


### Well it's back again!



### Whimple Loose Women Get Down and Dirty

Five of Whimple's finest, Claire Podbury, Juliet Dines, Karen Fanzo, Sarah Dines and Emma Sidebotham, got down and dirty on Saturday September 6th at the 2014 Commando Challenge. A good time was had by all. Weeks of preparation pounding the lanes of Whimple paid off as the Loose Women raced to the finish in 21st position! Forty all-female teams competed in the 10K Royal Commando Challenge.

Although the day got off to a good start with clear blue skies and brilliant sunshine, temperatures were raised during the 15 minute warm up whilst the serving marines put us through our paces. At 3.00pm we set off on the three kilometre climb from Bicton Arena to Woodbury Common, knowing that the four kilometre endurance course lay ahead. When we reached the woods, rolling in the mud was the order of the day. It was literally down hill from there on. The obstacle course included the adder filled tunnels, the murky waters of Peter's Pool and the notorious sheep dip which ensures the competitors are fully submerged in a water-filled tunnel - much to the spectator's delight!

The sheep dip marks the end of the obstacle course and the start of the 3 kilometre run back to the finish at Bicton Arena - in a bedraggled state! We completed the run in 2 hours 25 minutes and raised £370 for the Devon Air Ambulance Trust and the Royal Marine Charitable Trust Fund.

### **District Councillor's Report**

All my news is a little behind events this month because of the near cessation of District and Parish Council activity in the month of August. This is, of course, mirrored by The Calendar and Whimple News which both publish a two month edition at this time of year. Still, here goes and we will be up to date by the next editions of these two fine local publications.



### **Building Half a Million Houses**

This is not in East Devon alone but all over Britain! However, it does mean that potentially, every council will be building a lot of houses. The Local Government Association (LGA) has unveiled plans for how Councils could build half a million houses before the end of the decade (2019). The LGA is calling for incentives for private sector builders to speed up the rate at which they are building houses on sites that already have planning permission. They also propose that new local Land Trusts be set up to for the purpose of allocating publically owned land for development. In addition, they argue for the removal of existing borrowing caps on Councils (which limit their ability to borrow money for house building), so that they could become major social house providers again. Does this mean a return to the idea of Local Councils as major house providers and landlords? It's funny how policies can come back into favour after decades of political rejection.

### Developments in shared ICT Services between Councils

A corporate ICT manager's presentation on the plan to create a shared ICT service involving Exeter City, E.D.D.C. and Teignbridge District Councils is being planned. The planning so far proposes the development of a separate Limited Company with a joint executive committee and joint scrutiny arrangements between the three District Councils involved. This company will be named Strata Service Solutions Ltd. It will be owned and controlled equally by the three Councils. The conclusions set out by the presentation were that the initial case for this service was sound, the potential savings identified are substantial and the creation of the new organisation would act as a catalyst for business transformation. The proposed "go live" date for this new company is to be the first of November 2014. The conclusions and proposals of the joint group who have been working on this <u>initiative are to be presented to this month's Full Council meeting for approval.</u>

#### A New Initiative in Voting provisions in the Country From the 10th of June

In case any of my readers have not yet been alerted to the recent, proposed changes in the electoral system then it is time for them to take action if they wish to be able to vote in the next election (May 2015). This initiative is in the process of being rolled out by the government via the District Councils and is intended to increase the number of citizens who will be able to vote. At the moment E.D.D.C. is gathering data that will bring "the biggest change to voter registration in twenty years."

The major change in the system is to get rid of the current obligation for the head of the household to be responsible for the registration of all those eligible to vote at his or her address. Instead, responsibility for registration will be in the hands of every eligible individual. The argument for this change is that an individual electoral registration (I.E.R.) increases the certainty that everybody on the register is who they claim to be. The public will be contacted by their local Electoral Registration Office (E.R.O.) to inform them what they have to do next - if anything. The Electoral Commission have launched a T.V, advertisement, on line information and a billboard publicity campaign to alert the electorate to the new changes. This is all supported by a new on-line registration where the elector will provide name, address, date of birth and national insurance number. All people who have failed to complete the annual registration form will have been removed from the register and this new system has already provoked a large number of requests to re-register. In addition, where there are still gaps in the records personal visits will be made to people's homes to ensure as near a 100% registration as is possible. In fact, a lot of people who I asked about what they had done about registration have replied that they have already received their new registration without having to take any action themselves. It's the ones who have not heard that still need to get on.

The standard seems to get higher every year in this section and there were some amazing entries. The overall winner in this section, winning the Paul Henry G.C. Memorial Cup, was Tony Velterop. The Arts and Crafts Classes had another wonderful display of skills. In this section the winner of the Len Rose Memorial Cup was Jenny Sanders with Peter Betts won the Whimple Craft Cup.

The flower arranging had another good number of exhibits and the judge was very meticulous over her deliberations. In this section the Frances Pratt Cup was awarded to Barbara Lambert, The Roy Horsburgh Trophy was won by Emma Palmer and The Marie Louise Grout Cup for the best exhibit in the Flower arrangement as voted for by everyone who came to see the Show, was also won by Emma Palmer. The Sandfords Cup which is for the combined Men Only Classes of a floral arrangement and a Bread Roll was won by John Griffiths who was also awarded a certificate of Merit for his Bread Rolls! The Homecraft section was full of excellent mouth watering exhibits and the snooker table was positively overloaded with tasty exhibits. There were cakes and jams galore! The judges did wonder just how they were going to get through all the exhibits! The winner of the Sir Henry Imbert-Terry Cup in this section was our Show Secretary, Sherril Olive. The Pot Plant Section had a very large number of exhibits which we only just managed to get on the tables. It always difficult to know just how large the exhibits in this section are going to be and we did struggle a bit for space. However, we did manage to squeeze them all in and once again the winner of the Briar Shield was Colin Northcott. And finally, but by no means least, there was a superb number of exhibits in the flower and vegetable classes. It was good to see so many exhibits in all the classes giving the judges plenty of work to do. There were many class winners in this section but The Slewton Cup for the most points in the vegetable section was won by Ernest (John) Partridge from Feniton.

The runner up in this section winning the Cranny Cup was Paul Wilson. In the Flower Classes, the winner of the 'Win and Bob Shepherd' Cup for the most points in this section was Ernest (John) Partridge and the runner up, winning the President's Cup, was Michael Mallett. However, when all the classes were combined and the points in both sections were added together, it was not too difficult to see that the winner of The Whimple Folk Cup was Ernest (John) Partridge so many congratulations to him on winning this magnificent trophy.

Then there was the Whimple Challenge Cup which was the fifth year of this venture. This year the subject was a decorated bicycle and there were some interesting exhibits! The exhibits certainly showed a lot of skill in how they were so cleverly put together and the judges had a hard job selecting the winner. However, after much deliberation, The Village Challenge Cup was awarded to Rosemary Davies and Whimple Stores took the runners-up's Trophy.





# The future of the library service

Devon County Council has been consulting Devon's communities about the future of the library service. The Council has spent the summer analysing responses. The key messages include:

- People value the library service.
- The endorsement of the vision for a modern, vibrant library service providing a broader range of services.
- Many communities have indicated they are willing to work with Devon County Council to develop local solutions to the delivery of their library – e.g. through re-locating the library to an alternative local venue; through increased volunteering or through fundraising via a local Friends Group.
- Almost all communities are clear that they value paid local staff and consider they are vital to the overall quality and sustainability of the local library.
- There is widespread recognition of the particular importance of the library service for the young and the elderly.
- Rural communities would use their libraries more if they were open longer and had more modern facilities.

As a result of the extensive feedback from Devon's communities, a proposed 'direction of travel' for Devon's libraries has been developed and is being considered by the Council's Cabinet on 8th October.

Recommendations the Cabinet will consider include:

- The potential to develop an alternative delivery model for the whole library service based on a trust or mutual model. An alternative delivery model (based on a charitable entity) could save around £400,000 in business rates. This is the equivalent to the staffing costs of 25 of the county's libraries.
- Identifying an initial group of up to 10 community pilots to develop new solutions for their local libraries that realise savings, retain staff and deliver a sustainable library service for the future.
- Communities will be invited to apply to be part of the pilot from late October. They will also work with the Council to shape the proposed organisation for the whole service.
- Installing Wi-Fi in the 27 libraries which do not currently have it in order to enhance digital access across the county and increase the attractiveness of the library offer to a broader range of people
- Trialling new technologies that could enhance access to libraries outside of core opening hours.

Looking for ways to continue to reduce the costs for all libraries, especially larger libraries, by co-locating with other services and generating income from hiring meeting rooms.

# Caring for your pet's teeth

Like humans, cats and dogs have a set of baby teeth that fall out and then have a set of adult teeth that need to last for the rest of their life!

Caring for these teeth will help ensure your pet doesn't suffer from any of the problems associated with poor dental hygiene,

- Plaque and tartar.
- Swollen/painful gums, sometimes receding from the teeth leaving them loose or falling out.
- Bad breath, caused by bacteria (not nice for them or us!). In severe cases the bacteria can enter the blood stream, potentially damaging internal organs.



#### What can you do to help prevent dental disease?

#### Brushing;



We brush our teeth every day, so why not brush your pet's teeth too?!

There are many different pet toothbrushes and toothpastes available. Don't use your own toothpaste as this is not safe for pets. It is best to start brushing your pet's teeth from a young age so they learn to accept it; however, it is possible to start slowly and gently with an older pet too.

#### Diet;

Feeding a biscuit diet that your pet has to crunch on can help to keep the teeth clean. There are many specially formulated dental diets that contain everything your pet needs. <u>Dental chews</u> can also be used to keep the teeth clean. Remember, these contain additional calories so reduce daily ration to allow for this.



#### Anti plaque water additives;



It is possible to add a special solution to your pet's drinking water. This contains antibacterial agents and an ingredient that helps stop plaque and tartar formation. This can be purchased from your Veterinary Surgery.

A Veterinary Nurse can check your pet's teeth (normally a free service), and will be able to advise you on the best dental care for your pet.
