of the trenches and into No Man's Land at the start of the Battle of the Somme. It turned out to be the worst day in the history of the British Army, which suffered 57,470 casualties – 19,420 of whom died. During the 141 day battle, which ended on 18th November, over one million troops from all sides would lose their lives.

On July 1st 2016, a group of Whimple people, brought together by Arthur Cook and the Living History Group, gathered at the war memorial in St Mary's church-yard. At 7.30am whistles were blown to commemorate the start of that fateful day. A two minute silence was observed. Unfortunately, I couldn't attend but it was said to be a gentle and thoughtful occasion. Whimple would like to thank Arthur and his group. In the coming months, please go into our churchyard and see the memorial to Capt. Robert Alexander Farmer Chard. He died on the 7th day of the Somme Offensive aged 29. He was one of the 72,246 soldiers whose bodies were never found and his name is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial to the Missing of the Somme. Thanks Sue Ayres

Your guide on who to call

In the event of a flood, there are many authorities available to help. Below outlines who should be contacted for the various types of flooding incidents and emergencies that occur. The local authorities rely on information reported to them to inform any investigations and prioritisation of investment.

If it is an emergency and there is danger to life as a result of flooding you should not hesitate to call **999**

To report flooding of the highway and blocked drains contact Devon County Council's Highway Customer Service Centre on **0345 155 1004** or visit www.devon.gov.uk/drainage Office hours are Monday to Friday 8am – 8pm and Saturdays 9am – 1pm. For emergencies outside of these hours call **01392 383329**

For any flooding on major trunk roads (the M5 A30, A38, A35 and A303) contact the Highways Agency on **0300 123 5000** (24 hour service)

To report flooding from sewers and water pipes contact South West Water on **0344 346 2020** (24 hour service)

For enquiries about flood warnings contact the Environment Agency's Floodline on 0345 988 1188 (24 hour service)

For general enquiries about Main River or flooding from the sea contact the Environment Agency on 03708 506 506

For all other flooding enquiries contact the Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team on **0345 155 1015** or email floodrisk@devon.gov.uk

Tips to keep your dog safe at the beach

If you are lucky enough to live near the sea or are planning a trip to the beach with your dog, here are some tips to make sure you all stay safe.

- Don't assume your dog can swim. All dogs have to learn to swim just like
 us. Some breeds are naturally strong swimmers, but other breeds (such as corgis
 and pugs) are not. If your dog is not used to swimming then the sea is not the
 place to start, so make sure he doesn't get out of his depth.
- For some reason dogs do drink salt water, but it doesn't do them any good and can make them vomit, or worse lead to potentially **fatal salt poisoning**. Signs of **salt poisoning in dogs** are vomiting, diarrhoea, loss of appetite, lethargy, walking drunk, abnormal fluid accumulation within the body, excessive thirst or urination, potential injury and even death when untreated. Discourage your dog from drinking sea water by providing plenty of fresh water and not over exercising on the beach in the heat.
- Ingesting sand can lead to sand impaction, a medical condition where parts of the
 intestines are blocked by the sand. Vomiting is the most common side effect;
 dogs may also lose their appetites, have abdominal pain or become lethargic.
 Seek urgent veterinary advise if you think your dog may have eaten a lot of sand.
- Consider a life vest if you are planning to swim, sail or surf with your dog. You can buy life vests for dogs of all sizes. Waves and currents can quickly exhaust your dog, especially in cold water
- Apply sunscreen to your dog- especially for dogs with thin or pale fur and apply to areas such as the nose and ears. You can also use high factor children's sunscreen.
- Make sure your dog has a collar, ID tag and preferably is micro chipped, just in case he gets lost.
- Don't overdo it. Running on sand is more tiring than on grass, so don't expect your dog to be able to run and play for as long as he might on his normal walk and start slowly, giving him time to warm up.
- Make sure your dog has a shady area to rest in and remember that sand can be scorching on paws on a hot day so make sure you have a blanket for them to lie down on.
- Be careful to avoid heat stroke watch for signs of overheating such as excessive panting, drooling, coordination problems, vomiting and/or diarrhoea and collapse.
- If your dog suffers from arthritis or other joint conditions limit the amount of time
 he spends swimming in cold water. He may think it is great fun at the time, but
 he will probably be very stiff and sore the following day. They can also get tail
 strain from using their tail as a rudder when swimming, which can be very painful.
- At the end of the day check your dog over thoroughly for cuts and scrapes, rinse him thoroughly to remove salt and sand from his coat and paws and dry him to ensure he does not get chilled. (with thanks to Vale Vets)

Whimple Church: Statement of Needs update

Dear all,

In the last edition of the Whimple News, I explained how the Parochial Church Council (PCC) had undertaken a review of the facilities within the church building to identify ways in which it could better support our Mission priorities and, in consequence, had put together a Statement of Needs (SON) which has been drafted in accordance with those priorities.

Can I thank those of you who came to the advertised coffee mornings at the church to give your feedback on the SON through the short questionnaire that has been produced.

The window of opportunity to have your say is NOT over. If you have not noticed it already, at the back of the church is a large wooden board that documents the rationale behind the SON (a summary of which was included in the last edition). It highlights some suggested opportunities and limitations of our beautiful church building as it stands at present, including suggestions about things we currently cannot do that we think are important to do to fulfil our strategic aims.

Underneath the board are the short questionnaires inviting you to comment and a box to put completed questionnaires in. Please take time to read the statements on the board, or discuss the situation with a PCC member, before filling in a questionnaire and putting it in the box. We value all inputs so please take time to contribute, even if only to agree with the summary of needs.

We would appreciate it if all questionnaire inputs could be returned by the end of August for consideration at the September PCC meeting. Thereafter there will be further opportunity later in the year to discuss the refined SON i.e. after including inputs from the village as a whole.

Can I also take this opportunity to again re-emphasise that at this time there are no plans for any alterations to the building and that we will not start to consider any options until a final SON has been agreed. We are simply beginning to dream about ways in which we can better serve the village community, preserve this sacred space for many years to come and without in any way compromising its integrity as, first and foremost, a sacred and historic place of worship.




